<u>PURPOSE</u>: The purpose of the bill is to authorize the Department of Human Services to provide medical assistance for dialysis, chemotherapy, and other cancer treatments, inpatient and outpatient physician visits, and drug prescriptions.

DEPARTMENT'S POSITION: The Department of Human Services (DHS) opposes this bill because this bill would limit the benefits provided by DHS.

If this bill were to apply to Medicaid, it would significantly reduce benefits as DHS covers dialysis, chemotherapy and other cancer treatment without limitation; has no limits on physician visits; and has no limitation on monthly prescriptions.

The Hawai'i Primary Care Association, which represents community health centers in Hawai'i, supports the intent of House Bill 2792 which authorizes the Department of Human Services to provide medical assistance for dialysis, chemotherapy, and other cancer treatments, inpatient and outpatient physician visits, and drug prescriptions.

Currently, 48% of community health centers patients are enrolled in Medicaid and 25% are currently uninsured. As such, the Primary Care Association supports the intent of this bill but would like a more definitive statement made as to the particular individuals encompassed by this measure, be they Medicaid, uninsured patients, or potentially even commercially insured individuals.

We urge you to pass this measure out of committee so as to further this important discussion. Thank you for the opportunity to testify.
