Chair Ige, Chair Oshiro and members of the committees, thank you for this opportunity to testify on our Department of Defense's Fiscal Year 2012 – 2013 Supplemental Budget request.

At the conclusion of my statement, Mr. Ronald Han will provide testimony on the Services to Veterans program and Mr. Rick Campbell will follow with testimony on the Hawaii National Guard Youth Challenge Academy program.

Before I start with our Department Fiscal Year 2012-2013
Supplemental Budget request, I would like to express my
heartfelt appreciation to the Legislature for their great
support of Hawaii's military. Specifically:

- Making permanent the Interstate Compact on Educational Opportunity for Military Children.
- Gold Star Family plates for family members of soldiers who gave the ultimate sacrifice supporting America's "War on Terrorism"

 Use of electric guns by members of the National Guard when assisting civil authorities in disaster relief, civil defense or law enforcement functions.

The Department's fiscal Year 2012-2013 Supplemental Budget request centers on our commitment to Disaster Preparedness, Homeland Security, and the needs of our challenged youths and their families of our communities.

Our supplemental budget request in Program DEF 110,
Amelioration of Physical Disasters, totals \$109,467,629.00 for
Fiscal Year 2012-2013 of which 12 percent is State,
87 percent is Federal, and 1 percent other funds.

This is an increase in general funds of \$2,757,500 and an increase in federal funds of \$7,182,941 for a total of \$10,022,197. The general funds are required to match the \$7,182,941 of federal funds for repair and maintenance of Army National Guard facilities statewide.

The Department did submit 8 operating and personnel requests which consist of \$7,182,941 Federal, \$2,757,500 State and a reduction of \$11,440,808 in interdepartmental transfer authorization due to the loss of TANF funds. The Department also submitted CIP projects for the Army National Guard totaling \$9,900,000 of which \$3,350,000 is State Bond funds and \$6,550,000 is Federal funds. Additionally, the Department has secured construction projects from National Guard Bureau to support the F-22 Raptor aircraft totaling \$92,350,000 in federal funds. There is no requirement for State matching funds.

Mission Statement

The department's mission statement is to assist authorities in providing for the safety, welfare, and defense of the people of Hawaii. The department will maintain readiness to respond to the needs of the people in the event of disasters, either natural or human-caused; will administer policies and programs related to veterans and families and provide at-risk youth with opportunities to obtain their high school diplomas and become productive citizens.

Context

The Department of Defense operating budget is comprised of 16.6 percent General funds, 82.5 percent Federal funds and .9 percent of other funds. The 2011 Legislature and the collective bargaining agreements resulted in labor savings reduction of \$494,318 in personnel funds.

The impact of the reduction of the FY 2011 General fund operating budget base in the amount of \$215,763 resulted in \$647,289 (at 75%) federal funds being left on the table. These funds provide the department with the means to execute minor repair projects to maintain and improve the facilities of the Hawaii National Guard.

The result of the reduction of general funds was the inability for the Department to access all available Federal (non-general) funds that the Department was entitled to which could have infused funds into the State's economy. The lack of State resources again hampered the Department from bringing in more Federal (non-general) funds.

Alternative Considered

The Department took every opportunity to generate additional revenue for the State by placing 100% federally funded repair and maintenance projects on the priority listing, getting reimbursements from Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) updated to current status and aggressively seeking agreements with Federal agencies to secure federal grant funds.

In competition with other states for federal funds, the Department increased activities that improved the execution of projects and the development and completion of plans for new energy reducing projects. This resulted in the Department receiving addition plus up federal funds during the year.

Mission Statement

The Office of Veterans Services (OVS) is the principal state office responsible for the development and management of policies and programs concerning veterans and their family members, and to provide services related to these veterans and their family members.

Economic Impact of 5% Labor Savings and Redeployment of Forces

Overall, the services provided by the OVS have remained relatively constant, while the demand for these services has continuously increased. The Department of Veterans Affairs (VA) State Summaries for FY 10 reflected 117,254 veterans in Hawaii with over 40,000 active duty personnel. With the recent complete troop withdrawal from Iraq along with additional military missions slated for Hawaii, the expectation is that there will be a dramatic increase in case management services, queries from military members, veterans, and their families. We have incurred a case management backlog due to an increased demand for services, compounded by OVS vacancies and the 5% reduction due to labor savings.

