Tourism News

As Chair of the Senate Tourism Committee, I am pleased to report that tourism is leading the way in our state's recovery. In a recent update by the Council on Revenues, members revised its forecast from 2% to 3% revenue growth in the current fiscal year. Among several economic factors influencing the Council's revision, the strong rise in total visitor arrivals was the predominant change from the Council's prior forecasts.

On January 3, 2011, I attended a legislative briefing from the host committee on the 2011 Asia-Pacific Economic Cooperation (APEC) summit. This summit will convene 21 economies and heads of state in Honolulu this November, bringing an estimated 10,000 to 20,000 people. It is also expected to infuse \$120 plus million into our state. APEC was established in 1989 to further economic growth and prosperity and has been hosted in the United States previously only once; in Seattle, Washington in 1993. Therefore, it is quite an honor to host this major inter-governmental group in the city of President Obama's birth.
