The Senate of the Twenty-Sixth Legislature of the State of Hawai'i, Regular Session of 2012, convened at 11:35 a.m. with the President in the Chair.

**ORDER OF THE DAY
ADVISE AND CONSENT**

Stand. Com. Rep. No. 2001 (Jud. Com. No. 1):

Senator Hee moved that Stand. Com. Rep. No. 2001 be received and placed on file, seconded by Senator Shimabukuro and carried.

Senator Hee then moved that the Senate consent to the nomination of MIMI DESJARDINS to the District Court of the Second Circuit, State of Hawaii, for a term of six years, seconded by Senator Shimabukuro.

Senator Hee rose to speak in support of the nominee as follows:

"Mimi DesJardins has been appointed by the Chief Justice of the Hawai'i Supreme Court to serve on the District Court for Maui County, the Second Circuit. Having been a part of previous confirmations with Maui judges, there's no doubt in my mind that she stands the brightest of the three by head and shoulders above the rest. She is someone who has paid her dues as a per diem judge, as a family court lawyer, and as a single mother.

"She was very forthright in her conversation with me prior to the public hearing. I always try and ask the catch-all question, which is, 'Is there something I haven't asked that you think you ought to tell me?' And she said well, she expected some opposition. So I asked what that might be about, and she explained a case that involved child custody.

"Anyone who has been involved in child custody quickly will come to grips with the seriousness and emotions and passion of which is all a part of the discussion, including anger. And this particular case, I believe, in reading the record, contained much or all of that. The common theme of those three people who sent in letters in opposition was an interpretation of a statute that those opposed felt strongly that she, as an attorney, was responsible for the decision. In fact, there is no doubt that the statute is very clear that the judge in the case was the one who made the ruling involving this particular section of the law that the opposition referred to. It's a little bit too bad that one of those in opposition is well known in domestic violence abuse cases and resides on O'ahu. I suppose she was too busy to appear, and that was unfortunate. Had she appeared, she would have been given the opportunity to explain what we have concluded is a misreading of the statute.

"As a consequence of that, I am confident, and I believe I speak for the Committee on Judiciary and Labor by their votes, is very confident that Mimi DesJardins—born in New York, raised on the east coast, who received a law degree from Puget Sound and found her way to Hawai'i—will serve the Court with great distinction. She does not have a memory of convenience. She does not have an inability to recall issues. She, in fact, stands by her record, and that is something that I find very appealing in people who would seek to serve the public in judgment of others.

"So colleagues, I would encourage you to join the Committee on Judiciary and Labor in supporting and consenting to the nomination of Mimi DesJardins. I would end with one note that is kind of unusual in so far as confirmations are concerned: I believe my clerk asked her, 'Is Mimi your real name?' Mimi is her real name, for you opera people who are familiar with 'La Bohème'. Thank you, Mr. President."

Senator Baker rose to speak in support of the nominee as follows:

"Thank you, Mr. President. On behalf of the Maui Senators, I rise in strong support of judicial nominee to the District Court of the Second Circuit, State of Hawai'i, Ms. Mimi DesJardins, for the term of six years.

"Ms. DesJardins has widespread community support from the legal folks on Maui. In her years of practice as both an attorney and a per diem judge, she has garnered the reputation of being highly competent, fair, and knowledgeable. The

enthusiastic support of her colleagues, I think, speaks volumes to the type of person she is as well. As many testifiers noted, she is able to combine those qualities with a high intelligence and an approachable attitude.

“Her love of Maui can’t be overlooked either. Ms. DesJardins’ wealth and diversity of experience shows this commitment, having worked as a public defender, prosecutor, and per diem judge, in addition to her private practice. One of the things that I found so notable is that while she was a per diem judge, she might have been on a track to be a candidate for a permanent judgeship, but she recognized a gap in her legal background and experience and she became a practicing attorney in family law because that was the area she hadn’t had any experience in. And I think this really speaks volumes to the kind of qualities and integrity that this woman has.

“Her experience as a per diem judge has been received with high acclaim from the people who have appeared before her in that setting. The people of Maui, we believe, will be well served by her experience combined with her preparation and even temperament. I believe the qualities that she exhibits, as the Chair of Judiciary and Labor Committee has noted, are both rare and admirable.