OVS is aggressively pursuing the filling of two Counselor positions located at our Oahu and Maui offices. The filling of a permanent Cemetery Operations Assistant is in progress. A temporary staff member fills this position that assists the Operations Manager at the Hawaii State Veterans Cemetery in Kaneohe. Currently, OVS has a total of 5 volunteers who collectively put in approximately 290 hours a month (estimated to be 3,480 annually with a cost saving of about \$62,000) to help offset the workload in both the administrative services and cemetery functions.

OVS's monthly reports for last year indicated we saw a total of 51, 513 individuals. Our year-to-date total is 27,074, with over 3,000 additional contacts accomplished at the same time last year. The veteran's cemeteries statewide have also noted an increase in the number of World War II veterans and their wives who are passing and in need of burial services. We are also experiencing increased numbers of Korean War and early Vietnam War veterans requiring this service.

The United States has been at war since August 2, 1990. Thousands of Hawaii born and affiliated individuals have served during this twenty-one year period. Our Hawaii National Guard and Reserves have been activated numerous times and active duty military members stationed in Hawaii have served several tours in war related areas. The number of veterans was projected by the 2000 census to decrease, however, due to the Gulf Wars, the number of veterans is projected by the 2010 census to remain the same or increase. The OVS and VA are serving younger war veterans and a significant number of older (age 65 and older) veterans. Both of these groups are requiring care for physical and mental injuries suffered in the service of their country. All VA medical projections show that younger veterans are affected by post-traumatic stress disorder and traumatic brain injury while older veterans who served in

Vietnam suffer from Ischemic Heart disease, Adult onset diabetes, Parkinson's disease, and an array of cancers. All of these conditions are related to their military service. In addition to traumatic brain injuries, gunshot wounds and other combat injuries; our veterans suffer from motorcycle and automobile accidents, suicides, homelessness, and unemployment. Veterans need to know were to go for assistance as they are dealing with these and other problems. This is why outreach programs are important; nevertheless, having a staff to address these concerns when they come in to one of our offices for help is equally important.

Alternatives Considered

To meet budget restrictions, OVS decreased the frequency of publishing the Hawaii Veteran Newsletter, and added electronic delivery to reduce postage costs.

OVS established travel restrictions for our advisory board and instituted video conferencing so that monthly meetings remains the same while face-to-face meetings are reduced to semi-annually.

We have reduced purchasing quantities for needed items for the veteran's cemeteries including vaults (which decrease maintenance and lessen safety concerns), screened fill dirt, grounds keeping equipment and funds to contract for burials, as well as for administrative supplies, by utilizing our meager quantities on hand, ordering less quantity when needed, and recycling when applicable.

OVS has submitted grant applications for federal reimbursement to the State which is on the Veterans Affairs FY 2012 Priority List of Pending State and Tribal Government Cemetery Construction Grant Pre-Applications listed below:

- The above Federal grants are Capitol projects and cannot be used for general funded operational costs or for personnel expenses. However, these grants are a multiplier for the community as individuals are hired to work on the contracts.
- We have outsourced Hawaii State Veterans Cemetery (HSVC) burial functions to a contractor who opens the grave, lowers the casket or urn, and fills in grave with filtered soil using procedures established by OVS to assure minimum settling. Grass is reused to cover the gravesite. With costs, we will have difficulty this year in paying our contract costs for burial services, and rising soil purchases for HSVC, and vault purchases statewide.
- Although we have not eliminated any veteran program, we have drastically limited
 Neighbor Island travel, as well as Advisory Board travel due to lack of funding. We have
 great difficulty in providing funds for our specialized housing grant to totally disabled
 veterans seeking to make modifications to their home so that they can live there and not in
 a nursing home.
- One of the major roles of the OVS is to assure that individuals who are eligible for VA benefits and medical care receive these services. This relieves the state from providing services to these individuals. In Federal FY 2010, the VA spent \$384 million on veterans receiving compensation and Pensions, Education and Vocational Rehabilitation programs, and Medical care. The VA provided highly skilled, skilled, and unskilled jobs to over 586 residents of Hawaii. Having an Office of Veterans Services is good business for Hawaii and is in consonance with the 50 States and four territories that have similar offices or departments.

