HB1770 RELATING TO COUNTIES. JUD, FIN

Permits counties to pass ordinances that require written notification of defects or obstructions on certain county properties as a prerequisite to filing a claim against the counties for injuries or damages arising from against the alleged unsafe or dangerous condition of county property.

HB1771 RELATING TO FELONIES FOR WHICH CRIMINAL JUD

CHARGES MAY BE INSTITUTED BY WRITTEN

INFORMATION.

Amends section 806-83, HRS, to add felonies for which criminal charges may be instituted by written information (section 708-803 (habitual property crime), section 708- (unauthorized entry in a dwelling in the first degree), section 708-812.6

(unauthorized entry in a dwelling in the second degree), and

section 708-835.7 (theft of copper)).

<u>HB1774</u>	RELATING TO CRIMINAL PROCEDURE. Codifies dismissals pursuant to Rule 48, Hawaii rules of penal procedure. Exempts cases for abuse of family or household members charges from the dismissal rule.	JUD, FIN

Adds a new chapter to HRS, allowing district court and circuit court judges to order the production of records by persons or entities located outside of the State of Hawaii, in all criminal cases. HB1778 RELATING TO UNAUTHORIZED COMPUTER ACCESS. JUD

Amends sections 708-895.5, 708-895.6, and 708-895.7, to increase unauthorized computer access in the first degree to a class A felony, increase unauthorized computer access in the second degree to a class B felony, and increase unauthorized computer access in the third degree to a class C felony; where unauthorized computer access in the first degree is charged based on the monetary value of information obtained, raises the minimum monetary value to \$20,000.

HB1779 RELATING TO APPROPRIATIONS TO THE DEPARTMENT JUD, FIN

OF THE PROSECUTING ATTORNEY OF THE CITY AND COUNTY OF HONOLULU.

Appropriates funds to the department of the prosecuting attorney of the city and county of Honolulu for career criminal prosecution unit, prosecution in drug court, prosecution in Hawaii's opportunity probation with enforcement, and victim witness assistance program.

HB1780 RELATING TO AQUATIC LIFE. WLO, JUD, FIN

Prohibits the sale of aquatic life for aquarium purposes. Establishes penalties. Requires the division of aquatic resources to submit an annual report on the effectiveness of enforcement.

RELATING TO THE EMPLOYEES' RETIREMENT SYSTEM. LAB, FIN HB1781

> Segregates teachers from all other employees for determination of employer normal cost, accrued liability contributions, and annual contributions by the State and counties to the employees' retirement system. Revises employer contribution rates for fiscal year 2013-2014 and beyond. Effective 7/1/11.

RELATING TO THE EMPLOYEES' RETIREMENT SYSTEM. LAB. FIN HB1782

> Increases the members on the Employees' Retirement System (ERS) board of trustees from 8 to 10. Establishes county representation on the ERS board of directors. Provides that the counties shall be responsible for all necessary expenses incurred in the performance of the county member's duties. Effective on 7/1/12.

RELATING TO THE EMPLOYER-UNION HEALTH LAB, FIN HB1783

BENEFITS TRUST FUND.

Requires one member of the Employer-Union Health Benefits Trust Fund board of trustees to be appointed by agreement of the mayors of the 4 counties and approved by the Hawaii State Association of Counties. Authorizes the governor to fill the vacancy should it not be filled within 60 days. Effective

07/01/12.

HB1784 RELATING TO CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT PROJECTS FOR FIN

Appropriates funds for capital improvement projects in the 9th

HB1785 RELATING TO TAXATION.

Establishes a 4-year amnesty program for certain delinquent tax

Internet, or collects the internet addresses visited by an

authorized user. Creates a third degree of computer fraud, and incorporates the element of phishing into all three computer

fraud offenses.

Appropriates funds to the Department of the Prosecuting Attorney of the County of Maui for the career criminal

prosecution program. Effective July 1, 2012.

HB1790 RELATING TO MOTOR VEHICLES. TRN, JUD

Requires that the vehicle used by a person cited or arrested for driving without a license, driving while license suspended or revoked, driving under the influence of alcohol, or driving without proof of insurance be towed at the owner's expense.

