- EOA's Position: The Executive Office on Aging (EOA) supports the intent of this measure,
- 2 provided that its enactment does not reduce or replace priorities within our Supplemental Budget
- 3 Request. EOA also suggests an amendment.
- 4 Fiscal Implications: This measure appropriates unspecified amounts for:
- 5 1. The Kupuna Care Program;
- 6 2. The Healthy Aging Partnership Program;
- 7 3. Catholic Charities for the Lanakila Multi-purpose Senior Center, Moiliili Community
- 8 Center for the Moiliili Senior Center, and Waikiki Community Center; and
- 4. A wanderer's registry to protect individuals with Alzheimer's Disease and related
- 10 dementia.
- 11 Purpose and Justification: The Kupuna Care Program has been providing essential services for
- Hawaii's seniors since 1999, and is Hawaii's only state-funded home- and community-based
- services program for older adults who do not qualify for other government or private assistance.

- 1 Although highly successful, the Kupuna Care program has always been considered a
- 2 demonstration project, and therefore, administrative rules have never been established.
- 3 EOA would like to develop administrative rules for Kupuna Care, but we are unable to do
- 4 so until the program is established within EOA's statutes and the Director of EOA is given the
- 5 authority to adopt rules. Therefore, we are in support of Section 3 which statutorily establishes the
- 6 Kupuna Care Program within EOA. However, we respectfully request the following amendments:

Testimony Supporting S.B.#2320, SD2: "Relating to Aging"

This is a testimony in support of S.B. #2320, SD2, which statutorily establishes the Kupuna Care program, and provides funding support for the healthy aging partnership programs (Better Choices, Better Health and Enhance Fitness), Alzheimer's registry, and senior centers. This bill builds and strengthens a statewide system of support for Hawaii's older adults and their family caregivers. The need is clear and compelling. There are about 238,000 Hawaii residents aged 60 years and over who constitute 18.7% of

the state's total population. Between 2000 and 2030, the number of adults 60 years and older will increase by 93.8% and those 85 years and older will increase by 174.7%. The explosive growth of older adults alerts us that a strong infrastructure must be in place to serve their growing needs especially as the baby boomers join this age group.

Critical components of Hawaii's aging infrastructure are being addressed by the programs in this bill: access to information; affordable home and community based services including respite care for family caregivers; social and civic engagements for retired seniors; keeping people with Alzheimer's and dementia related diseases safe; and promoting healthy aging through the Healthy Aging Partnership program. The Healthy Aging Partnership is a major initiative which offers a successful evidence-based chronic disease self-management program - Better Choices, Better Health – Ke Ola Pono. This program is available statewide to empower people with chronic diseases to take control of their health and better manage their health conditions.

Better Choices, Better Health – Ke Ola Pono, is a weekly, six-week sessions which cover topics ranging from healthy eating and exercise, pain and stress management, appropriate use of medication and other practical tips and easy to use tools to help people live a healthy lifestyle. This program has demonstrated to be effective in helping people adopt healthy behaviors, improve their overall health, and reduce hospitalizations and emergency room visits. Significant data reports - 39% fewer falls; 19% decrease in hospitalizations; and 25% decrease in experiencing symptoms such as pain, fatigue and shortness of breath and 31% increase in the number of days spent in physical activities per week. These health improvements translate to health care cost savings especially for Medicare and Medicaid. Effectively controlling debilitating and chronic conditions can reduce the cost of medications, hospitalizations, frequent physician visits while improving people's quality of life and independence.

The Hawai'i County Office of Aging supports legislation that will appropriate funds for the Healthy Aging Partnership along with other vital components of Hawaii's aging infrastructure.

Supporting SB 2320 SD 2: Relating to Aging

The Healthcare Association of Hawaii advocates for its member organizations that span the entire spectrum of health care, including all acute care hospitals, as well as long term care facilities, home care agencies, and hospices. In addition to providing quality care to all of Hawaii's residents, our members contribute significantly to Hawaii's economy by employing over 40,000 people. Thank you for this opportunity to testify in support of SB 2320 SD 2, which statutorily establishes the Kupuna Care Program and appropriates funds for it and other programs that provide care to the elderly.

