Application for Grants and Subsidies

I. Background and Summary

1. A brief description of the applicant's background:

The Kahilu Theatre Foundation (KTF) provides the residents and visitors of Hawai'i Island with opportunities to experience and participate in a wide array of artistic performances and events, including music, dance, drama, film, and visual arts. Its 30th season (2010-2011) served an audience of 37,617 residents and visitors through its programming. The "Makana Series" offered live performances, film, recitals, lectures, and demonstrations free of charge to community members who might not otherwise have access to arts, dance and music experiences due to financial constraints. "Kids at Kahilu," KTF's youth education program, extends these opportunities to Hawai'i's *keiki* through its extensive youth programming comprising 25% of its annual operating budget, bringing quality arts experiences to an under-served rural area. In addition, Kids at Kahilu offers afterschool, holiday, and summer arts education programs. During the 30th season, Kids at Kahilu served a youth audience of over 7,300 students.

Kahilu Theatre Foundation was incorporated in 1980 as a 501(c)(3) not-for-profit organization and is charged with the operation of Waimea's 490-seat Kahilu Theatre, which was built in 1981.

Over the past 30 years, KTF has served residents and visitors of Hawai'i by presenting artists and programs of significant stature not only within the State but often on a national or even international level. The economic crisis of the past three years significantly affected the operations of Kahilu Theatre, and the Board decided in June 2012 to take an "intermission" from programming while it addressed accumulated debt, restructured the organization, and refocused its mission and goals. As of the end of September 2012, all debts were paid, thanks to the support of local businesses, community members, and Theatre patrons. The Board has formulated a new vision and roadmap for the future, embodied in a strategic plan. This strategic plan moves beyond recovery to revitalize and reinvigorate Kahilu Theatre's offerings, programming, and operational capacity, while strengthening KTF's partnerships with local vendors, businesses, artists, and the tourism sector.

In response to significant community feedback over the past six months, KTF will now offer a greater diversity of programming targeting a broader cross-section of our community, present more local artists, dancers, and musicians, and offer even more educational programming for children and adults, including classes, workshops, lectures, and filling a void left by budget cuts in the local schools. One of the most requested additions to the Theatre offerings has been movies. People do not want to have to drive, or have their teenagers drive, over an hour

each way to Kailua-Kona or Hilo to watch feature-length movies.

2. The goals and objectives related to the request:

Currently, Kahilu Theatre Foundation owns very little sound and projection equipment and must rent this equipment for each performance and educational event at the Theatre. In addition, the current Theatre lighting is out-dated and draws an enormous amount of electricity when in use. Equipment rental and high electricity costs increase the overall costs to present performances, limiting KTF's artistic and educational offerings to the community.

Upgrading Kahilu's sound, light and projection infrastructure will substantially increase the capacity of Kahilu as a venue to host events and decrease ongoing costs for electricity and equipment rentals. In order to meet the programming requirements of our strategic plan while maintaining sustainable financial operations, Kahilu Theatre has made this capital investment a top priority.

3. The public purpose and need to be served:

Kahilu Theatre Foundation offers music, arts, dance, drama and cultural performances that enhance the quality of life of our rural communities. The educational programs offered at Kahilu Theatre benefit school children throughout the island who otherwise have limited access to art and music at school.

4. Describe the target population to be served:

The people and children of Hawai'i Island are the target population of the Kahilu Theatre. The Kona-Kohala resorts and tourism sector are also served by Kahilu Theatre which provides a venue offering interesting and relevant local programming for their hotel guests.

5. <u>Describe the geographic coverage</u>:

Kahilu Theatre serves the people of Hawai'i Island. Audience members come from communities throughout the island. The majority come from the North Kona, South Kohala, North Kohala and Hamakua districts. The school children served are generally from these same districts, though KTF does, on occasion, transport performers to schools in North and South Hilo, Puna, Ka'u, and South Kona districts as well.

