TESTIMONY ON SENATE BILL NO. 657, S.D. 1, H.D. 1, RELATING TO CHIROPRACTIC.

TO THE HONORABLE ROBERT N. HERKES, CHAIR, AND MEMBERS OF THE COMMITTEE:

My name is Lynn Bhanot and I am the Executive Officer for the Board of Chiropractic Examiners ("Board").

The Board appreciates the opportunity to present testimony in support of Senate Bill No. 657, S.D. 1, H.D. 1. with the following amendments:

- 1. Delete "neuroskeletal" on page 3, line 4 and replace with "diagnostic".
- 2. Delete "Section 3" on page 4, lines 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, and 6. Hawaii Administrative Rules, Title 16, Chapter 76, Section 26 addresses the minimal acceptable competencies necessary to the practice of chiropractic. Therefore, the proposed language to define the scope of chiropractic is addressed in the Hawaii Administrative Rules.
- Change the effective date in Section 6 on page 4, line 12, from "on July 1,
 2050" to "upon its approval".

Dear Rep. Herkes and Committee Members:

I am writing in support of SB 657.

SB 657 serves to update the existing language of the current version of HRS Chapter 442 to ensure that all chiropractors licensed in Hawaii practice up to the standards that are presently being taught in accredited chiropractic colleges across the country. This bill will bring Hawaii practitioners up to date and will assure that licensees are able to keep up with current and evolving methods in the future.

Hawaii's chiropractic laws have lagged behind most of the nation. Today's chiropractors are trained to diagnose and treat the entire body, serving as primary care physicians. We are trained to use natural methods of treatment whenever possible, and to know when to refer to other physicians for surgical, medical or other specialized forms of care.

Our present law restricts doctors of chiropractic from providing the best and most cost effective care to Hawaii's people. The public deserves to be able to receive the full range of alternative care which chiropractors are trained to provide. This bill will help ensure the ongoing protection of the health, safety and welfare of the people of the State of Hawaii.

To make this measure practical, I request that you restore this bill to the form it had on crossover from the senate, without reference to ACA and to take effect upon signing.

Chairs & Committee Members:

The HMA would like of offer comments on this bill. We would ask that the scope of this bill be limited to treatment of musculoskeletal disorders. We are grateful to the legislature for making amendments that have shown a desire to follow this premise. The HMA feels that this issue may be more clearly addressed with this proposed change to the bill:

Section 1

(3) Use or order laboratory testing <u>for</u>

<u>diagnosis and treatment of musculoskeletal</u>

<u>disorders;</u> and

OFFICERS

The biggest potential public safety issue is the ordering of a spinal MRI by a chiropractor for a radiculopathy. If that study confirms compromise of a spinal nerve root, or spinal cord, a chiropractor might be convinced to continue a prolonged course of manipulation while referral to a neurosurgeon for indicated surgery might be delayed, leading to permanent injury.

There is a reasonable fear that this will increase the ordering of expensive and unnecessary tests, thus further increasing the cost of health insurance. This is something no one wants to see happen.

Since chiropractors will be ordering diagnostic tests read by MDs and DOs (radiologists, nuclear medicine physicians, clinical pathologists), the Hawaii Medical Board should have a role in determining appropriate scope, not just the Chiropractic Board.

The HMA opposes inserting "chiropractic physician" as a legal title and the deletion of use of "physician" as a violation. We are grateful for this amendment in the last two committees.

My name is Dr. Joseph G. Morelli, Jr., and I am a Doctor of Chiropractic in Hawaii, practicing here for the past 33 years. I currently hold the elected office as the District 7 Governor on the Board of Governors of the American Chiropractic Association. I represent the local Hawaii Doctors of Chiropractic and also represent all the Doctors of Chiropractic in California, Nevada, Guam, American Samoa and the Mariana Islands. The American Chiropractic Association is the largest Chiropractic professional representative organization in the world. I give this as testimony to voice our strong support to the content and intent of SB 657, SD1 HD1. The proposed language in SB 657, SD1 HD1 updates and brings our practice act here in Hawaii to current Chiropractic healthcare standards. This aligns all Hawaii licensees with up to date health care research and the standards of practice as tested in the National Board of Chiropractic Examiners.

The language in SB 657, SD1 HD1 helps to insure that Doctors of Chiropractic in Hawaii have the opportunity to deliver the "state of the art" Chiropractic care that is current and the most efficacious, following the "best practices" as taught and researched in recognized health care centers of higher learning today.

