The Senate of the Twenty-Sixth Legislature of the State of Hawai'i, Regular Session of 2012, convened at 11:30 a.m. with the President in the Chair

The Roll was called showing all Senators present with the exception of Senators Kouchi and Taniguchi who were excused.

The President announced that he had read and approved the Journal of the Thirty-Second Day.

At this time, Senator Chun Oakland welcomed a group of social work students from Hawai'i Pacific University, Brigham Young University Hawai'i, and the University of Hawai'i at Mānoa, who were accompanied by Marty Oliphant, Executive Director of the National Association of Social Workers (NASW) Hawai'i Chapter.

Senator Gabbard introduced a group of ninth- through eleventh-grade students from American Rennaissance Academy who were visiting the Capitol to testify on various bills relating to education. The students were accompanied by their teacher David Suhs, and chaperones Teresa Castro and Leslie Mason.

Senator Espero introduced a group of students from 'Ewa Makai Middle School and their teachers Joshua Ching and Vanessa Kealoha, Vice Principal Ursula Kawaguchi, and Dennis Ihara, all who were visiting the Capitol to testify on S.C.R. No. 33.

Senator Tokuda introduced students, teachers, chaperones, and representatives from Kalaheo High School, Ke Kula Kaiapuni 'O Ānuenue, Hanalani Schools, and Punahou School, as well as members and advisors of the Hawai'i State Student Council who were seated in the gallery.

Senator Tokuda congratulated Chad Miller of Kailua High School, who was selected as the 2012 State Teacher of the Year. Mr. Miller was accompanied by his girlfriend Hilina Fukutomi, his brother and sister-in-law Chip and Tye Miller, Steven Deburger, Dr. Thomas Jackson, Aya Takahashi, Dr. Benjamin Lukey, Principal Francine Honda, Vice Principal Brett Matsukawa, Katie Berger, and Jonathan Delahoyde.

Senator Tokuda, on behalf of Senator Kouchi, recognized Sheriann Moises of Chiefess Kamakahelei Middle School, who was selected as the 2012 Kaua'i District Teacher of the Year, but was unable to attend.

Senator Dela Cruz congratulated Meghan McCormick of Wheeler Middle School, who was selected as the 2012 Central O'ahu District Teacher of the Year. Ms. McCormick was accompanied by Justin Ugalino, grandparents Richard and Helga Matzko, and Vice Principal Sam Bennett.

Senator Fukunaga congratulated Kaeokekulani Vasconcellos of Roosevelt High School, who was selected as the 2012 Honolulu District Teacher of the Year. Senator Ihara congratulated Amber Strong Makaiau of Kailua High School, who received the 2011 Teaching Tolerance Award for Excellence in Culturally Responsive Teaching. Ms. Makaiau was accompanied by her mother Linda Strong, husband Jarad, and daughter Cappy.

Senator Shimabukuro recognized Luane Higuchi of Wai'anae Intermediate School, who was selected as the 2012 Leeward O'ahu District Teacher of the Year, but was unable to attend.

Senator Kahele recognized Nancy Iaukea of Pāhoa High and Intermediate School, who was selected as the 2012 Hawai'i District Teacher of the Year, but was unable to attend.

Senator Tokuda noted the presence of Department of Education Superintendent Kathryn Matayoshi in the gallery.

Senator Tokuda acknowledged and thanked her office team and the entire Senate support staff who assisted with planning Education Week activities at the Capitol, including Erin Conner, Joanne Swearingen, Darlene Tsukazaki, Allen Awaya, Vaughn Tokashiki, and volunteers Carol Pang and Zachary Dilonno.

At 11:52 a.m., the Senate stood in recess subject to the call of the Chair.

