Tuesday, February 14, 2012

The Roll was called showing all Senators present.

The President announced that he had read and approved the Journal of the Seventeenth Day.

At this time, Senator Slom welcomed his 2 1/2 year old "birth twin" Mahina with whom he shares a birthday, and her grandmother Suzie McLaughlin, a distinguished teacher at Maryknoll School for more than three decades.

Senator Ryan wished everyone a Happy Valentine's Day and reminded everyone that it was a great day to remember and cherish loved ones

Senator Kahele rose to speak on a point of personal privilege as follows:

"This morning before I even got out of bed, my grandson, age 7, came up to me and he presented me with a Valentine's Day card that he had made, and he also made a nice little red heart here. He told me, 'Papa, you're my Valentine.' So, I wanted to wish all the young, beautiful women in the chamber and up in the gallery a Happy Valentine's Day."

Senator Kim recognized that today was Senate Clerk Carol Taniguchi's birthday and wished her haou'oli lā hānau.

At 11:38 a.m., the Senate stood in recess subject to the call of the Chair.

The Senate reconvened at 11:39 a.m.

Senator Hee rose to speak on a point of personal privilege as follows:

"As you know, the Committees on Hawaiian Affairs and Water Land took action on the OHA settlement. I understand the bill now moves on. I wanted to let everybody know the Committee on Judiciary looks forward to its arrival because we intend to answer the question, 'Is it accurate?' and if so, how come it's not true? So, we look forward to its arrival."

Senator Hee, Chair of the Committee on Judiciary and Labor, requested a waiver of the notice requirement pursuant to Senate Rule 21 for S.B. No. 2057.

At 11:40 a.m., the Senate stood in recess subject to the call of the Chair.

The Senate reconvened at 11:42 a.m.

Senator Hee withdrew his previous request for a waiver of the notice requirement.

Senator Solomon rose to speak on a point of personal privilege as follows:

"I'd like to ask the previous speaker a question. If he would please define what does he mean by 'accurate' in terms of the settlement bill for OHA that was passed out of both Water Land and Hawaiian Affairs?"

Senator Hee responded:

"Thank you, Mr. President, I will yield. There are several things on the settlement issue that we have been researching on the Judiciary and Labor Committee. I don't want to belabor this issue, but let me give you an example of one of the conundrums of this proposal.

"There's some ambiguity on whether or not the lands in question are ceded, and I'm not sure we'll be able to resolve that question going forward. There's no disputing that certain parcels along Pier 1 are ceded; there's no disputing that. However, there is some question on the Kewalo side, where Fisherman's Wharf is located. We do know that those lands where Kewalo is were once the lands of Victoria Ward. At the time Kewalo Basin was dredged, those lands were fishponds; we do know that.

"We feel quite confident that the lands that are being conveyed to OHA were once the lands of Princess Kamāmalu; we feel confident about that. We also know that the lands of Kamāmalu were submerged lands. We also know that Princess Kamāmalu left them to her cousin, Princess Ruth Ke'elikōlani, who left the land to Princess Bernice Pauahi Bishop. We also

know Princess Bernice Pauahi Bishop, or more likely her husband, conveyed those lands to the state.

"The attorney general has not taken a position on whether those are ceded lands. The lands that brought those fishponds owned by Kamāmalu were filled with submerged lands in order to build Kewalo Basin.

"I happen to take the wide view when Hawaiian lands are called into question. Because those ceded lands were deposited on the lands of Kamāmalu—herself a Hawaiian, who but for the fact of the mahele, was a member of the crown—that I would argue that those lands belong to the people of Hawai'i, and therefore are ceded. So it may be accurate but not true, and that was my point.

"When we deliberate the issue, I want to assure everyone that what others may characterize as pono, I may disagree. Some of you know that I happen to believe that too often the words 'aloha', 'mahalo', and 'pono' are used as punchlines too often by those who would speak in an effort to embrace the host culture, and we'll get into that. And that's why I said earlier that the Committee on Judiciary looks forward to the discussion having to do with the settlement for the Office of Hawaiian Affairs. Thank you."

Senator Solomon rose to make the following remarks:

"Thank you very much, Mr. President. I want to thank the previous speaker. I'm happy to note that he does feel that the report is accurate. However, in his own opinion, he feels otherwise. Well, I'd just like to remind you, Mr. President, as well as my colleagues, we all have opinions on many matters that we deliberate on here in this building, and I'm hoping that the Judiciary Chairman will see his way clear as when he reads the committee reports from both the Water Land Committee and the Hawaiian Affairs Committee to note we did our due diligence on this recommendation. Thank you very much, Mr. President."

Senator Kidani rose to request that the Senate adjourn on a rising vote to observe a moment of silence in honor and memory of Representative Sam Lee, and the Chair so ordered.

ADJOURNMENT

At 11:50 a.m., on motion by Senator Espero, seconded by Senator Slom and carried, the Senate adjourned until 11:30 a.m., Wednesday, February 15, 2012, on a rising vote, observing a moment of silence in memory of Representative Sam Lee, former State Representative of the Mililani area.