2012 State Legislature

Aloha Chairperson Ige and Chairperson Oshiro and members of the Senate Ways and Means Committee and the House Finance Committee thank you for the opportunity to testify on DEF 114 pertaining to the Hawaii National Guard Youth Challenge Academies. I am Rick Campbell, Director of the Kalaeloa and Kulani Youth Challenge Academies.

The Alliance for Excellent Education has stated that the United States has over 1million dropouts per year. Hawaii contributes about 6000 young people to that number. The mission of the Hawaii National Guard Youth Challenge Academy is to provide an opportunity for 16-18 year old "at risk" dropout youth to "learn the skills needed to be successful, responsible and productive citizens in the community while giving them an opportunity to earn a high school diploma." The academy focuses on lessons in character education, morals, values, life-coping skills and responsible citizenship.

YCA is requesting the Legislature approve an increase from \$16,000 per cadet to \$18,000. The last increase in our budget occurred in 2007 from \$14,000 to \$16,000. The personnel and operational costs of operating the two programs have risen greatly over the last few years. This addition will increase Hawaii's budget by \$800,000 of which \$600,000 will be Federal money and \$200,000 will come from the State. The total amount for the two Hawaii programs will increase from \$6.4 M to \$7.2M. The Federal share of the total will be \$5.4M and the State portion will be \$1.8M. On a per cadet basis the \$18,000 breaks down to \$13,500 Federal and \$4,500 State. This increase will help to cover housing, food, uniforms, boots, field trips, personnel, outer island travel if required and classroom hours to attain the high school diploma.

YCA has also requested \$300,000 to begin the plan and design phase to construct Cadet housing facilities at the old Keaukaha Military Reservation Armory (KMR). Part of the plan entails developing three 50 person billets, two for males and one for females. The DOD Engineering section has already conferred with the National Guard and established requirements for these buildings and has developed a tentative plan for a design.

In November 2009 YCA opened a second site at the former Kulani Correctional Facility. After two cycles, the Kulani YCA has had 113 cadets complete the Competency Based High School diploma program with 98 of them receiving HS diplomas. Over the last two cycles Kalaeloa YCA has had 187 complete the General Education Development program and 144 of them have received HS diplomas.

YCA has established partnerships throughout the State to benefit our graduates in both the residential and post-residential phases of the program. Some of these partnerships are the Hawaii Community College System, Hawaii USA Federal Credit Union, American Red Cross, KUPU program, Job Corps, Hyatt Regency Hotels, the State Trades Council, military recruitment programs and many local businesses. These partnerships help arrange placement for YCA graduates into higher education, vocational training, the work force and the military after they graduate from the Academy.

The Hawaii National Guard Youth Challenge Academy continues to work hard at improving their cost effectiveness by graduating more successful young people and operating more efficiently. Our success will be judged by the future success of our clients. Thank you for your continued support in helping to educate these young people that have not been able to complete their required course of studies in our public schools. This concludes my testimony if there are no questions.

Mission Statements

The Mission of the National Guard Youth Challenge Program is to intervene in and reclaim the lives of at-risk youth to produce program graduates with the values, skills, education and self-discipline necessary to succeed as adults.

The mission of the Hawaii National Guard Youth Challenge Academy is to provide an opportunity for 16-19 year old at risk youth to learn the skills needed to be successful, responsible and productive citizens in the community while giving them the opportunity to earn a high school diploma.

Vision Statements

The vision of the National Guard Youth Challenge Program is to be recognized as America's premier program for "at risk" youth.

The vision of the Hawaii National Guard Youth Challenge Academy is to provide the State of Hawaii with a progressive alternative school for at-risk youth that focuses on lessons in character education, morals, values, life-coping skills and responsible citizenship.