This bill is one of many that are designed to strengthen the infrastructure that cares for the elderly or reduces elder abuse. Hawaii's elderly population is growing faster than even the national average. Since statehood, the proportion of elderly to Hawaii's total population has increased three-fold, from roughly 5% in 1960 to 15% in 2009. By comparison, the nation's population stands at 13%. Between 1990 and 2009, the number of elderly aged 75 and older increased 115% in Hawaii compared to 44% nationally. By 2030, the elderly population will represent 20% of the population in Hawaii.

There is a clear relationship between age and the prevalence of chronic conditions and level of disability, so the elderly are the heaviest users of health care resources. Hawaii's existing resources are not sufficient to satisfy the current high demand for care for the elderly, which is increasing further as the population ages.

A related issue is elder abuse. As elders become more physically frail, they are less able to stand up to bullying and/or to fight back if attacked. They may not see or hear as well or think as clearly as they used to, leaving openings for unscrupulous people to take advantage of them. A stronger infrastructure that cares for the elderly will reduce elder abuse.

Good afternoon, Chair Yamane & Chair Mizuno, Vice Chair Morikawa and Vice Chair Jordan, and Members of the House Health & Human Services Committees,

Lanakila Pacific strongly supports SB 2320 Relating to Aging to provide critically needed services for our most vulnerable seniors. This Measure appropriates essential funding for Kupuna Care services and supports preventative services including the Healthy Aging Partnership program, senior centers, and elder registration services.

As a Kupuna Care service provider, Lanakila Meals on Wheels, a program of Lanakila Pacific, serves more than 250,000 meals for seniors each year. Our staff and volunteers deliver more than a nutritious meal, as they may be the only person that the senior will spend time with each day. Our average meal recipient is a woman of Asian or Pacific Island descent, 83 years old with an income of less than \$1,000 per month.

As a Kupuna Care program, we also provide nutritional education and counseling, monitor health and welfare, and serve as an important bridge to support services, helping seniors remain in their homes rather than more costly premature institutionalization.

Unfortunately, the Kupuna Care appropriation in the base budget has remained flat at \$4.8 million since 2002, despite our rapidly aging population's even more urgent need for these critical services. Because of this, Kupuna Care programs including Lanakila Meals on Wheels are faced with heartbreaking waiting lists.

Lanakila Meals on Wheels alone is already facing a waiting list of over 250 seniors that will continue to grow. Seniors like 93 year old Mr. R who was diagnosed with terminal cancer two years ago. He ever imagined needing assistance and wants to stay in his own home for as long as he can. The services of Kupuna Care will enable Mr. R to continue to live in his own home at a fraction of the cost of a nursing home.

According to the most recent Hawaii's Older Adults: Demographic Profile: University of Hawaii, Hawaii has one of the fastest growing senior populations and the longest life expectancy in the nation. By the year 2020, one out of every four people in Hawaii will be 60 years and older.

Providing Kupuna Care Sevices, which enables seniors to stay in their homes and avoid costly institutionalization, can be the difference between \$170 for a month of home delivered meals vs. \$9,034 for a month of a semi-private room in a nursing facility.

The passage of this Measure is vital as it will provide critically needed and more costeffective services for the most isolated and vulnerable seniors in Hawaii. Aging network providers cannot meet the current and growing demand for services when faced by years of flat or reduced State and Federal funding.

We urge you to support seniors by supporting full funding for SB 2320 as it funds safety net programs that support the most isolated and vulnerable seniors in Hawaii.

My name is Michael Lee, Interim Executive Director of Waikiki Community Center (WCC).

Walkiki Community Center (WCC) is a nonprofit 501(c)(3) agency which has provided services to Walkiki's elders since 1978 and currently serves over 500 older persons each year. Our Senior Program provides vital fitness, cognitive stimulation, social connectivity, education and case management that enable hundreds of older adults to maintain wellness and age in place, for as long as it is possible.

