Requires director of health to establish ambient air quality standards specifically for crematories. RELATING TO CORPORATIONS. **ERB** HB2658 Extends applicability of an action plan of a merger or share exchange to publicly traded corporations, in certain circumstances. HB2659 RELATING TO INTOXICATING LIQUOR. HB2660 RELATING TO TRANSIT ENHANCEMENTS. TRN, FIN Provides that a county surcharge adopted by ordinance and levied on state general excise or use tax may be used to fund transit enhancements. RELATING TO THE HAWAII EMPLOYER-UNION HEALTH LAB, FIN HB2661 BENEFITS TRUST FUND. Requires the department of budget and finance to conduct a study to reform the Hawaii employer-union health benefits trust fund. Requires the department to submit the study to the governor, legislature, and board of trustees of the trust fund before the convening of the 2014 regular session. Appropriates \$100,000 in FY 2012-13 for the study. RELATING TO STATUTORY REVISION: AMENDING JUD HB2662 VARIOUS PROVISIONS OF THE HAWAII REVISED STATUTES AND THE SESSION LAWS OF HAWAII FOR THE PURPOSE OF CORRECTING ERRORS AND REFERENCES AND CLARIFYING LANGUAGE. Amends various provisions of the Hawaii Revised Statutes and the Session Laws of Hawaii for the purpose of correcting errors and references and clarifying language.

HB2663 RELATING TO PUBLIC UTILITIES. EEP, CPC, FIN

Includes a high-voltage electric transmission cable system for interisland transmission of electricity in the definition of "public utility", regardless of whether the electricity is generated using nonfossil fuels, provided that the PUC finds that regulation is in

the public interest.

HB2664 RELATING TO HEALTH CARE COORDINATION. HLT, FIN

Establishes a public-private partnership in a county with a population between 100,000 and 170,000; partnership to develop an integrated system to deliver health care across the spectrum of care; partnership to work at addressing the current crisis in acute

care.

HB2665 RELATING TO STROKE TREATMENT. HLT, CPC, FIN

Establishes a statewide stroke system of care by designating primary stroke centers and acute stroke capable centers; defines emergency services training and transport protocols; establishes a stroke registry working group; requires health insurance coverage for telemedicine services; and establishes a stroke system of care task force.

HB2666 RELATING TO AGRICULTURAL LAND. AGR/WLO, FIN

Includes lands with the presence of agricultural production or dedicated agricultural infrastructure as a priority land for public acquisition. Authorizes agricultural lands that are reviewed and approved for easement funding by the ADC to have first priority for funding from the land conservation fund.

HB2667 RELATING TO AGRICULTURE. AGR, FIN

Authorizes the department of agriculture to lease land under its jurisdiction to qualified farmers at a reduced rate for food production. Requires the department of agriculture to adopt rules pursuant to chapter 91, HRS, to administer and implement the lease program.

RELATING TO AGRICULTURE. HB2668

AGR, FIN

Amends important agricultural land tax credit to allow an additional fifteen per cent credit for drought mitigation and change the tax credit cap from \$7,500,000 per year to \$5,000,000 per year for the 2012 tax year and \$7,000,000 per year for the 2013, 2014, and 2015 tax years. Creates a livestock feed tax credit for 2013. Creates feed development tax credit program

from January 1, 2013, to December 31, 2015.

REFERRAL HB2669 RELATING TO ENERGY. EEP, FIN Creates an income tax credit for development and construction costs for qualifying biofuel production facilities. Repeals 1/1/2017. Defines "oil refinery". Clarifies that an environmental assessment is required for an action proposing the expansion of an existing oil refinery. HB2670 RELATING TO ENERGY. EEP, FIN Establishes the negotiated partner approach pilot program for energy savings contracts, which allows agencies to forego requests for proposals and negotiate directly with qualified vendors. Requires the pilot program to be operational from 7/1/12 to 6/30/14. HB2671 RELATING TO SUSTAINABILITY. WLO/EEP/AGR. Requires the office of planning to convene a workgroup for HED. FIN sustainability guidelines, establish benchmarks for measuring sustainability progress, and coordinate sustainability progress made by the State and counties. Authorizes the office of planning to contract for a coordinator or facilitator. RELATING TO THE OVERTHROW OF THE HAWAIIAN HB2672 HAW, FIN KINGDOM. Establishes a commission within the Office of Hawaiian Affairs to recognize and commemorate the native Hawaiians who signed the Petition Against Annexation. Specifies that funding for the operations of the petition against annexation memorial commission shall be provided by the office of Hawaiian affairs. Effective July 1, 2012. HB2673 RELATING TO TOURISM. TOU, WLO, FIN Provides individuals occupying transient accommodations with the ability to donate \$1 to the Department of Land and Natural Resources for the State Park System. Authorizes acceptance of donations into the State Parks Special Fund. RELATING TO HUMAN SERVICES. HB2674 HUS, FIN Makes an appropriation for medicaid eligibility worker 3 medicaid eligibility I workers, 2 medicaid eligibility II workers, and 1 medicaid eligibility III worker. RELATING TO CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT PROJECTS FOR HB2675 FIN THE BENEFIT OF THE FORTY-NINTH REPRESENTATIVE DISTRICT. Authorizes the issuance of GO bonds and appropriates funds for

<u>HB2684</u> RELATING TO THE ZIPPER LANE.

TRN, FIN

Requires the Department of Transportation to conduct a feasibility study on the extension of the zipper lane westward from Waipahu toward Kapolei, west of the Kunia on-ramp. Appropriates funds for the study. Effective July 1, 2012.

