HB2007 RELATING TO INSTRUCTIONAL TIME. EDN, FIN

Requires the Department of Education to devise four bell schedules for each grade level to standardize instructional periods across all schools, with the exception of charter schools and multi-track public schools. Requires each school to choose one of the available bell schedules for each grade level.

HB2008 RELATING TO CHARTER SCHOOLS. EDN, FIN

Requires the Board of Education to contract for an implementation and transition coordinator to assist with the implementation of S.B. No. , Regular Session of 2012. Makes

an appropriation.

<u>HB2009</u>	RELATING TO YELLOW PAGES PHONE BOOKS. Requires distributors of yellow pages phone books to obtain permits from the DOH. Creates an opt-out registry for residents and businesses to elect not to receive delivery of yellow pages phone books. Requires that all yellow pages phone books be recyclable. Creates penalties for noncompliance. Authorizes exemptions.	EEP, CPC/JUD, FIN
<u>HB2010</u>	RELATING TO CHARTER SCHOOLS. Establishes a new chapter governing charter schools based on the recommendations of the charter school governance, accountability, and authority task force established by Act 130, Session Laws of Hawaii 2011. <u>HB2011</u>	RELATING TO INVOLUNTARY PSYCHIATRIC HOSPITALIZATION. Establishes new procedures for the examination and involuntary hospitalization of persons that meet criteria for commitment to psychiatric facilities.	HLT, JUD, FIN
<u>HB2012</u>	RELATING TO THE STATE BUDGET.  To adjust and request appropriations for Fiscal Biennium 2011- 13 funding requirements for operations and capital improvement projects of Executive Branch agencies and programs.	FIN
<u>HB2013</u>	RELATED TO MIXED MARTIAL ARTS.  Amends the definition of mixed martial arts to include the regulation of other disciplines that use striking.	ERB, CPC
<u>HB2014</u>	RELATING TO CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT PROJECTS FOR THE BENEFIT OF THE TWENTY-SECOND REPRESENTATIVE DISTRICT. Appropriates funds for capital improvement projects for schools in the twenty-second representative district.	FIN
<u>HB2015</u>	RELATING TO THE PUBLIC GUARDIAN. Allows the Attorney General to file for a petition of guardianship for individuals who are not able to understand or adequately participate in decisions concerning their care, and have no relatives or friends willing and able to act as a guardian, at the request of a county chief of police. ### <u>HB2016</u> RELATING TO EVIDENCE.

JUD

Amends the title of Act 210, Session Laws of Hawaii 2008, to read news and broadcast media privilege. Expands the application of the Act to expressly include bona fide owners or editors of news or broadcast media entities. Clarifies that, where applicable, the news and broadcast media privilege will shield a journalist, newscaster, owner, or editor of a news or broadcast media entity from being compelled to testify or produce the source of information whether or not it has been published or broadcasted, or any unpublished or unbroadcasted information.

## <u>HB2017</u> RELATING TO THE MOTOR VEHICLE RENTAL

TRN, CPC

INDUSTRY.

Provides that lessors may pass on vehicle title, plate, registration, and inspection costs to lessees.

### HB2018 RELATING TO FORECLOSURES.

CPC/JUD, FIN

Repeals the provision automatically making all violations of the mortgage foreclosure law an unfair or deceptive act or practice, in favor of determinations made on a case-by-case basis. Establishes a time limit for filing actions to void title transfers of foreclosed property. Specifies a mortgagor's right to claim that a violation of the mortgage foreclosure law constitutes an unfair or deceptive act or practice. Provides that a mortgagee's failure to demonstrate rights of a holder in due course is prima facie evidence of an unfair or deceptive act or practice. Following the expiration of the mortgage foreclosure dispute resolution program in 2014, specifies certain foreclosure violations as unfair or deceptive acts or practices, and limits the types of violations that may void a title transfer of foreclosed property.

#### HB2019 RELATING TO MORTGAGES.

CPC/JUD, FIN

Prohibits deficiency judgments to recover the remaining balance on mortgage loans for certain residential property sold in a foreclosure action or short sale.

### HB2020 RELATING TO MORTGAGE FORECLOSURES.

CPC/JUD, FIN

Repeals part I of chapter 667, HRS, relating to foreclosure by

action or foreclosure by power of sale.

### HB2021 RELATING TO SOLAR ENERGY DEVICES.

EEP/HSG, CPC

Requires that the rules of a private homeowners association or entity consider solar energy devices' reflectivity on the surrounding area when adopting rules that facilitate the

placement of solar energy devices.

