Re: SB2098 - Relating to Privacy of Health Care Information.

Honorable Chair Hee, Vice Chair Shimabukuro, and Members of the Committee:

Hawai'i Health Information Exchange (Hawai'i HIE) strongly supports SB2098 – Relating to Privacy of Health Care Information, which is intended to harmonize the laws that govern the exchange of personal health data. We appreciate the opportunity to submit the following amended testimony.

Hawai'i HIE has had the privilege to work closely with representatives from the Office of the Governor, the Department of Health, the Department of Commerce and Consumer Affairs, the Attorney General's office, HMSA, the Hawai'i Association for Justice, and other health care stakeholders to ensure that SB2098 achieve the goal of enabling the safe and secure exchange of personal health information. These most recent discussions have resulted in amendments to SB2098 in the form of an SD1.

We appreciate the support of this bill and its intent and agree that consistency and clarity throughout the bill is of the utmost importance. In order to accomplish the desired goal of harmonizing existing laws, so that entities governed by HIPAA do not need to comply with conflicting state and federal procedures, we respectfully submit an SD1 that includes the following amendments:

- Added examples in the preamble (Section 1) of types of laws affected by SB2098 (including, but not limited to, mental health, developmental disabilities, and HIV/ARC/AIDS);
- Deleted reference in the preamble (Section 1) that limits the bill's effect to only those laws enacted prior to HIPAA, as the laws being affected both pre-date and post-date HIPAA;
- Added a new provision, regarding the relationship to other laws (updated Section 2, 4(6)), clarifying that any evidentiary privileges, discovery limitations, and protections for health information in judicial and administrative proceedings will not be affected by the bill;
- Eliminated potential inconsistency by retaining original terms (Section 2, 3(c)) harmonizing state
 notice of breach procedures with HIPAA and deleting a limitation preserving notice of breach
 procedures (original Section 2, 4(6)); and
- Made minor revisions for clarification and to conform the terms of the House and Senate versions
 of the bill.

Hawai'i HIE understands the needs of the health care community to be able to safely and securely share personal health information in order to provide the most effective and efficient care to Hawai'i's patients. For the aforementioned reasons, Hawai'i HIE strongly supports SB2098 with the amendments included in SD1.