The Chiropractic Practice Act that SB 657, SD1 HD1 updates, currently has been interpreted over the years sometimes very narrowly, not taking into consideration the breadth and depth of our training and education. The proposed language of SB 657, SD1 HD1 is to dissolve these ambiguities and misinterpretations, giving deference to the latest medical/chiropractic research institutions and the discretion to our Hawaii Board of Examiners that has been requested for many years by the State of Hawaii conforming all our state licensing boards.

However, SB 657, SD1 HD1 has some technical inaccuracies that need to be addressed: As a representative of the ACA, I respectfully request that the language in Sections 3(a) and 3(b) be SB 657, SD1 HD1 be removed regarding references to the American Chiropractic Association. The ACA is not the federally chartered official certification body regarding Chiropractic educational standards and licensing.

Support of SB 657, SD1 HD1, Relating To Chiropractic Page 2

The ACA, like the AMA is a professional membership association, not an accrediting body. The proper accrediting body is the Council on Chiropractic Education (CCE). This is the only federally recognized accreditation body for Chiropractic recognized by the US Department of Education. All of the doctoral degree granting Chiropractic institutions are required to be certified and accredited by the CCE in order for their graduates to be eligible to take the licensing boards and meet state licensing requirements in all 50 states and territories in the United States. The CCE's certification by the US Dept. of Education is reviewed every five years, and its curricula development standards and guidelines are updated regularly according to the latest scientific literature, clinical research, and surveys of the standards of care and practice throughout nation.

The ACA and its specialty councils and committees regularly offer advice and do contribute to the process and development of the CCE standards as they dynamically evolve. However, the ACA respectfully declines to be "required to work with the Board of Examiners to define the scope of practice of Chiropractic". As noted above the ACA is not the proper agent to create the scope definition. Additionally, the role of the Examining board is to interpret the licensing statute and related regulation as ambiguities and unique challenges arise. It is well beyond the purview of the state board of examiners to promulgate statute.

Regarding the imaging allowed to be ordered and interpreted by licensees: Chiropractic medical education under the CCE requires over 360 hours in radiology, and 400 hours in differential diagnosis. Doctors of Chiropractic are also trained in radiographic techniques, and are qualified to perform the imaging studies as well as read and make a diagnostic interpretation. SB 657, SDI HDI incorrectly sets this scope below the current standard of practice in Hawaii and across the country, as certified by our education and National Boards testing. Please restore the language of SB 657 SD1.

Please pass SB 657, SD1 HD1 from your committee for the sake of the Hawaii healthcare consumer, helping to insure that the Chiropractic care delivered in our islands is best that it can be.

Chair Herkes and members of the Committee:

My name is Dr. Gary Saito, DC, and I represent the Hawaii State Chiropractic Association as its President. Thank you for the opportunity to provide <u>testimony in support of SB 657 SD1 HD1</u>.

The intent of this bill is to update the Hawaii Scope of Chiropractic Practice. The current law is outdated and inadequately describes chiropractic as it is practiced today. We make the following recommendations on the HDI draft.

- 1. Sections 3(a) and 3(b) should be deleted because they incorrectly identify the American Chiropractic Association and the Hawaii Chiropractic Board as the entities responsible for defining the practice of chiropractic. In truth, the CCE (Council on Chiropractic Education) is the only body authorized by the US Department of Education to define the national practice standards by accrediting the chiropractic colleges. Both the DCCA and the Chiropractic Board have adopted and have been using the CCE standards for decades.
- 2. The HD1 changed the term "diagnostic imaging" to "neuroskeletal imaging" on page 3, line 4. "Neuroskeletal" is not an accurate description of the chiropractor's area of expertise and is not a term used to define a chiropractor's scope. The reason that "diagnostic imaging" is the correct term in this case is that chiropractors are educated and trained to review x-rays, MRI's, CT scans, and other images, not only to identify a chiropractic problem, but also to advise the patient when another problem is detected for which the patient should consult another medical professional. Chiropractic is a doctoral-level healthcare profession and, therefore, diagnosis is an important and necessary skill and responsibility.

3. We believe the effective date should be "upon approval" so that the scope of practice becomes immediately applicable and the Chiropractic Board and the DCCA can begin implementing it.

In short, if this committee can restore this bill to the SD1 version, there will be agreement all the way around. The Hawaii State Chiropractic Association is agreeable to the SD1 bill draft.