Economic Impact

The effect of current economic and fiscal conditions on the Hawaii National Guard Youth Challenge Academy continues to be on the Staff and Cadre of the program more than the program itself. The two year freeze on raises, the increase in the cost of health benefits and the supplemental time off days have made it very difficult to maintain our highest quality staff members. Most of the Cadre and Staff that resigned over the past two years cited the need to earn more in order to live in Hawaii. In spite of this, the Academy has been able to maintain the standards needed to complete the mission, which indicates the quality of the people that continue to work there.

The high cost of operation of the two Youth Challenge Programs is due to the fact that they are both 24/7 operations. Personnel and operational costs including food, clothing, and the health and safety of the Cadets continues to rise every year. The cost of operating a residential program is almost double that of a day school when you consider electricity, water, gasoline and transportation.

Alternatives Considered

An increase in 2009 of the Federal share of the cost of operating a Youth Challenge program from 60% to 75%, lowered the State share from 40% to 25%, and has decreased the States cost to operate YCA. This year YCA is requesting the Legislature approve an increase from \$16K to \$18K per Cadet. The total budget for the two Hawaii programs will increase from \$6.4 M to \$7.2M of which Federal money will be \$5.4M and the State share will be \$1.8M. The cost per Cadet for 5.5 months will be \$18,000 of which the Federal share is \$13,500 and Hawaii's share will be \$4,500. This cost includes housing, food, uniforms, boots, education, field trips and outer island travel if required. Comparatively, the cost per year for a student at a public school is over \$11,000. The increase in the per Cadet cost will triple the Federal revenue and will allow YCA to continue to increase the number of young people the programs can assist.

Present Status

YCA opened a second Academy site at the former Kulani Correctional Facility in November 2009. A partnership with the Department of Education through Hilo Community School for Adults (HCSA) has allowed the Kulani program to offer the Competency Based High School Diploma to youth that may not have the academic background to pass the General Education Development (GED) program. This will give YCA a broader scope to help more youngsters attain their high school diplomas. The first class at Kulani graduated 41 Cadets in June 2011 of which 36 or 87% received their High School diplomas. The second class at Kulani began in July 2011 and graduated 72 Cadets on December 23, 2011. Over 80% of the Cadets that completed the program received their High School diplomas,

The Kalaeloa Academy has been in partnership with Waipahu Community School for Adults for almost 18 years and has offered the GED as a means to a high school diploma. Over the last 6 years, 12 classes, the Kalaeloa program has had 1149 Cadets complete the program with 738 or 64% of them earning their high school diplomas. Class 35 which graduated in December graduated 102 Cadets of which 80% received their High School Diplomas. One of the Academy's goals is to work at increasing the number of graduates to 250 per year and to increase the number of high school diplomas awarded each year.

Class 33 and 34

Last year classes 33 and 34 at Kalaeloa had a total of 205 Cadets complete the program of which 64% or 131 Cadets passed the GED and received high school diplomas. Approximately 23 more will be retaking their tests in the near future and should attain their high school diplomas within the next 6 months. This will put the graduation rate of these two classes close to 75%.

The Youth Challenge Academy continues to work hard at improving our performance by graduating more successful young people and operating more efficiently. This performance will be judged by the future success of our clients, not just by the graduation percentage. YCA has pursued partnerships with organizations that will benefit the Cadets in both the residential and post-residential phases of the program. A few of these partnerships are the Hawaii Community College system, Hawaii USA Federal Credit Union, the American Red Cross, the KUPU program, Job Corps, Hyatt Regency hotels, The State Trades Council, military recruitment programs and many local businesses. These partnerships have helped arrange placement for YCA graduates into higher education, vocational training, work force and the military. The goal of the Youth Challenge Academy is to insure that the Cadets receive all the skills necessary to become productive members of society.

Future

The immediate priority is the continued development of the Kulani program and the improvement of operations at Barber's Point, Kalaeloa. The possibility of a move for the Hawaii Island Academy has been mentioned with many scenarios being discussed. The most prominent choice being mentioned is a move to the Keaukaha Military Reservation in Hilo. That will mean increased efforts to insure continued funding to operate both of the Youth Challenge Academies in order to assist the youth in need.