On motion by Senator Espero, seconded by Senator Slom and carried, the report of the majority of the Committee was adopted and H.B. No. 2502, H.D. 2, S.D. 1, entitled: "A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO MORTGAGE SERVICERS," passed Second Reading and was referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

Senators English and Espero, for the Committee on Transportation and International Affairs and the Committee on Public Safety, Government Operations, and Military Affairs, presented a joint report (Stand. Com. Rep. No. 2841) recommending that H.B. No. 2608, H.D. 1, as amended in S.D. 1, pass Second Reading and be referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

On motion by Senator Espero, seconded by Senator Slom and carried, the joint report of the Committees was adopted and H.B. No. 2608, H.D. 1, S.D. 1, entitled: "A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO DRIVER LICENSING," passed Second Reading and was referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

At this time, Senator Baker rose to speak on a point of personal privilege as follows:

"First, I know our colleague from the windward side has already been thanked, but I think the efforts that she and her staff have put into Education Week deserve another acknowledgement, because this has been one of the more energetic, enjoyable, and creative Education Weeks I've seen in all the years I've been in the Capitol. So, another mahalo to Senator Jill Tokuda.

"The other part of my point of personal privilege is to say aloha to our student shadow from Kamehameha Schools Maui, Kaili Mossman. She's been a joy to have in the office, and I know we send her back with some new information perhaps, some fun experiences I hope, and maybe we'll get another good student from Kamehameha Schools next year spring break.

"And finally, it's my pleasure to share with all of you that our acute care hospital on the island of Maui is going smoke-free totally May 1 of this year. They will be the first neighbor island hospital to do so. There will be no smoking anywhere on the campus—not in the parking lot, not in designated smoke areas—and in an attempt to help those who

may want to quit smoking during their time at Maui Memorial, they will be offering various smoking cessation aids and assists. They join Queen's Medical Center, Kaiser Moanalua, Castle, and Kapi'olani Women's and Children's Medical Center as smoke-free campuses. This is an excellent way to go as health professionals and health care providers. If you want to help your patients live healthier lives, your facility needs to be smoke-free as well. So, I commend Maui Memorial for the action that they've taken. Mahalo."

Senator Gabbard rose to remind the members about the upcoming Capitol Idol 2012 event to raise funds for the Hawai'i Foodbank, and informed the members of the current participants on behalf of the Senate.

Senator Hee rose on a point of inquiry as follows:

"Maybe I should explain the reason for my point of inquiry: Last night, Senator Kahele and I had the privilege of watching the Star of David over Kāne'ohe Bay, over a fishpond, actually. And while he and I were gazing at the Star of David, but who should alight to our presence but an angel, who unfurled her wings—or was it a butterfly, who puka'd through the cocoon to grace us with unheard of talent? So, my point of inquiry to Senator Kahele is: Who was that masked woman who is in the Senate, and to assist the Senate's efforts of the previous speaker to take his place as a jump roper? The question to Senator Kahele is: Who was that Senator who graced us on the stage, and does he feel that she should represent the Senate in lieu of the jump roper?

Senator Kahele responded as follows:

"My colleague from the 23rd District is a lot sharper than I thought, and I guess that's why he's the Judiciary and Labor Chairman. I thought he forgot what was going to be happening today, but he pointed across to me and I made sure I was prepared.

"Colleagues, yesterday we heard a passionate, pleading wail from the Senator from the 19th District. The gauntlet, as we all know, has been cast with the House, and we must respond. Last night, along the shores of Kahalu'u, the Senator from the 23rd District and I observed—I don't think it was the Star of David, because at the time we sort of were in a libatious, hazy, and voggy state. I thought I saw a moon that rose to the west above the island of Kaua'i, and we both thought we saw the beautiful Hanalei moon.

"Colleagues, we have been saved. Worry no more, because as we both saw, a star has arrived—a captivating, sensuous hula to the strains of 'Hanalei Moon' by our own Senator Donna Kim. Wonderful. So, I believe that we are in good hands and this august chamber will be well-represented by none other than Senator Kim doing a wonderful 'Hanalei Moon'. Thank you, Mr. President."