Thank you for your consideration of our recommendations. The chiropractic profession needs a scope of practice act that not only properly describes the profession, but also informs the public of what they can expect from chiropractic care. We urge you to make the changes we have proposed and to pass the bill out of committee effective upon approval.

Chair Herkes and Members of the House CPC Committee:

I am Ann Frost, P.T., President of HAPTA and member of HAPTA's Legislative Committee. HAPTA represents 250 physical therapists and physical therapist assistants employed in hospitals, nursing homes, the Armed Forces, the Department of Education and Department of Health (DOH) systems, and private clinics throughout our community. Physical therapists work with everyone, from infants to the elderly, to restore and improve function and quality of life. We are part of the spectrum of care for Hawaii, and provide rehabilitative services for infants and children, youth, adults and the elderly. Rehabilitative services are a vital part of restoring optimum function from neuromusculoskeletal injuries and impairments.

HAPTA opposes SB 657hd1 as written because of the broadly written scope of practice, which allows for skills learned from any one program to be practiced without national standards applied to the whole profession. Please reference page 2, lines 16-20: "...The scope of practice of chiropractic shall include those diagnostic and treatment services and procedures that are taught by accredited chiropractic colleges and are approved by the board in accordance with this chapter..." Broadly based language such as this does nothing to protect the consumer, given the variety of services and procedures which are presented in different schools of chiropractic. We suggest that scope of practice be much more clearly defined, as it is in other professions' practice acts and legislation.

Also, the use of "physiotherapeutic", page 2, line 8, is misleading to consumers. Other English speaking countries use the term "physiotherapy" in place of physical therapy. Many people equate "physiotherapeutic" with physical therapy, paving the way for them to believe that they can receive physical therapy from a chiropractor. The physical therapy practice act provides for term protection of physical therapy and physiotherapist. The term "physiotherapeutic" is a derivative of the word, physiotherapy, which is protected for use in physical therapy.

We recommend that the term, "physical modalities" replace the use of "physiotherapy" so that consumers do not confuse chiropractic with the treatments administered by physical therapists.

Ultimately, the physical therapy community is committed to health care provided by health care practitioners within their scope of education and training. We support licensure of allied health professionals' scope of practice based on a national, standardized training curriculum to ensure that the consumers are receiving appropriate and safe care.

Chair Herkes, Vice Chair Yamane, and members of the Committee, my name is Linda O'Reilly, Workers' Compensation Claims Manager at First Insurance, testifying on behalf of Hawaii Insurers Council. Hawaii Insurers Council is a non-profit trade association of property and casualty insurance companies licensed to do business in Hawaii. Member companies underwrite approximately 40% of all property and casualty insurance premiums in the state.

Hawaii Insurers Council <u>opposes</u> SB 657, SD 1, HD 1. Throughout the early and mid-1990s, property and casualty insurers were under severe scrutiny by the Legislature because of the rising cost of insurance, particularly motor vehicle and workers' compensation insurance. Our analysis showed that increasing medical costs were attributed to the treatment of soft tissue injury, largely by chiropractors. There were a number of law changes in the 1990s to the motor vehicle insurance, workers' compensation, and chiropractic licensing laws. As a result, costs for these types of insurance has decreased significantly and stabilized for a number of years.

Chiropractors have made attempts over the years to expand their scope of practice. Since the motor vehicle insurance law was changed to limit the number and amount of chiropractic reimbursement, costs have stabilized in this area. Workers' compensation insurance however does not have the same cost controls in place. Expansion of chiropractors' scope to the whole body would increase costs in workers' compensation.

Currently, a chiropractor's office visit ranges from \$176 to \$200 vs. \$50 to \$176 for a medical doctor's office visit. The cost difference is because chiropractors are able to charge for manipulation and up to four procedure codes per visit. Even though utilization is limited per treatment plan, additional treatment plans are routinely submitted.

The 1997 Legislature dealt with the issues of chiropractic treatment versus other medical disciplines in Act 78. This bill seeks again to expand chiropractic beyond the scope established in that Act after much in depth testimony as to the medical and financial implications. We believe the various medical disciplines, including chiropractic, are appropriately defined in Title 25 of the Hawaii Revised Statutes and these amendments should not be enacted.

The consequence of their expanded scope of treatment will be higher costs in these areas. It will erode years of legislative reform and will contribute to increasing medical costs for motor vehicle and workers' compensation insurance. Hawaii Insurers Council is also concerned about the quality of care for injured persons and we believe chiropractors' treatment should be limited to the spine.