Waikiki Community Center is a community-based focal point for seniors to receive needed services and activities that support their independence and avoid pre-mature institutionalization, thereby saving the State of Hawaii over \$100,000 per person annually in long-term care costs. The Center provides a continuum of over 80 educational, recreational and social services, including health screenings, financial education, physical fitness classes, information and assistance, counseling and case management by a licensed social worker, that helps seniors not only maintain their independence and health, but also assists them as they transition through life changes.

WCC utilizes a preventative health, community-based model for services to older adults, with a focus on 3 major areas that national research documents as imperative to maintaining the ability to age in place:

- physical activity;
- new learning or cognitive stimulation; and
- social connections

The importance of this 3-pronged approach is based on the following evidence: The Bureau of Labor and Statistics states that only 2% of adults aged 75 and older are involved in exercise or recreational activity. Fifty-four (54%) percent spent their time watching TV. It is well-established that physical activity has a positive effect on health, leading to better mental health and cognitive functioning. Exercise also reduces the risk of dementia by 50%, even among people who begin exercise after age 60.

According to research at the Rush Alzheimer's Disease Center, "Loneliness and Risk of Alzheimer's Disease", loneliness has a negative impact on cognitive health and increases the risk of dementia. Elders with higher loneliness scores may be twice as likely to develop dementia. In a study of 7 senior centers in 7 states, over 90% of seniors indicate that they have developed important close friendships at the senior center that provide them with needed emotional security.

For the elders of Waikiki, this is especially important. Approximately 25% of Waikiki's 20,000 residents are over the age of 60 years old. Waikiki has one of the highest numbers of senior citizens per area density on Oahu. Waikiki elders live alone among a proliferation of secured, mixed residential condominiums, and are especially at risk to social isolation and physical and cognitive deterioration. The typical elderly resident is female, mid 70's, living alone, with little or no family support systems nearby. When they become frailer, they have little choices of independent living and are often confused by services available to support them. Waikiki Community Center's continuum of services, ranging from health maintenance activities to case management and counseling provide the needed support to these elders.

Waikiki Community Center submitted a Grant-in-Aid request to support our senior services for 2012-2013 in the amount of \$60,000.

While we understand the great financial challenges faced by the State of Hawai'i during this time, Waikiki Community Center is in jeopardy of discontinuing its services to seniors in the community. We have already reduced some services to our seniors, furloughed program staff in order to keep the program operations available to the community, and will likely terminate case management and counseling services for older adults if funds are not released.

Comments:

My name is Anthony Lenzer. I am testifying today on the behalf of Kokua Council, Hawaii's oldest senior advocacy organization. Kokua Council strongly supports Senate bill 2320. This bill will establish a support a network of critical services for Hawaii's older adults. These include the Kupuna Care program, the Healthy Aging Partnership, senior centers, and a wanderer's registry. The bill also incorporates the Kupuna Care program by statute into the executive office on aging, so that it will be a permanent part of Hawaii's framework of senior services.

Kupuna Care provides in-home services for frail older adults. Those served have incomes above the level that would allow them to apply for Medicaid but insufficient income to fully cover the costs of private services out of pocket. By helping recipients remain at home, several things are accomplished. First, they are receiving care at a familiar and comfortable setting. Second, by maintaining their health via home care many will avoid the need to apply for Medicaid, thereby saving the state money. Third, service providers' jobs represent a necessary and growing part of the state's economic future. They receive income, buy goods and services, and pay taxes.

The Healthy Aging Program has two main components, with an overall goal of helping older people learn how to maintain and improve their own health. This is accomplished through a variety of classes and demonstrations on chronic disease management, exercise, and health maintenance. This program has been evaluated by University of Hawaii researchers, and the results are well documented. Participants have fewer doctor visits, fewer emergency room visits, fewer falls, and in other ways show evidence of better health. These results indicate direct savings of Medicare and Medicaid dollars as well as prospective future savings. Healthy Aging Programs are carried out via partnerships with many different organizations throughout the state.