HB2685 RELATING TO HUMAN SERVICES.

HUS, FIN

Raises the asset limit for public assistance programs from \$5,000

to \$10,000.

HB2686 RELATING TO CIVIL LIABILITY.

PBM, JUD

Exempts the owners of private property from liability for injury, death, loss, or damage suffered by another if the person was allowed on the premises due to an emergency, unless it was intentionally inflicted or occurred by the gross negligence of the private property owner or an agent of the private property owner.

HB2687 RELATING TO THE ENVIRONMENT.

EEP, JUD, FIN

Establishes the Community Response Account into which shall be deposited one-half of the fines and penalties collected under sections 342H-9 and 342-10 from the Environmental Response Revolving Fund. Specifies that where a county individually, or the State and a county jointly, initiates and conducts an investigation resulting in the imposition and collection of a fine or penalty, pursuant to section 342H-30(c), Hawaii Revised Statutes, the fine or penalty shall be distributed as follows: (1) one-third to the county department where the investigation was initiated and conducted; (2) one-third into the Environmental Response Revolving Fund; and (3) one-third into the Community Response Account. Effective July 1, 2012.

HB2688 RELATING TO VEHICLES.

TRN, JUD

Amends the scope of offenses relating to negligent injury by broadening the offenses' application to include negligent injuries caused by mopeds and vessels.

HB2689 RELATING TO GEOTHERMAL ENERGY.

EEP/WLO, FIN

Exempts slim hole wells from chapter 343, HRS, and establishes specific environmental safety requirements for slim hole wells.

Defines "slim hole well" and "large hole well".

<u>HB2690</u> RELATING TO GEOTHERMAL RESOURCES.

EEP/WLO, FIN

Differentiates between "geothermal resources exploration" and "geothermal resources development" for purposes of mining leases and exploration permits. Designates "geothermal resources exploration" and "geothermal resources development" as permitted uses in all state land use districts and conservation district zones. Repeals geothermal resource subzone provisions under state land use law. Exempts geothermal resources exploration from environmental assessment and environmental impact statement requirement.

HB2691 RELATING TO GEOTHERMAL DEVELOPMENT.

EEP/WLO, FIN

Requires state land that is designated as a geothermal resource subzone to be reserved for geothermal development. Requires leases of state land that is designated as a geothermal resource subzone to be processed as both a land lease and a mining lease. Requires an open bidding process for leases of state land designated as a geothermal resource subzone for electricity production. Establishes the geothermal development special fund.

HB2692 RELATING TO HOMEOWNERSHIP.

HSG, LAB, FIN

Establishes the Homeownership Initiative Pilot Program which allows eligible employees to withdraw funds from their employees' retirement system accounts, to be used exclusively for a down payment on a qualifying multifamily residential property that will be used as a primary residence.

<u>HB2693</u> RELATING TO STUDENT HEALTH.

HLT, EDN, JUD

Authorizes trained school personnel to administer epinephrine to a student believed to be having an anaphylactic emergency, with the written authorization of the student's parent or guardian and medical certification that epinephrine may be administered to the student. Requires schools to maintain a supply of epinephrine for anaphylactic emergencies.

<u>HB2694</u> RELATING TO THE STATE BUDGET.

WLO, FIN

Changes the means of financing for renovations to the Maunalua Bay launch ramp facility from revenue bonds to general obligation bonds.

HB2695 RELATING TO LIFE INSURANCE POLICIES.

HLT, CPC, FIN

Establishes a task force to determine the feasibility of using viatical settlements and accelerated death benefits as potential funding sources for long-term care services.

Committee REFERRAL HB2696 RELATING TO LONG-TERM CARE INSURANCE. HLT/HUS, CPC, Establishes a task force to determine the feasibility of FIN establishing a limited, mandatory, public long-term care insurance program. HB2697 RELATING TO RESIDENTIAL CARE. HLT/HUS, FIN Establishes the residential care facility reform task force until 6/30/2013 to determine the feasibility of a single agency overseeing all aspects of residential care facilities in the State. Report to the legislature. JUD RELATING TO ELECTIONS. HB2698 Makes defamation in campaign material a misdemeanor offense. HB2699 RELATING TO SMOKING. HLT. CPC Prohibits smoking in certain rented units and condominium units. Requires some condominium associations, if not prohibited by bylaws or articles of incorporation, to adopt bylaws or rules that prohibit smoking in certain areas. RELATING TO CAMPAIGN SPENDING. HB2700 JUD, FIN Amends public funding pilot project for county of Hawaii county council elections to raise the program cap, repeal the requirement of a minimum fund amount, extend the period for signature collection, clarify provision of matching funds, and to clarify that the formula to determine the amount of funds given to a publicly funded candidate is based on the prior two general elections actually held for the county council seat in that district. RELATING TO DOMESTIC RELATIONS. HB2701 JUD Amends various statutory provisions to reconfirm and clarify the original intent of Act 1 (2011) that civil union partners shall have all the same rights, benefits, protections, and responsibilities under law as are granted to those who contract, obtain a license, and are solemnized pursuant to chapter 572. Makes various housekeeping amendments to statutes to assist with the implementation and interpretation of Act 1, including with respect to public employee benefits, property held as tenants by the entirety, establishment of parent-child relationships, and adoption. RELATING TO BEACHES. WLO, JUD HB2702

Prohibits the operation of motorized vehicles on beaches.