Therefore, we respectfully request that SB 657, SD 1, HD 1 be held. However, if this committee feels it is appropriate to move the bill, we ask that you at least limit the reimbursement amount and the number of treatments as it exists in the motor vehicle insurance law. The following language should be inserted where appropriate to Chapter 386-21:

"Chiropractic treatments shall be allowed for not more than the lesser of thirty visits at no more than \$75 a visit plus no more than five x-rays at no more than \$50 each."

Thank you for this opportunity to testify in support of SB657 SD1.

As you know this bill is presented to change the language of the current HRS chapter 442 to bring what doctors of chiropractic are licensed to practice in Hawaii up to the science that is being taught in chiropractic colleges in the U.S. and around the world.

I just completed a whiplash court case involving one of my patients that sustained a rear ended auto crash. I served as an expert witness in the case. I was responsible to the case in presenting the scientific research regarding these acceleration- deceleration disorders. To be effective as a witness, it was necessary for me to be aware of the published research on this condition. I was called upon to be credible to the court and certainly to the jury for information as it is in 2011. I was responsible to my patient to provide the standard of care for injuries as it is in 2011. I try to exceed the standard of care by keeping my care based on available information as it is published in 2011.

If I had to rely on the science that existed only during or before the existing HRS Chapter 442 was written into law, I would be providing to the court and to my patient substandard information and treatment. Today's understanding of crash dynamics, evidenced based treatment protocols now are truly, as the cliché goes, of another century.

As it was, during my day in court, the defense attorney, fully aware of the status for chiropractic licensure under HRS 442, used the existing law to diminish my testimony, my treatment to my patient, and intimate that I was practicing outside

the law. When in reality, I was providing the standard of care as it exists in this century.

My patients deserve to have the assurance when care is asked for from me, their chiropractor, that it is up to date with current knowledge and it is not outside of an antiquated format. This bill will provide that assurance.

Please understand that the Council on Chiropractic Education sets the standards of professional practice and **not** the American Chiropractic Association.

The effective date must by effective upon approval and not in thirty nine years.

Thank you for the opportunity to testify in support of SB 657 SD1 HD1 with some concerns and revisions.

My name is Dr. Eric Wruck, DC, and I support SB 657 SD1 HD1.

This bill serves to change the existing language of the current version of HRS Chapter 442 to ensure that all chiropractors licensed in Hawaii are up to the standards that are currently being taught in accredited chiropractic colleges across the country. Most states already have recognized these standards.

Chiropractic is more and more accepted as part of mainstream medicine. I for one was the first Chiropractor that attained staff privileges at the Maui Memorial Medical Center and also on the "On call" list with the emergency department. I have many MD's that come in as patients as well as refer patients for treatment. We also know that in general Medical clinics are many times over booked and that we have a need for quality patient care. Essentially this bill will offer the Chiropractic profession the ability to offer greater spectrum of care for neuro-musculoskeletal conditions and decrease some of the stress applied by these kinds of conditions on the medical profession here in Hawaii.

The science of chiropractic, like all healthcare professions has evolved over time. There is a great body of research now that shows the efficacy of Chiropractic treatments and Manipulation. This includes medical research journals and many through Osteopathic Medicine that show that manipulation is effective as treatment as well as cost effective in the marketplace. Contrary to what the Insurance industry wants you to believe Chiropractic is advantageous to cost containment. The science has changed as more and more research has been performed. There is much research in support of chiropractic, not only being effective clinically, but also cost effective. This bill will ensure that as the profession evolves over the years, licensees will be kept to the most current standards of the time.

Chiropractic is a non-drug, non-surgical approach to healthcare. Chiropractors are taught to treat the whole body in a holistic approach as all systems of the body are interrelated and have an effect on each other. Chiropractors practice as a portal of entry provider for the general public meaning that we uniquely able to support the medical model in two distinct ways. First, we can lighten the load for nonsurgical patients and offer conservative treatment options many times in conjunction with medical pain management offered by an MD for more efficient recovery. Second, we are uniquely able to triage patients (in a fashion) by identifying conditions that people present with which fall outside the scope of chiropractic training and refer them to the appropriate specialist. In my practice this has likely not only

saved a patient from serious progression of some conditions, but may have saved their lives as well. This is what we were trained to do,... this is what we want to do even better.