II. Service Summary and Outcomes

1. Describe the scope of work, tasks and responsibilities:

- A. Purchase and install flexible, state of the art audio system equipment for all types of audio needs in order to bring Kahilu's audio capabilities up to industry standards with technology and expandability. Specific equipment includes:
 - 1x Yamaha CL5 Digital Mixing Console
 - 1x Yamaha Rio3224 Stage Box/Snake Head
 - 6x Nexo GEOS1210 Loudspeakers Line Array

The system will provide a multi-zone flow and fill speaker system for an even, undistorted, coherent and intelligible public address, theatrical coverage as well as 90-110 decibel of live music entertainment for demanding audio riders. CL5 is expandable up to 72 channels of input and 40 channels of output when needed. The system will also provide recording capability for multi-track straight to PC or Mac. With WiFi networking and wireless iPad apps, engineers or system technicians will be able to tune, adjust and operate audio from almost anywhere.

- B. Purchase and install lighting equipment to update lighting infrastructure.
- C. Replace, repair and increase the light fixture inventory to the industry standards, which are also more energy efficient with a more adjustable beam focus. To limit possible electrical hazards, replace or repair all terminations and/or wiring.
- D. Purchase and install 1080p/WUXGA High Definition projector for the highest quality of resolution for movies, presentations, and theatrical visual effects.
- E. Provide training and technical support to Theatre staff on the use of all equipment.
- E. All equipment will be purchased by Kahilu Theatre Foundation at discounted cost from local vendors, and installed, under contract, by professional sound and light technicians. All rigging of overhead speakers will be certified for safety by a structural engineer.
- 2. <u>Provide a projected annual timeline for accomplishing the results or outcomes of the service:</u>

All sound and light equipment will be purchased and installed during the 1st quarter of FY 2014, before the start of Kahilu Theatre's 2013-2014 presenting season. Projection equipment will be purchased and installed no later than the second quarter. All training will be provided during the first and second quarters.

- 3. Describe its quality assurance and evaluation plans for the request. Specify how the applicant plans to monitor, evaluate, and improve their results:

 Kahilu Theatre Foundation will get multiple bids from local vendors to ensure it is getting the greatest value and most appropriate equipment and integrated systems control. The equipment will be installed by licensed and insured technicians to ensure maximum benefit and useful life expectancy of the equipment.

IV. Experience and Capability

A. Necessary Skills and Experience

Kahilu Theatre Foundation (KTF) was incorporated in 1980 as a 501(c)(3) not-for-profit organization and has been responsible for the operation of Kahilu Theatre since it was built in 1981. KTF has since overseen 30 years of successful artistic and educational programming, with an annual budget ranging between \$500,000 and \$1.4 million.

B. Facilities

Kahilu Theatre was founded and built by Richard Smart, a renowned Broadway performer and sole heir to Parker Ranch. It is a 20,000 square-foot building, housing a 490-seat theater, front lobby, and two side galleries. After Richard Smart's death in 1992, Kahilu Theatre became a part of the Parker Ranch Trust. In 2001, Kahilu Theatre Foundation acquired a 30-year lease to operate Kahilu Theatre, though it is not a beneficiary of the Parker Ranch Trust, which owns the Theatre.

Kahilu Theatre is wheelchair accessible and provides areas in the theater for wheelchair seating. Kahilu Theatre also has two ADA-compliant restrooms.


V. Personnel: Project Organization and Staffing

A. Proposed Staffing, Staff Qualifications, Supervision and Training

The KTF Board of Directors is in the process of advertising for a new Executive Director, who will be hired before the beginning of the new fiscal year. Board members and Alva Kamalani, Kahilu Theatre's Director of Operations, are currently responsible for the decision-making and day-to-day operations of the Theatre. This has included planning the 2013-2014 season, planning and executing fundraising events, processing theatre rentals, grant-writing, evaluating infrastructure improvements to reduce operating costs, maintaining the building and landscaping, and re-starting youth education and outreach programs. Highly experienced technical personnel run the sound and lighting equipment on a performance-by-performance basis and a loyal band of over 25 volunteers help with "front of the house" activities.

KTF will contract with qualified technical professionals for the installation of all sound, light, and projection equipment.
