### RELATING TO THE DEPARTMENT OF HAWAIIAN HOME LANDS.

Chair Ige, Vice-Chair Kidani, and committee members, thank you for the opportunity to comment on HB 2529, HD1, SD1. This bill allows an exemption from HRS chapter 103D, Hawaii Public Procurement Code (Code), for expenditures and procurements less than \$100,000 made from Hawaiian home trust funds.

The State Procurement Office opposes this bill. It is not appropriate to exempt these "trust" funds expenditures because regardless of what it may be called, the awarding of public funds resulting in a contract with a private entity, should be done in accordance with the Code. The department should use the solicitation process pursuant to HRS section 103D-303, competitive sealed proposals to award "trust" funds. Developing another set of "internal policies and procedures .... that are consistent with the goals of public accountability and public procurement practices for expenditures from these funds" creates confusion for vendors, contractors, and service providers as to which set of rules and procedures is applicable. Agencies should not be allowed to create their own contract awards process that "basically follow procurement practices" that are self-enforced.

Public procurement's primary objective is to provide everyone equal opportunity to compete for government contracts, to prevent favoritism, collusion or fraud in awarding of contracts. There is nothing unique or special in the awarding of these funds that cannot be accommodated in the Code. To legislate that any one agency should be exempt from compliance with HRS chapter 103D conveys a sense of disproportionate equality in the law's application.
