Requires motorists when passing a stationary authorized emergency vehicle on a highway to vacate the lane closest to the stationary authorized emergency vehicle or reduce driving speed until safely clear of the stationary authorized emergency vehicle. HB2073 RELATING TO THE HAWAII LEGACY TRUST FUND. WLO, FIN Establishes the Hawaii legacy trust fund as a separate fund of the Hawaii Community Foundation to encourage individuals to make strong financial investments while supporting conservation, reforestation, environmental stewardship, sustainability, affordable housing, public education, and the well-being of the State's keiki and kupuna. HB2074 RELATING TO INSURANCE. HLT, CPC, FIN Mandates health insurance coverage for the diagnosis and treatment of autism spectrum disorders under accident and health or sickness insurance and group hospital and medical services contracts and health maintenance organizations. HB2075 RELATING TO TAXATION. ERB, FIN Imposes conveyance tax on the transfer or conveyance of a controlling interest of an entity with an interest in realty in Hawaii; exempts certain transfers. Imposes conveyance tax on certain transfers of real property at the lowest rate. Effective 01/01/13. HB2076 RELATING TO MILK. HLT, AGR, CPC Allows milk produced by a hoofed animal to not be pasteurized if it is intended for personal consumption or personal use by any person, including a milk producer. RELATING TO OCCUPATIONAL SAFETY AND HEALTH. ERB, LAB, FIN HB2077 Requires employers to adopt crowd management safety plans for events where large crowds are expected to gather, such as at retail sales events. Requires DLIR to adopt rules. HB2078 RELATING TO TAXATION. TOU, FIN Requires that all advertisements and solicitations for transient accommodations conspicuously display the registration identification number. Applies beginning 1/1/13. RELATING TO THE STATE MICROBE. HLT HB2079 Establishes and designates the bacterium Nesiotobacter exalbescens as the official microbe of the State. RELATING TO MOTOR VEHICLE INSURANCE. HB2080 ERB, CPC, FIN Requires motor vehicle insurance companies to issue insurance cards with a magnetic strip or microchip to allow retail service stations to determine whether a gasoline purchaser's motor vehicle insurance is current. Requires the insurance

commissioner to adopt rules to implement the requirement,

including exemptions.

<u>HB2084</u>	RELATING TO HAWAII PUBLIC HOUSING AUTHORITY. Directs the Auditor to conduct an audit of Hawaii Public Housing Authority's management of Punchbowl Homes. Requires the Auditor to submit its findings and recommendations, including any proposed legislation, to the legislature no later than twenty days prior to the convening of the Regular Session of 2013. <u>HB2085</u>	RELATING TO CABLE SERVICE. Transfers regulation of cable service from the department of commerce and consumer affairs to the public utilities commission.	ERB, CPC, FIN
<u>HB2086</u>	RELATING TO SHERIFFS. Establishes the office of the sheriff within the department of the attorney general. Transfers the department of public safety's duties relating to the office of the sheriff, including the service of process, execution of court orders, and provision of security to state buildings to the department of the attorney general. <u>HB2087</u>	RELATING TO HEALTH. Creates an immunization task force within DOH to study benefits and risks of childhood vaccinations.	HLT/HUS, FIN

HB2090 RELATING TO NATIVE HAWAIIAN BUSINESSES.

ERB, HAW, FIN

Fosters the development and growth of native Hawaiian-owned businesses. Provides 5% bid preference for native Hawaiian businesses certified by OHA. Requires immediate notification to OHA of ownership change and reapplication.

HB2091 RELATING TO EDUCATION.

EDN, FIN

Directs the Department of Education to establish a three-year pilot project that implements a comprehensive assessment program for certain students in grades seven, eight, and nine.

HB2092 RELATING TO KANAKA MAOLI FISHPONDS.

WLO, HAW, FIN

Provides state lease preferences for the reconstruction, restoration, repair, or use of kanaka maoli fishponds. Defines kanaka maoli fishponds as Hawaiian fishponds. Effective July 1, 2012.

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HB2093

RELATING TO AGRICULTURAL EDUCATION.

AGR, HED/EDN,

FIN

Requires the University of Hawaii to establish a Center for Agricultural Leadership. Requires the University of Hawaii to establish a two-year pilot project at one high school campus in each county to determine the steps necessary for a school farm to be food safety certified by the Department of Agriculture.

HB2094 RELATING TO ENVIRONMENTAL DISASTER RESPONSE. WI

WLO/EEP, FIN

Increases the environmental response, energy, and food security tax by 2 cents per barrel and deposits the increase into the wildlife recovery and rehabilitation special fund. Establishes the wildlife recovery and rehabilitation special fund to support the operations of a facility to respond to oil and fuel-related disasters affecting native wildlife in the State.

HB2095 RELATING TO TAXATION.

ERB, FIN

Limits the amount that an employer may deduct for benefits provided to an employee to 50 times the State's median

household income.

HB2096 RELATING TO EMPLOYMENT SECURITY.

LAB, FIN

Extends the 75% maximum weekly benefit amount to 12/31/12. Sets, for calendar year 2012, the employer contribution rate at schedule F. Makes available a line of credit of general revenues for the unemployment compensation fund between 03/01/12 and 06/01/13. Requires, before 06/29/13, that the general fund be repaid for all general revenues loaned to the unemployment compensation fund. Requires, on 06/30/13, the repaid revenues be transferred to the emergency and budget reserve fund. Requires the Act to apply retroactively to 01/01/12.

<u>HB2103</u>	RELATING TO THE BANK OF THE STATE OF HAWAII. Establishes the bank of the State of Hawaii. Directs the state bank to develop a program to acquire residential property in situations where the mortgagor is an owner-occupant and the mortgagee is a securitized trust that cannot adequately demonstrate that it is a holder in due course. HB2120 HLT, FIN Establishes specific tax rates for the sale of pipe tobacco. RELATING TO RENEWABLE ENERGY. HB2121 EEP, FIN Prohibits state and county agencies from entering into an energy agreement or contract to install a renewable energy system with a private provider who has claimed the renewable energy technologies tax credit. Authorizes the issuance of general obligation bonds for renewable energy systems for state facilities. Effective July 1, 2012. RELATING TO THE PROCUREMENT CODE. ERB, FIN HB2122 Suspends the ability of a contractor to protest the awarding of a contract under the State Procurement Code for five years. Effective July 1, 2012. RELATING TO TAX ADMINISTRATION. FIN HB2123 Amends the general excise tax payment deadline from the twentieth day of the month to the last day of the month. Amends the due dates for miscellaneous tax types from the twentieth day of the month to the last day of the month to conform with the general excise tax payment deadline. Amends the due date for filing and payment of monthly periodic insurance premiums taxes from monthly to quarterly. Effective July 1, 2014. HB2124 RELATING TO FIRE PROTECTION. PBM, WLO, FIN Authorizes the county fire chief to require plans and documentation to show compliance with fire code and fire and life safety standards for the construction, alteration, rehabilitation, or addition to any building, structure, or property; change in use of buildings, property, or occupancy; and installation or alteration of any procedures, equipment, property, or structure for any life safety or fire protection systems. WLO, JUD HB2125 RELATING TO AQUARIUM FISH. Requires that any fines or penalties shall apply to each individual saltwater fish, freshwater non-game fish, or any specimen of

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aquatic life taken without an aquarium fish permit.
