The Office of Hawaiian Affairs (OHA) offers the following comments on HR128 HD1/HCR166 HD1, which request the Department of Education and Board of Education to formally codify the establishment of the 'Aha Kauleo Kaiapuni Hawai'i in state law or administrative rules. The resolutions also urge the department and board to implement the recommendations of the 'Aha Kauleo.

The OHA Administration will recommend that our Board of Trustees support these resolutions with amendments. We note that the initial drafts of these resolutions also addressed the challenges the Hawaiian Language Immersion Program is facing regarding the translated Hawai'i State Assessment. While the HD1 versions of these resolutions now focus on the formal establishment of the 'Aha Kauleo, a number of clauses in the resolutions still refer to the translated assessment issues. Therefore, we ask that the resolutions be amended by deleting lines 17 through 27 on page 1; and lines 1-21 and lines 35-41 on page 2.

We appreciate that the DOE has reconvened the 'Aha Kauleo, and we hope that the DOE will now formally establish this critical advisory body in statute or administrative rules to ensure that the DOE continues to receive direct advice from Hawaiian language immersion stakeholders and experts.
