**PURPOSE**: The purpose of this bill is to appropriate funds for the Vocational Rehabilitation and Services for the Blind Division of the Department of Human Services to contract for a telephone-based service to provide access to timely print media.

**DEPARTMENT'S POSITION:** The Department of Human Services (DHS) supports S.B. 2435. We ask that if this appropriation is approved that it does not replace or adversely impact priorities indicated in the Executive Supplemental Budget.

It is essential for our clients who are print disabled to have access to the Newsline service. Print disabled clients include, but are not limited to, clients who have blindness and visual impairments; dyslexia; or have learning disabilities. The Newsline service allows

these clients to have access to real-time information such as job listings, local and national media information, postings of our public hearings that solicit commentary on our state plans and many other types of information necessary for our clients to live independently.

Access to the Newsline service is already available for persons on Oahu. This appropriation will provide access for residents on the Neighbor Islands.
