# Tuesday, March 13, 2012

The Senate of the Twenty-Sixth Legislature of the State of Hawai'i, Regular Session of 2012, convened at 11:39 a.m. with the President in the Chair.

The Roll was called showing all Senators present.

The President announced that he had read and approved the Journal of the Twenty-Ninth Day.

At this time, Senator Ryan introduced members of the Kailua Senior Citizens Club who were seated in the gallery.

At this time, Senator Slom rose to speak on a point of personal privilege as follows:

"Mr. President, colleagues, I was both saddened and angered this morning to see the headline on the front page of the newspaper that a \$100,000 settlement had been paid by the taxpayers of the State of Hawai'i to the professional agitator and protestor Mr. Mitch Kahle, who came here to the Senate Chamber on several occasions with video camera in an orchestrated effort to disrupt this body. I, more than most, stand for free speech and the right to protest, but what was done in the name of free speech was far beyond that—it violated the decorum, the order, and the dignity and courtesy for guests in our chamber. And the fact that we would pay this, to me, is

outrageous. I understand the situations where an attorney will tell you it's just not worth it in terms of cost because if we go on with this or we appeal a particular action, it's going to cost a great deal of money, but Mr. President, I would suggest that there are great principles at stake that have great value and cannot be assessed in monetary cost, and I would submit that this is one of those areas. First of all, standing behind our members and staff and the people of Hawai'i and to allow this judgment to stand and pay this money, I think, is unconscionable. Thank you, Mr. President."
