Thank you for the opportunity to provide testimony in support of House Concurrent Resolution No. 163.

This Resolution asks the Department of Land and Natural Resources and the Public Land Development Corporation to study the establishment of a public-private partnership to develop and improve the leasehold lands of East Hawai'i, which includes the Banyan Drive and Kanoelehua Industrial Area.

As the Hawai'i County Council Member who represents this district, I strongly support this resolution. The Banyan Drive area contains the majority of the overnight accommodation in East Hawai'i and it has been allowed to deteriorate. Because many of the State leases for the Banyan Drive properties expire in 2015, there is little incentive for the lessees to make much needed improvements and investments, thus the area is in dire need of renewal and renovation.

To quote an article from the Hawai'i Tribune Herald (Sunday, February 5, 2012) in describing one of the hotel properties:

"A man from Mississippi was less charitable. "I felt like I was in one of those creepy video games that take place in an old abandoned hotel," he wrote, "and zombies were going to attack at any moment." The large, abandoned swimming pool generates a lot of complaints. Located adjacent to a shuttered restaurant and a parking lot that has also been used for storage, the pool is a haven for algae, waterfowl and mosquito larvae. Weeds sprout amid the concrete and the metal fence that surrounds it is broken in several places."

This vividly illustrates the need for change, and the study proposed in HCR 163 is the first step in the right direction towards the revitalization of this area.

Thank you for the opportunity to provide testimony IN SUPPORT of House Concurrent Resolution No. 163.

This Resolution urges the Department of Land and Natural Resources and the Public Land Development Corporation to study the establishment of a public-private partnership to develop and improve the leasehold lands of East Hawai'i, which includes the Banyan Drive and Kanoelehua Industrial Area.

I fully support the intent of this resolution. I have lived in East Hawaii for the past 38 years and watched with dismay as Banyan Drive and the Industrial area fell into disuse and disrepair. This was caused by leasehold tenancy, which is embedded in statutory language and not likely to change in our lifetimes. Meanwhile tourism and small business, the lifeblood of our economy, suffers and fails.

In order to correct this condition structural reform is needed. The Public Lands Development Corporation is a new concept and vehicle that holds promise as being a possible solution. A study to determine possible advantages to a "public-private" partnership between DLNR and the PLDC warrants support. A task force or working group that includes members of the community would be an important step in helping to resolve this long standing problem.

I speak as an active East Hawaii community member and business owner in STRONG SUPPORT of HCR 163. It is long past time to be more proactive about the state of affairs at our own front door.

No matter how creative or talented the staff at DLNR is they can not partner properly to maintain these lands to the highest and best use for the people of Hawaii with the current laws, rules and regulations.

The Rotary Club of Hilo Bay of which I am a member used to meet in the Kilohana Room at the Naniloa Hotel. There is no better vantage point to appreciate the beauty of Banyan Drive. We the people of Hawaii are foolishly wasting this resource by not looking to do business differently along Banyan Drive.

Does that mean writing a smarter lease, selling the land in fee simple, trading to a different state agency, developing a public-private partnership? These are questions and ideas that have been tossed out on the railing, in hearings and certainly in our homes and gathering places on Hawaii island for quite some time.

Beyond Banyan Drive the State of Hawaii has a similar situation in the Kanoelehua Industrial Area where the leases are prohibiting appropriate and necessary improvements to be done. These businesses can not work under tried and true succession planning for their companies with the existing leases. It seems unrealistic for the state to stand on laws that retard the visitor industry, that stunt the economic possibilities of business, especially businesses who have contributed meaningful amounts of state income via tax payments.

The time has come to find a productive and protective answer to these questions and concerns. Please pass this resolution to conduct the necessary work to create the appropriate entity to develop and improve the leasehold lands of East Hawaii. The future of our island depends on it!

Thank you, Representative Chang for your continuing efforts to help revitalize an area of Hilo that once boasted a lively nightlife, fine dining, hula shows, concerts, a golf course, a driving range that stayed open at night. In my 25 years here on the Big Island, I have seen the area deteriorate to an embarrassment. An embarrassment that I would rather not show any visitors to the island. Queen Lililiuokalani Park and the Hilo Hawaiian are the sole bright spots in an otherwise dismal landscape on Banyan Drive.

The golf course is managed poorly, no club house (leaky building no one uses except for storage, no greens keepers, no aloha. Another example is a sand bunker on one of the most viewed greens in Hilo (#3 hole at the corner of Kamehameha and Lehiwai). It was filled with refuse material that included sand, rocks, pieces of bricks, The fill was in a mini "mountain" design and for the past 10 months it has taken wind, rain, wind, rain, to its present state of a "mound". Not one rake or shovel has ever touched it. The parking lot which is shared with the Naniloa is more rock strewn, weed lot, than parking lot.

The driving range closes at 4:30pm. Several entrepreneurs have express interest in running it, sprucing it up and make it a activity center for visitors and locals alike. To no avail.
