In consideration of HOUSE BILL 2325 RELATING TO BROADBAND

House Bill 2325 proposes to require the approval of state permits for broadband related permits within forty-five days of submission of a complete permit application. If on the forty-sixth day an application is not approved, approved with modifications, or disapproved, it shall be deemed approved by the State. The Department of Land and Natural Resources (Department) offers the following concerns.

The proposed measure does not contain a list of state or county permits for broadband facilities that would be subject to expedited review and/or automatic approval. In addition, if broadband facilities are subject to Chapter 343, Hawaii Revised Statutes (HRS) (Chapter 343, HRS, is not a permit function), it is unclear how this function would be completed, under such a stringent permit processing timeframe. The measure also stipulates that "the term [broadband related permits] does not include any state permit for which the approval of a federal agency is explicitly required..." In general, this measure lacks specificity and would be difficult to implement in its present form as there would likely be confusion or dissagreement over what permits would actually be affected, and how Chapter 343, HRS, process would be completed. Also the term "broadband related permits" is vauge. Specifically, the term "related" should not be used in this context as it could be construed to be related to almost anything.

As an alternative to this measure, the Legislature should endeavor to create a single permtting authority for "broadband permits" and exempt broadband facilities from other permits. This process needs to be articulated in state law with specific details about the single permitting authority and guidelines for the processing of permits. The single permitting authority would coordinate permit processing with other agencies and stakeholders. A more reasonable timeframe than forty-five days is required to complete the process.