<u>HB1794</u>	RELATING TO PUBLIC HOUSING. Broadens criminal trespass in the 1st degree to include a person who enters or remains unlawfully in or upon the premises of a public housing project after a reasonable request or warning to leave by housing authorities, neighborhood watch, or a police officer. Excludes an invited guest of a resident who is in the presence of the resident. Effective 1/1/13.	HSG, JUD
<u>HB1795</u>	RELATING TO FIRE SPRINKLERS. Prohibits counties from requiring installation or retrofitting of automatic fire sprinklers in new or existing one- or two-family dwelling units used only for residential purposes.	HSG, PBM, JUD
<u>HB1796</u>	RELATING TO PUBLIC HOUSING. Requires the HPHA to adopt rules to implement a five-year time limit for any tenant's use and occupation of any dwelling unit or other premises located within a state public housing project.	HSG, JUD, FIN

Provides for the automatic deposit of general excise tax revenues into the Hawaii employer-union health benefits trust fund to amortize the trust fund's unfunded actuarial accrued liability. RELATING TO THE HAWAII EMPLOYER-UNION HEALTH LAB, FIN HB1802 BENEFITS TRUST FUND. Requires investment and other earnings and reserves of the Hawaii EUTF to be maintained in the fund or used to amortize the unfunded actuarial accrued liability of the fund. Allows fund moneys to be used for administrative expenses. Effective 1/1/13. HB1803 RELATING TO THE HAWAII EMPLOYER-UNION HEALTH LAB, FIN BENEFITS TRUST FUND. Revises the employer's monthly contribution for the health benefits plan of a retired employee who was hired after 6/30/12. HB1804 RELATING TO THE HAWAII EMPLOYER-UNION HEALTH LAB, FIN BENEFITS TRUST FUND.

HB1805

RELATING TO THE HAWAII EMPLOYER-UNION HEALTH LAB, FIN BENEFITS TRUST FUND.

Limits the health insurance benefits for an employee who is first hired after 06/30/12 and who retires with at least 10 years of credited service. Provides that, if the employee retires before reaching the medicare-eligible age, the retired employee shall be allowed to enroll only in a non-medicare self plan. Requires the State or county to make a contribution towards the non-medicare self plan cost. Requires the retired employee to enroll in the medicare part B medical insurance plan if the employee retires upon or after reaching the medicare-eligible age. Requires contributions to or reimbursements for the medicare part B premium. Prohibits the retired employee from enrolling in any health benefits plan of the fund. Provides also that the spouse of a retired employee who is first hired after 06/30/12 shall not be eligible for medicare part B premium reimbursements.

HB1806

RELATING TO THE HAWAII EMPLOYER-UNION HEALTH LAB, FIN BENEFITS TRUST FUND.

Sets statutorily the state or county monthly contributions for the health benefits plans of an employee who is first hired after 06/30/13 during the employee's active service. Provides for biennial adjustment of the contributions. Makes the state or county monthly contributions for the new employee nonnegotiable under collective bargaining. Makes a new employee ineligible for group life insurance benefits.

HB1807

RELATING TO THE HAWAII EMPLOYER-UNION HEALTH LAB, FIN BENEFITS TRUST FUND.

Limits state or county monthly contribution for the health benefits plan of an employee who is first hired after 6/30/13. Provides, during active service of the employee, state or county monthly contributions for the employee that are similar to the employer contribution under the prepaid health care act. Makes the state or county monthly contribution for such an employee nonnegotiable under collective bargaining. Prohibits the board from providing a group life insurance benefits program or group life insurance program to an employee hired after 6/30/13. Provides that the spouse of a retired employee who is first hired after 6/30/13 shall not be eligible for medicare part B premium reimbursements.

<u>HB1808</u> RELATING TO THE HAWAII EMPLOYER-UNION HEALTH LAB, FIN BENEFITS TRUST FUND.

Beginning 07/01/14, prohibits the Hawaii employer-union health benefits trust fund from offering medical benefits plans that pay or reimburse providers under a fee-for-service model. Requires the board of trustees to evaluate alternative payment models to replace the fee-for-service model and submit a report to the governor and legislature before the regular session of 2014. Appropriates funds for the evaluation.

