HB 2688 RELATING TO VEHICLES

HOUSE COMMITTEE ON TRANSPORTATION

The Department of Transportation is in support of House Bill No. 2688 that will define "vehicle" in chapter 707 to be the same as in section 291E-1. It amends negligent injury offenses to include bodily injury to another person caused by the operation of a moped or vessel in a negligent manner.

Due to the increasing incidents involving the negligent operations of mopeds and vessels (jet skis), this bill will make operators more accountable for their actions when it involves the safety of others when operating these types of vehicles.

The Department of Transportation urges your committee to pass House Bill No. 2688 which will make operators of these types of vehicles more accountable for their actions and to save lives on roadways and waterways.

HB 2688 - RELATING TO VEHICLES

Chair Souki, Vice Chair Ichiyama and Members of the Committee on Transportation:

The Department of the Prosecuting Attorney, County of Maui supports this measure.

HB 2688, Relating to Vehicles, proposes to create a definition of "vehicle" in Hawai'i Revised Statutes ("HRS") Chapter 707 that is identical to HRS Chapter 291E, and change "motor vehicle" in the negligent injury statutes to "vehicle." This will make clear that the operation of mopeds and vessels are included in the negligent homicide statutes, and allow negligent injury statutes to include the operation of mopeds and vessels.

The Department of the Prosecuting Attorney, County of Maui, SUPPORTS the passage of this bill. Within the past year, we had two fatalities in Maui County waters involving boats versus swimmers/divers incidents. Also during this time, we had one boat versus swimmer incident resulting in the partial amputation of an arm. This is in addition to numerous reported "near miss" incidents. Also, we are aware of fatalities in moped collisions on Oahu. This bill will make clear that the operation of vessels and mopeds are included in the negligent homicide statutes. It will also add the operation of vessels and mopeds to the negligent injury statutes. We believe that this will result in increased operator awareness and safety on our streets and waters. Accordingly, we ask that the committee PASS HB 2688.