Chiropractors function much like a general practitioner who conservatively manages musculoskeletal spine and extremity disorders of the body. They too are trained to identify conditions outside their scope and refer to the appropriate specialist. Medications play a large role in the treatment of these spine and extremity conditions in traditional medicine. Chiropractors have been trained for years to conservatively treat the musculoskeletal spine and extremity disorders without the use of such drugs or surgery when possible, and many times reducing the length of time exposed to pain medications when needed in conjunction with conservative therapy. This reduces possibility to addictions which is always a concern.

The public deserves to have the assurance that the chiropractor they may see practices in a manner that is up to date with current knowledge and standards. HB234 will provide this assurance and serve to ensure the ongoing protection of the health, safety and welfare of the people of the State of Hawaii.

I'd like to add something to my testimony: There is a need to reverse an error made by the House Health Committee. The Health Committee added a paragraph requiring the ACA (American chiropractic Association) to work with the Board of Chiropractic Examiners to define the scope of practice.

The problem is that the ACA is not the agency that determines the standards of practice in the profession. It is the CCE (Council on Chiropractic Education) that sets the standards of professional practice by accrediting the colleges and approving their curricula.

Furthermore, the Board of Chiropractic Examiners interprets the laws governing our practice but doesn't define the scope of practice in the way the Health Committee thinks it does.

Therefore, Sections 3 proposed by the Health Committee in the latest version of the bill should be removed. Although I explained this distinction to the Health Committee Chair several times, he still thinks it is the ACA that defines our national standard of practice. Leaving this in the bill will create an impossible situation since neither the ACA nor the Chiropractic Board have the authority to establish our national standards of practice.

Lastly please amend that this Act become effective upon its approval. The Health Committee put the effective date as July 1, 2050.

Please support SB 657 SD1. My patients.... Your voters.... Support this bill.

SB657 SD1 HD1 serves to change the existing language of the current version of HRS Chapter 442 to ensure that all chiropractors licensed in Hawaii are up to the standards that is currently being taught in accredited chiropractic colleges across the country.

However, SB657 SD1, HD1 contains language that differs from SD1. I humbly suggest that SB657 SD1, HD1 be amended back to language contained in SD1. Namely section 3(a) and 3 (b) should be removed as the American Chiropractic Association (a trade association) is not the appropriate body that should be involved in setting standards of care. Lastly, the effective date of the act should be upon its approval. Licensees need to be current with the teachings of the chiropractic colleges, waiting until 2050 will not be in the best interests of the people of Hawaii.

The science of chiropractic, like all healthcare professions has evolved over time. The science has changed as more and more research has been performed. There is much research in support of chiropractic, not only being effective clinically, but also cost effective. SB657 SD1 HD1 will ensure that as the profession evolves over the years, licensees will be kept to the most current standards of the time.

Chiropractic is a non-drug, non-surgical approach to healthcare. Chiropractors are taught to treat the whole body in a holistic approach as all systems of the body are interrelated and have an effect on each other. Chiropractors practice as a portal of entry providers for the general public. As such, they are trained to identify conditions that people present with which fall outside the scope of chiropractic training and refer them to the appropriate specialist.

These medications have severe and often fatal side effects. NSAIDs (non-steroidal anti-inflammatory drugs) are the most common prescribed medication for the treatment of musculoskeletal pain. Not counting over the counter NSAID's, prescription NSAIDs alone are estimated to cause 16,500 deaths per year according to J. S. Hochman, MD, Executive Director for the National Foundation for the Treatment of Pain. He stated on 2/15/2003: "It has been estimated conservatively that 16,500 NSAID-related deaths occur among patients with rheumatoid arthritis or osteoarthritis every year in the United States. This figure is similar to the number of deaths from the acquired immunodeficiency syndrome and considerably greater than the number of deaths from multiple myeloma, asthma, cervical cancer, or Hodgkin's disease. If deaths from gastrointestinal toxic effects of NSAIDs were tabulated separately in the National Vital Statistics reports, these effects would constitute the 15th most common cause of death in the United States. Yet these toxic effects remain largely a "silent epidemic," with many physicians and most patients unaware of the magnitude of the problem. Furthermore, the mortality statistics do not include deaths ascribed to the use of over-the-counter NSAIDs."

Over the past 28 years of practice on Maui, I have personally treated over 15,000 individual people. I have seen literally hundreds of these people significantly reduce or eliminate their need for this type of medication due to the chiropractic care that I have provided them. In my clinical experience, chiropractic is an effective treatment for the spine and extremities that reduces the need for many types of medication. This benefit to the people of the State of Hawaii can not be underestimated.