YCA has included a CIP request for FY 12 to build Cadet housing (billets) for 150 Cadets at KMR in Hilo. This will enable the program to make a move to KMR by 2014 to make way for the return of the Kulani facility to the Department of Public Safety as per the Governor's request. The estimated cost of this new construction is \$9M with an operational request of \$300K for bunk beds, desks, chairs and office furniture.

An ongoing dream has been to locate a new site for the Academy at Kalaeloa. At the present time the program is housed in WWII Navy billets, the classrooms are in a converted Fitness Center, there are 3 modular buildings for Platoon Classes and the security of the classroom area is questionable. With the dramatic increase in the number of people in and around Kalaeloa the Cadets are faced with way too many opportunities for negative interactions with the public and it has presented a greater Challenge for the Cadre and Staff to monitor the safety and well-being of the Cadets. Locating a suitable site with good security and safety is the first major task and the second is to encourage private donations through the Hawaii National Guard Youth Challenge Academy Foundation (501-c-3) and combine that with State funds to help with construction costs.

The final request is an idea for future support and funding (3 to 5 years down the road) for a Job Opportunities Training Program to be located in, at or near the KMR Youth Challenge Academy. This idea is a Pacific Area vocational/technical training school to certify Youth Challenge graduates in carpentry, masonry, welding, auto mechanics, body and fender repair, aquaponics, hydroponics, agriculture and many other endeavors would offer an in house method of placing the Cadets in training right after they graduate from the Academy. It could be funded through a combination of State, Federal, and private contributions. At the present time there is only one program like this and it is located at Gillis Long in Louisiana. The program in Hilo would give all of the Youth Challenge programs from the western states the opportunity to place their Cadets in a training facility with the Youth Challenge mission as a guide and job training as a means to assist the Cadets.

This completes the past, present and future of the Youth Challenge Academy. I would like to thank all of you for your continued support of the Youth Challenge Academies and I would be happy to answer your questions.

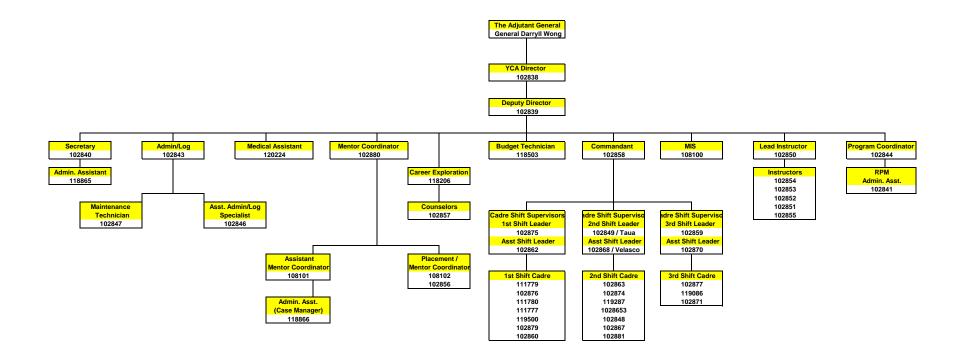

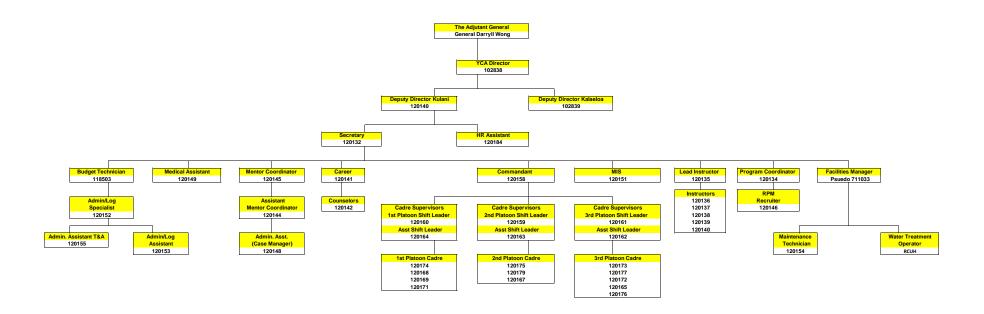