Seniors centers provide socialization, classes, nutrition services, and many other benefits to the older people who participate in the center programs. Senior centers have long been a critical part of Hawaii's aging network.

Finally, the wanderers registry included in this bill will allow information about people with Alzheimer's disease and other dementias to be collected in a single location. Information will be available to family members and to others who may be involved in attempting to locate individuals who have wandered from their place of residence.

All of the above programs are critical to meeting the needs of Hawaii's older citizens. We urge your support for this bill. Thank you for the opportunity to testify.

AARP is a membership organization of people 50 and older with nearly 150,000 members in Hawaii. We are committed to championing access to affordable, quality health care for all generations, providing the tools needed to save for retirement, and serving as a reliable information source on issues critical to Americans age 50+.

AARP **strongly supports** SB2320 SD2. This bill statutorily establishes the Kupuna Care program; appropriates funds for Kupuna Care; healthy aging partnership program, senior centers, and elder registration services. AARP 's especially supports the funding for the Kupuna Care program, and offers the following comments on the Kupuna Care program.

This bill appropriates funds out of the general revenues of the State of Hawaii for fiscal year 2012-2013 for the Kupuna Care program. This appropriation is in addition to the current \$4.85 million Executive Office on Aging base budget appropriation that has remained unchanged since 2002, even though demand for services has increased as a result of our rapidly aging population.

In 2011, the Kupuna Care program served 4,836 persons statewide, at a cost of \$103 per month, per person. The Executive Office on Aging has estimated that an additional \$4.2 million appropriation could serve up to an additional 3,398 persons depending on the level of impairment.

Seniors and caregivers need assurances that they will continue receiving occasional, yet critical respite services that enables them to live in their homes as long as possible.

The passage of this bill is vital to support the increasing demand for service from our rapidly aging population:

- Approximately one out of every five (20%) Hawaii residents are over 60 years old.
- Hawaii's population over age 65 is increasing rapidly and projected to increase by 71% between 2010 and 2030.
- Approximately 247,000 family caregivers are the backbone of Hawaii's long-term care system and currently provide nearly \$2 billion a year of unpaid caregiving services.
- The number of family caregivers is declining. The primary family caregiver group is 50-64 years old. This group will decline by 10% by 2030, and cause further strain on seniors and remaining caregivers.

The Hawaii Alliance for Retired Americans (HARA) strongly supports S.B. 2320, SD2, which statutorily establishes the Kupuna Care program and appropriates funds for the Kupuna Care program, the Healthy Aging Partnership program, certain senior centers, and a wanderers' elder registration services.

HARA is a coalition of 10 affiliated organizations: AFT Hawaii Retirees, HGEA Retirees, HSTA-Retired, ILWU Retirees, Kokua Council, Machinists Union Retirees, UPW Retirees, ADA/Hawaii, Hawaii Family Caregivers Coalition, and Kupuna Education Center. Membership in our affiliates total more than 19,000 individuals who support quality programs and services for seniors.

All the programs proposed for appropriation provide invaluable service to the elderly and their caregivers and allow the elderly to continue to live in the community and in their own homes. Many seniors are able to live independently because of Kupuna Care, which provides chore services, meals on wheels and the like, and the Healthy Aging Partnership, which helps seniors with exercise and disease management programs. The senior centers at Lanakila Multi-Purpose Center, Moiliili Community Center and Waikiki Community Center allow seniors to interact with others and give meaning to their lives. The wanderers' registration service is proposed as a new service that will help to provide caregivers peace of mind.

These programs fill a growing need in our communities as more individuals grow older and are less able to manage their daily activities entirely on their own. With the limited funds provided, public and private agencies are able to help seniors remain in their own homes, avoid costly institutionalization, and improve the quality of their lives. Without these services, there is no telling how many more individuals would need nursing home care that likely would increase the State's Medicaid burden. The appropriations called for in S.B. 2320, SD2 would indeed be a wise use of taxpayers' dollars.

