The Board of Directors of the Hawaii State Bar Association appreciates the opportunity to comment on the qualifications of Paul B.K. Wong for the position of District Court Judge, First Circuit Court.

The HSBA Board has established criteria for determining the qualifications of judicial appointments generally utilizing the American Bar Association Guidelines for Reviewing Qualifications of Candidates for State Judicial Office. The HSBA uses the following criteria in its deliberations: integrity and diligence, legal knowledge and ability, professional experience, judicial temperament, financial responsibility, public service, health, and responsibilities and duties required of the position for which the applicant has been nominated. The HSBA Board's rating system includes the categories of "qualified" and "not qualified."

As part of its procedures for evaluating and taking positions on judicial appointments, the HSBA Board utilizes a subcommittee of the HSBA Board to review materials presented by the nominee and input from members. The subcommittee is also tasked with checking references and contacting others who have knowledge of the nominee's experience and qualifications. The full Board reviews the materials prepared by this subcommittee, the materials submitted by the nominee and members, and conducts an interview of the nominee.

Taking into consideration all of the information presented by and about the nominee and an interview with the nominee, the Board of Directors of the Hawaii State Bar Association finds Paul B.K. Wong to be qualified for the position of District Court Judge, First Circuit Court.

Good morning Chair Hee, Vice Chair Shimabukuro and members of the Committee on Judiciary And Labor. My name is Adriana Ramelli and I am the Executive Director of the Sex Abuse Treatment Center (SATC), a program of the Kapi'olani Medical Center for Women & Children (KMCWC), an affiliate of Hawai'i Pacific Health.

I am writing in support of Paul B.K. Wong, judicial nominee for District Court Judge of the First Circuit. The SATC first came to know Mr. Wong when he was a deputy prosecuting attorney, and then began to work closer with him since 2001 when he assumed the role of pro bono legal counsel for the Center.

The SATC seeks out Mr. Wong's guidance on a frequent basis. Over the years, he has assisted the Center with complex situations involving victim rights and this has sometimes necessitated mediating very sensitive issues. He has demonstrated the capacity to hear the concerns of differing parties, think through benefits and consequences for all involved, and present thoughtful compromises that have proven beneficial. Because he is not afraid to make decisions, and because of his ability to consider long range ramifications while weighing risk against benefit, the Center has been able to move forward on important issues, and secure the confidence of those in the community.

Mr. Wong is respectful in his judgment of others and is extremely fair in his decision making. While he shows compassion for victims of sexual assault, he is always the first to ensure that the SATC remains unbiased in the areas of forensic examinations and evidence collection. As much as he has guided the Center in protecting the rights of victims, he has taken action to ensure that the role of the forensic examiner is objective, and that fair, unbiased protocol is followed. He has demonstrated time and again, the ability to meet difficult situations head on with unflappable, professional

responses. Perhaps it is his absence of ego, or perhaps it is his certainty of who he is that has enabled him to maintain his professional composure and respond in a manner that effectively manages situations. He seems to have the sense of when to speak and when to remain silent, and this absence of need to prove himself enables him to be quite effective.

Mr. Wong's contributions to the SATC have been invaluable. While his appointment to the bench would mean a tremendous loss for the Center, Mr. Wong would seize the opportunity to serve the State of Hawai'i in the highest fashion and would utilize his strengths to truly impact the public in this very important role. He is held in high esteem by those of us who know him in the social service arena as he is honest, trustworthy, and a man of great integrity and character.

I cannot speak highly enough of him. Mr. Wong is an excellent candidate for District Court Judge of the First Circuit.