<u>HB1809</u> RELATING TO THE HAWAII EMPLOYER-UNION HEALTH LAB, FIN BENEFITS TRUST FUND.

Prohibits any health benefits plan of the Hawaii employer-union health benefits trust fund issued after 06/30/13 from offering coverage of in vitro fertilization procedure and alcohol dependence, drug dependence, and mental illness treatment benefits.

BENEFITS TRUST FUND.

Requires, no later than 1/1/14, the board of trustees of the Hawaii employer-union health benefits trust fund to require every health benefits plan established or contracted to include higher deductibles and co-payments for tobacco smokers and other persons of high risk.

RELATING TO THE HAWAII EMPLOYER-UNION HEALTH LAB, FIN

HB1811 RELATING TO THE EMPLOYEES' RETIREMENT SYSTEM. LAB, FIN

Requires employers to pay greater contribution rates on their employees' non-base compensation than on base compensation beginning in fiscal year 2013-2014.

HB1812 RELATING TO THE EMPLOYEES' RETIREMENT SYSTEM. LAB, FIN

Provides that, for a public employee hired after 06/30/2012, the "average final compensation" shall be the average annual compensation received during all years of credited service.

<u>HB1813</u> RELATING TO SPECIAL MANAGEMENT AREAS. WLO/EEP, FIN

Exempts any state or county CIP from special management area

guidelines and requirements.

HB1814 RELATING TO CAPITAL IMPROVEMENTS. ERB/WLO, FIN

Makes appropriations from general obligation bonds and certain special funds for the planning and design of future construction projects. Reduces the transfer to the works of art special fund to 2/10 of 1% until 06/30/2015. Effective 07/01/2012.

HB1810

<u>HB1815</u> RELATING TO GOVERNMENT.

LAB, FIN

Requires an arbitration panel to weigh the value of the defined benefit pension plan for public employees when making a decision on an impasse under the public employment collective bargaining law. Effective 7/1/15.

<u>HB1816</u> RELATING TO THE HAWAII COMMUNITY

WLO, JUD, FIN

DEVELOPMENT AUTHORITY.

Requires the HCDA to engage in efforts to re-acquire the makai gateway park and the Honolulu Ford parcel in Kakaako. Requires, after re-acquisition, the development of those parcels into medical or scientific uses that contribute to the synergy created by the school of medicine and UH cancer center.

HB1817 RELATING TO THE HAWAII EMPLOYER-UNION HEALTH LAB, FIN

BENEFITS TRUST FUND.

Amends composition and certain powers and duties of the Hawaii employer-union health benefits trust fund board of trustees. Makes appropriation.

HB1818 RELATING TO THE HAWAII EMPLOYER-UNION HEALTH LAB, FIN

BENEFITS TRUST FUND.

Adds an eleventh member to the EUTF board of trustees to represent the general public. Changes board voting to one-vote per member. Changes quorum to a simple majority of the board. Requires board action to be made by a majority of the board,

except when a greater number is required by law.

HB1819 RELATING TO THE EMERGENCY AND BUDGET LAB, FIN

RESERVE FUND.

Increases from 5% to 30% the percentage of moneys from the excess general fund balance to be deposited into the emergency and budget reserve fund as a temporary source of funding during economic downturn. Requires 30% of the excess general fund balance to be used to reduce the unfunded liability of the EUTF.

HB1820 RELATING TO INDUSTRIAL HEMP RESEARCH. HLT/PBM, JUD, Allows privately funded industrial hemp research to be

Allows privately funded industrial hemp research to be conducted in Hawaii under certain conditions; requires monitoring by department of public safety; requires reporting to county law enforcement; exempts agronomic data derived from research from public records disclosure; confers immunity from criminal prosecution for the research. Effective 7/1/2050.