We are especially grateful that the Senate considered establishing the Kupuna Care program in the statutes. We believe this will provide for more stable funding to the program and assure more and better services to seniors needing support.

In particular, it will allow the continuation of services that were maintained or increased through Act 191, Emergency and Budget Reserve funding. This funding ends in June 2012. Without additional funds through SB 2320, SD2, there will be significant reductions in services provided to our Kupuna, particularly through senior centers and Kupuna Care:

SENIOR CENTERS

SB 2320, SD2, supports a network of senior centers on Oahu that provide vital health education and screenings, fitness, recreation, case management, and other services to enable thousands of senior citizens to maintain wellness, support independence and avoid costly institutionalization and have a history of state funding.

Catholic Charities Hawaii has operated the Lanakila Multi-Purpose Senior Center since 1981. Lanakila Multi-Purpose Senior Center is a State owned facility that was built as a model senior center for the State of Hawaii in 1969. The Center provides a range of educational, recreational and social services that include:

- Exercise and Educational activities, such as Stretch & Tone and Basic English.
- Recreational courses, such as Ukulele and Sewing.
- Sponsorship of 7 ethnic clubs that perpetuate ethnic traditions and promote cultural sharing.
- Health promotion and screening activities, such as monthly blood pressure checks, health fairs, and more.
- Special events for education and recreation purposes, such as Candidates' Fair.

By contract, it serves seniors living in the geographic area bounded by census tracts 38-66 (Kakaako - Nuuanu/Punchbowl – Downtown - Liliha/Kapalama - Kalihi/Palama - Kalihi Valley - Moanalua). Its priority is to serve those in greatest economic and social need, with an emphasis on serving low-income, minority elders. Seniors who live outside the contracted geographic area and lack access to comparable services due to language, etc. are also served.

Testimony of Audrey Suga-Nakagawa

This is a testimony in support of S.B. # 2320 – Relating to Aging which provides funding for Kupuna Care, Aging and Disability Resource Center, Healthy Aging Partnership that includes Better Choices, Better Health and Enhance Fitness workshops, Alzheimer's registry, and seniors centers. This bill builds and strengthens a statewide system of support for Hawaii's older adults and their family caregivers. The need is clear and compelling. There are about 238,000 Hawaii residents aged 60 years and over who constitute 18.7% of the state's total population. Between 2000 and 2030, the number of adults 60 years and older will increase by 93.8% and those 85 years and older will increase by 174.7%. The explosive growth of older adults alerts us that a strong infrastructure must be in place to serve their growing needs especially as the baby boomers join this age group.

Critical components of Hawaii's aging infrastructure are being addressed by the programs in this bill:

1)access to information; 2)affordable home and community based services including respite care for family caregivers; 3) social and civic engagements for retired seniors; 4) keeping people with Alzheimer's and dementia related diseases safe; and 5) promoting healthy aging through the Healthy Aging Partnership program. The Healthy Aging Partnership is a major initiative which offers two widely used evidence-based health promotion programs - Better Choices, Better Health and EnhanceFitness. These programs are available throughout the state to empower people with chronic diseases take control of their health and better manage their health conditions. Better Choices, Better Health is a weekly, sixweek sessions which cover topics ranging from healthy eating and exercise, pain and stress management, appropriate use of medication and other practical tips and easy to use tools to help people live a healthy lifestyle.

EnhanceFitness is a group exercise program which helps elders become more active, energized and empowered to sustain independent lives through structured exercise sessions of stretching, low impact aerobics and strength training. The one hour classes are offered three times a week and led by certified fitness instructors who are trained in EnhanceFitness. Both programs have demonstrated to be effective in helping people adopt healthy behaviors, improve their overall health, and reduce hospitalizations and emergency room visits. For example, Hawaii data showed- 39% fewer falls; 19%

decrease in hospitalizations; and 25% decrease in experiencing symptoms such as pain, fatigue and shortness of breath and 31% increase in the number of days spent in physical activities per week. These health improvements translate to health care cost savings especially for Medicare and Medicaid. Effective management of debilitating and chronic conditions can reduce the cost of medications, hospitalizations, frequent physician visits while improving people's quality of life and independence.