<u>HB2026</u>	RELATING TO FUNDS.  Addresses the auditor's recommendations regarding the transfer of non-general funds to the general fund.	LMG, FIN
HB2027	RELATING TO COMPUTER CRIME.  Adds new definitions to computer crime, including identifying information, malware, phishing, and spyware. Establishes a third degree of computer fraud, and incorporates the element of phishing into all three computer fraud offenses. Amends the offense of unauthorized computer access in the third degree to include distributing or transferring spyware without authorization or by deceptive means.	JUD
<u>HB2028</u>	RELATING TO THE PREVENTION OF WORKPLACE VIOLENCE. Establishes a legal mechanism by which an employer or employee may seek a temporary restraining order, or preliminary or permanent injunctive relief on their own behalf or on the behalf of others, to prohibit workplace violence or the threat of workplace violence. Amends the Hawaii state planning act to include promoting the development of geothermal energy resources that are located on public trust land as a source of firm power to achieve state

energy objectives.

**OUALITY CONTROL.** 

Creates the environmental review special fund to fund the operations of the Office of Environmental Quality Control and

the Environmental Council. Establishes filing fees for

environmental review documents filed after December 31, 2012.

Effective July 1, 2012.

HB2041 RELATING TO ELECTRICITY.

EEP, CPC

EEP, FIN

Prohibits exclusivity or curtailment provisions in power purchase

agreements between an electric utility and producers of electricity generated from geothermal steam or nonfossil fuel

sources.

HB2042 RELATING TO ENERGY.

EEP, CPC

Requires that the renewable portfolio standards shall be met by requiring that renewable energy whose sources are biogas, biomass, biofuels, or hydrogen shall be locally produced.

Defines "locally produced".

HB2043 RELATING TO RENEWABLE ENERGY.

EEP, CPC, FIN

Requires the PUC to direct electric utilities to place special emphasis on utilizing renewable energy sources when crafting

integrated resource plans.

HB2044 RELATING TO PROCUREMENT.

ERB, FIN

Requires a hearing officer to affirm the decision of a procurement officer in protests filed under section 103D-701, HRS, unless the procurement officer's decision is shown by clear and convincing evidence to be arbitrary, capricious, fraudulent,

or clearly erroneous.

HB2045 RELATING TO TAXATION.

ERB, FIN

Repeals Act 155, SLH 2010, which: (1) requires all businesses with excise tax exemptions to register to do business in Hawaii, file their tax returns in a timely manner, and expressly claim their entitlement; and (2) creates a personal trust liability for businesses that use the general excise tax as the basis for increasing their prices and ensures that those funds are paid to

the State for the benefit of consumers and businesses.

HB2046 RELATING TO ADULT AND COMMUNITY EDUCATION.

Clarifies that funding for the adult and community education program shall be from appropriations by the legislature, supplemented by student fees. Establishes the adult and community education program special fund.

RELATING TO INFORMATION PROTECTION. HB2047

ERB, CPC/JUD By January 1, 2014, requires businesses to implement a comprehensive, written policy and procedure to prevent identity theft, and to designate an employee to be responsible for protecting personal information. Requires businesses to train all employees in the implementation of the policy and procedure.

RELATING TO THE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION. HB2048

> Requires the DOE to develop procedures for reasonable suspicion and random substance abuse testing of, at a minimum, 10% of all public school teachers and teacher trainees each year. Requires the DOE to adopt rules to determine sanctions for positive substance abuse assessments. Makes an appropriation to DOE.

HB2049 RELATING TO HOUSING.

Conforms public housing eviction procedure to requirements of federal law. Requires evictions to be conducted by an eviction board appointed by the Hawaii public housing authority in collaboration with DHS.

RELATING TO HUMAN SERVICES. HB2050

Requires training programs and the recertification process for nurse aides to include a multicultural health awareness and education program. Effective July 1, 2013.

HB2051 RELATING TO DOMESTIC VIOLENCE.

Requires the family court to maintain a computerized database containing information regarding covered offenders who have at least three convictions of abuse of a family or household member. Specifies information the database must contain. Allows a covered offender whose name is included in the database to petition for removal of the covered offender's name under certain circumstances.

RELATING TO FORFEITURE. HB2052

> Prohibits law enforcement from seizing motor vehicles for forfeiture if the vehicle is primarily used by the owner for personal use and there has been no conviction for the underlying offense.

<u>HB2061</u>	RELATING TO CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT PROJECTS FOR THE BENEFIT OF THE THIRTY-FIFTH REPRESENTATIVE DISTRICT.  Appropriates funds for capital improvement projects for the benefit of the 35th representative district. Effective July 1, 2012.	FIN