REFERRAL HB1821 RELATING TO ABSENTEE VOTING. PBM, JUD, FIN Requires state election officials to provide for timely voting by military and other voters who are overseas in all elections for federal, state, and county offices. Authorizes transmitting ballot and ballot materials to overseas voters by electronic transmission, including electronic mail or internet. RELATING TO HEALTH. HB1822 HLT, CPC/JUD, Establishes the Hawaii health care authority for administrative FIN purposes within the DOH to regulate private hospital rates and ensure the containment of health care costs. RELATING TO INSURANCE. HB1823 TRN, CPC Requires a replacement vehicle to have approximately the same mileage as the total loss vehicle. Requires cash settlements to be based on the market value of the total loss vehicle within the State. RELATING TO SUBSTANCE ABUSE TESTING. HB1824 HLT, JUD, FIN Authorizes imposition of fees on probationers and parolees to offset the costs of periodic substance abuse testing. HB1825 RELATING TO BINGO. JUD, FIN Allows non-profit organizations to conduct bingo games. Creates Hawaii bingo commission within department of commerce and consumer affairs to regulate bingo. Allocates 1% of general excise tax revenues on gross receipts for a compulsive gambler program; up to 4% for administrative expenses; and the balance for deposit into the state general fund. RELATING TO ELECTIONS. HB1826 PBM, JUD, FIN Expands the use of electronic transmission for absentee registration and voting by military personnel who are deployed outside the State. Expands use of the federal write-in absentee ballot and late registration procedures for military members. RELATING TO COFFEE. AGR, FIN HB1827 Imposes a 1 cent fee on each pound of green coffee beans grown in or imported into the State to be deposited into a special fund to control and eradicate the coffee borer beetle. Establishes provisions to eradicate and control pests and infections on coffee trees. Appropriation. Sunset.

HB1890 PROPOSING AN AMENDMENT TO THE HAWAII EDN, JUD, FIN

CONSTITUTION RELATING TO THE LAPSING OF APPROPRIATIONS FOR THE CONSTRUCTION OR ACQUISITION OF PUBLIC SCHOOL FACILITIES.

Proposes a constitutional amendment relating to the lapsing of appropriations for the construction or acquisition of public school facilities to (1) repeal the reference to the state educational facilities improvement special fund and (2) allow appropriations for construction or acquisition of public school facilities to exceed 3 years as provided by law

Places the reapportionment commission within the office of elections for administrative purposes. Directs the chief election officer to request an appropriation from the general fund to support the commission, to be effective in the year in which the

commission is constituted.

HB1893 RELATING TO ECONOMIC REVITALIZATION. ERB/EEP, FIN

Temporarily allows exemptions from the environmental review process under chapter 343, HRS, for certain narrowly defined

state or county construction projects.

HB1894 RELATING TO PROCUREMENT.

ERB. FIN

Temporarily authorizes the governor or a county mayor to exempt a construction or design-build procurement from protest concerning the procurement and administrative review of a nonresponsible offeror determination. Requires, as a condition of the exemption, that all bids and proposals, including amendments or revisions, evaluations, and ratings be released for public inspection. Requires the posting of the information on the state or county website.

HB1895 RELATING TO HEALTH INSURANCE.

ERB/HLT, CPC

Suspends the mandatory coverage for in vitro fertilization and mental health benefits in health insurance policies issued or renewed between the effective date of this Act and 06/30/15. Requires instead those benefits to be offered as options in such policies. Requires the insurance commissioner to mandate each managed care plan affected by the Act to submit a rate filing reflecting the suspension of benefits affected by the Act. Repeals this Act on 06/30/15.

HB1896 RELATING TO INSURANCE.

Temporarily establishes a higher medical loss ratio for a tax-exempt mutual benefit society's or health maintenance organization's health insurance plan than the ratio set under the federal Public Health Service Act. Requires, when reviewing rate filings, the insurance commissioner to consider the medical loss ratio of the filer. Requires the insurance commissioner to submit a report to the governor and legislature before the convening of the regular session of 2014 with information on the impacts of the Act and a recommendation on whether any provision should be made permanent. Repealed on 12/31/14.

Clarifies that a contractor with a specialty contractor license may execute a contract that includes a craft outside the scope of the specialty contractor's license if the craft constitutes no more than one-half per cent of the contract's total value. Effective July 1, 2012.