My name is Lehua Lopez-Mau and I am a 63-year-old widow, born and raised in Honolulu, with no children; I now work in Ka`u and I live alone in Waiohinu. This is my personal testimony:

Funding a statewide system of support for people like me and family caregivers is probably one of the most important pieces of legislation facing your committee today. This support system is extremely important to me and to all of us kupuna here in Ka`u. Across the state, there are thousands of us women who are widowed, low-income, and living alone in our 60's, 70's, and 80's. While we have family and friends who are willing to help, many of us are very, very worried about our future and about our ability to take care of ourselves and NOT be a burden to our family and friends.

Last year, I volunteered to learn how to be a Lay Leader in Hawai'i County's Office of Aging, Better Choices/Better Health program. I entered the program so I could learn how to take better care of myself as well as to volunteer some kokua back to my community as a Lay Leader. The methods and techniques I learned about managing my own health are priceless to me. I continue to practice what I was taught and I now teach others these same methods and techniques. The program has definitely made my life, AND my health, better. It is imperative that kupuna programs like Better Choices/Better Health continue, as the services they provide are real lifelines to all of us, especially in rural communities like Ka'u.

As we age in our homes, it will be a huge relief to us to be able to have affordable and quality home and community-based care that takes into account our health, housing, and nutrition needs. At some point in my own future, I anticipate the day when I will need to call someone in government for some kokua. Being able to call our local Office on Aging and get help from the Healthy Aging Partnership program will be very important

to me because it will mean that I can call someone on my own island who I trust and who knows how to help me. As I get older, the last thing I want to do is to leave my home and go into a state long-term care hospital. Home-based and community-based services, including daily events and activities, fitness and health programs, and social services can greatly increase my capacity to stay home longer. And as a kupuna, that's exactly what I want and need.

I know that our state and county are dealing with hard economic challenges. However, it has ALWAYS been our choice as a local community and state-wide society to malama, take care, of our children, our sick, and our elderly. Please vote to support S.B. 2320 S.D. 2.

Testimony of Timothy C. Hansen

I have worked for over 3 years as a Program Director of an elderly services program in Hawaii County. My program does not receive Kupuna Care Funds but I see the positive impact of this important funding everyday in the lives of the seniors I work with. I present this testimony as a private citizen and not as a representative of the program I work for. I have witnessed firsthand over and over again how the Kupuna Care Fund has helped to keep seniors independent and in their homes, delaying dehumanizing and costly institutionalization. Imagine the savings if only 1 senior is able to maintain long-term independent living instead of being placed in a care home at a cost of \$3,000 a month or in a nursing care facility at a cost of \$12,000 a month. Even delaying this transition for a few months can be a huge cost savings.

Imagine also what it must be like to get to that point in life when living independently becomes more and more difficult. Just like you and me, many know that eventually they will have to give up driving and then perhaps have to begin sacrificing more and more of their privacy and independence as outside helpers begin coming into their homes to do the things they can no longer do on their own. But even this loss of independence, many agree, is better than having to "be put away" into a care home or nursing home.

Many seniors can maintain their independence longer with needed in-home and community based services such as light housekeeping, laundry, meal preparation and transportation services. The invaluable services of senior centers and adult day care can also provide needed social interactions and much needed respite for family caregivers. Others might need a higher level of case management that includes financial and medication management and increased personal care such as bathing and dressing. Funding such supportive services in the community that assists seniors in staying safe and independent in their homes or with caring family members makes not only good moral sense, it also makes good financial sense.

I strongly encourage you to support Kupuna Care Funding. Make sure these invaluable services are available in our community. I know I will probably need them someday, and there is always a chance you or someone you love will also need them.