“Another example of her desire to better understand the field of family law, in addition to beginning to practice, is her engagement in training offered by Women Helping Women. Women Helping Women is the Maui agency that works with the victims of domestic violence but also assists children and offers anger management programs for batterers. Despite her many duties, she has made time to attend every domestic violence training on Maui. The staff and clients of Women Helping Women were overwhelmingly in support of Ms. Desjardins.

“And of course, from my perspective, I am always delighted to be able to stand in support of an eminently qualified woman to join the bench. Mimi will be just the second woman to be on the judicial team on Maui. I appreciate Chief Justice Recktenwald’s appointment because I know it wasn’t an easy task; there were lots of qualified candidates on that list. But in my view he selected wisely.

“I believe that Ms. DesJardins has the right qualities to be a fair and effective judge. Her experience and demeanor will help her successfully navigate presiding over a courtroom and the difficulties attendant while obtaining just results.

“So colleagues, it is with great pleasure that I speak on behalf of Senate President, Senator English, and myself, in support of the nomination of Mimi DesJardins to the District Court of Maui County. I ask all my colleagues to join me in supporting this confirmation. Mahalo.”

Senator Slom rose to speak in support of the nominee as follows:

“Thank you, Mr. President, colleagues. On behalf of your Senate Minority, we give our full support to Mimi. I like the name Mimi, whether it’s La Bohème or Rogers and Hammerstein; I think that’s good.

“We had a very good discussion together prior to her hearing. I am particularly appreciative of her wide breadth of professional experience as a deputy prosecutor, deputy public defender, corporation counsel. As was said, she is very active in her community, she’s very active in public affairs, but she brings a lot of practical experience as well.

“And we discussed the position of District Court Judge. Some may not think it’s as glamorous as other positions, but in fact, it’s where the rubber meets the road. It’s where the vast majority of our citizens first get their first taste of our judicial

system. And we need the best possible judges and the people that are empathetic, people that are understanding, people that can deliver justice in a way that is mutually beneficial. I think we have that in our nominee.

“I know her daughter is very proud of her, as she should be. We all share in her achievements, and we know that this is not the last that we will be hearing of the judge. And so we wish her well, and I, too, call on my colleagues to unanimously approve Mimi. Thank you, Mr. President.”

The motion was put by the Chair and carried on the following showing of Ayes and Noes:

Ayes, 25. Noes, none.

At this time, Senator Hee introduced Judge DesJardins, who was accompanied by her daughter Madeline DesJardins, her partner Hayden Aluli and his mother Auntie Mokihana Aluli, and her son Kainoa Aluli.

At 12:01 p.m., the Senate stood in recess subject to the call of the Chair.

The Senate reconvened at 12:10 p.m.

Senator Hee rose to speak on a point of personal privilege as follows:

“Boy, isn’t it great to have session start and we’re all together and we get this opportunity to share our mana’o, as it may be, on a day-to-day basis. I think most of you know that I have been involved in the contested case proceeding before the Land Use Commission on the DR Horton development at Kapolei. And I wanted to rise on a point of personal privilege because at the hearing yesterday, several things happened. Some of you have asked me about them and what has happened, but rather than share them individually, I thought it would be in the interest of all of us, including the media, to understand my views on what happened yesterday.

“Principally, Aloun Farms—and it’s in today’s paper—gives back to the project. So there can be no misunderstanding, the proceeding, from my perspective, at the Land Use Commission is not about Aloun Farms. It’s not about being pro-development or being anti-development. What it really is about is food security. What it really is about is from DR Horton’s own ag expert Bruce Plasch, who said that there are only 4,500 acres on O’ahu that are prime ag. Or you could take the Department of Ag’s own conclusion that there are 4,000 acres in prime ag. Not 250,000. Not 150,000, as DR Horton’s paid consultant Dean Okimoto, who makes up to \$10,000 a month, has been babbling on the radio, but rather 4,500, by Bruce Plasch who is the ag expert to DR Horton, or 4,000 from Senator Kokubun in his testimony. Either way, the 1,500 acres in question represent 30 percent if you believe Bruce Plasch, or just under 30 percent if you believe Senator Kokubun. It really doesn’t matter.

