- 6 Purpose and Justification: To confirm the appointments of Daniel Eineker, Patrick Brown, Lester
- 7 Fung and Taryn Dean to serve on the OSAB.

- 9 members of the Service Area Board are service area residents who are consumers or non-providers of
- mental health services and service area providers with a majority being non-state employees and non-

- in New Mexico and Hawaii, and is currently an accountant in the Department of Health, WIC Branch.
- He is familiar with boards and commissions having served on the Board of Directors of the United Self

Help and the Campfire Councils. Mr. Eineker's professional and life experiences will be valuable as a member of the OSAB, while adding to the dialogue with an enriched financial perspective.

Patrick Brown, a retired federal manager, has twenty years' experience working and living with children with mental illness and drug addiction challenges. This experience was honed not only personally, but also as a result of his participation with foster children through the Catholic Charities' Na Ohana Pulama program. Mr. Brown is familiar with addiction and mental health illness' treatment and the resources made available through state-supported organizations. Along with his wife, he co-authored a book for families on addiction. As a member of the Board, Mr. Brown will give the OSAB a parent's voice and perspective of the importance of supporting families who have individuals living with mental and substance abuse challenges.

Lester Fung is a strong advocate for people living with mental illness. He has written to politicians, community leaders, and to Hawaii's leaders in Washington, D.C. on behalf of individuals living with mental illness to effect policy change. Mr. Fung is knowledgeable in computer applications and while completing his degree at Brigham Young University's Hawaii campus, completed his practicum at the National Alliance on Mental Illness Hawaii (NAMI). Mr. Fung's advocacy efforts will provide a voice for consumers of mental illness during Board deliberations.

Taryn Dean, a community representative, currently works as a Licensed Clinical Consultant for the United States Marine Corps, Wounded Warrior Battalion West-Detachment Hawaii. Prior to working with the marines, Ms. Dean worked extensively in the field of mental illness and substance abuse as a clinical therapist, substance abuse counselor, crisis worker and service coordinator. In addition to her strong clinical social work background, Ms. Dean is very involved in her community and volunteers for other children, youth and adult organizations, as well as for the American Red Cross Disaster Mental Health services on an on-call basis. Ms. Dean fulfills the community representation on the OSAB.
