
The APEC Conference gave local leaders a chance to show the world Hawaii's leading high-tech companies. Nineteen companies are

They have developed modular collectors about one-third the size of traditional solar units. The units enable effective distributed generation of electricity, process heating and cooling in a single system.

Darren Kimura, President and CEO of Sopogy, is a Mililani Mauka resident. Sopogy is the winner of the 2011 Business Innovation Showcase and has also been awarded winner for Going Green Global 200 for the 3rd year. Sopogy's technology is helping to bring the clean energy goals to light and also create local jobs here in Hawaii.

At the China Aloha Business Leader's night gala on November 13th, during the week long APEC summit, Sopogy signed a memorandum of understanding for equity and project finance with Sichuan Dongjia Investment Company.