“What was interesting in yesterday’s proceeding was that Aloun Farms submitted a letter dated January 17, 2012, a letter in support of Ho’opili. I use that word ‘interesting’ because it reminds me of an IED—for all you military people, an improvised explosive device—because that’s how I felt when I first heard it from Alan Gottlieb at the Land Use Commission hearing. I thought that wow, maybe I had stepped on a land mine, but in fact after reading the testimony, I’ve concluded that the land mine is a dud. I didn’t know Alec Sou could write language that his signature is affixed to. Let me read some of it: ‘The local representatives of DR Horton have been responsive to our needs and we work on almost a daily basis to resolve issues.’ Wow, that’s not what Alec Sou told us.

We do not view the plans of DR Horton as an end of all farming of Honolulu, much less Hawai’i. In fact we at Aloun Farms believe our future is bright for

farming in Honolulu, especially with the strong growing interest by the public and elected officials with supporting sustainable agriculture. We believe there is more than sufficient land on Oahu to support our farming operations and with continued support by enlightened land owners, government agencies, and elected officials, we will continue to expand our ability to provide vegetables and produce.

“Wow, that’s not what Alec Sou told us.

“Maybe at the heart of the IED, which really is a dud, is this sentence: ‘Part of the plan is for Aloun Farm to maintain its warehouse and vegetable processing plant where it is now, indefinitely.’ If you wondered what Alec Sou’s price was, I just gave you the price. Because all we could hear from Alec Sou was, ‘I cannot expand my farm because I cannot have a processing plant. See all those trusses over there? We want to put them up but we only got 12 years left on the lease.’ It is my hope that we will have the opportunity to subpoena Mr. Sou and to ask him who wrote the letter. This question on Ho‘opili raises far more consequences than the project itself.

“Yesterday, Judith Flanders—daughter of Muriel MacFarland Flanders, granddaughter of Alice Kamokila MacFarland, great granddaughter of James Campbell—also testified. And although I don’t have her written testimony, let me provide the sum and substance of what she said:

I am not proud of the role I played in seeing what was formerly productive prime ag lands turned into what it is today. When I fly over O‘ahu on Hawaiian Airlines it gives me pause and great sadness to know that the role as a cousin and beneficiary of my great grandfather has turned productive land into what it is today. If I could, I would do it over. I ask you as commissioners to save what is left of prime agriculture land in production.

“Members, a few months ago an article appeared entitled, ‘State wrestles with how to make developers keep their promises’. It should be no epiphany to any of us here that Haseko, which promised 1,400 boat slips as part of a condition from ag to urban, changed their mind. Changed their mind! Sold the houses. Sold the condos. Marketed both with the marina, a world-class marina of which yachting contests similar to the America’s Cup would be held. I personally don’t own a boat. I don’t particularly care for boats. But this is not about a boat; it’s about a promise. And in exchange for the promise, a change of agriculture to urban designation so that your billions can follow you and your shareholders. That concerns me.

“Approximately a month ago, Judge Betsy Strance from Kona found for the Developers against the Land Use Commission, which yanked the zoning because the developers never kept their promises. Who is to say based on two developers that DR Horton will keep their promise of gardens, of farms. Who is to say, based on Haseko, based on ‘Aina Le‘a. We are to say. The Land Use Commission has no teeth. Zero. When Judge Strance’s order comes out, I’ll circulate it for all of you to see. The Land Use Commission has no authority. So the people of Hawai‘i are victimized by empty promises of billionaires who sell the land, our land, to feather their nests away from our land. That’s what the decision about Aloun Farms is about. Everyone has a price. Alec Sou’s price is a processing plant indefinitely in perpetuity. But as Judith Flanders said, we have to learn to listen to the land and respect the land. Thank you, Mr. President.”

At 12:22 p.m., the Senate stood in recess subject to the call of the Chair.

The Senate reconvened at 12:28 p.m.

Senator Baker rose to speak on a point of personal privilege as follows:

“Colleagues, when our community loses valued kupuna and loved ones as well as those serving in the military, it deserves our special remembrance and recognition. So, I ask today that the Senate adjourn on a rising vote in memory of Senator Chun Oakland’s mother, Ms. Mei-Chih Chun, and those wonderful Marines from Kāne‘ohe who lost their lives serving their country in Afghanistan. Thank you.”
