Your Committee has reviewed the personal history, resume, and statement submitted by the nominee and finds Jayne Tsuchiyama to possess the requisite qualifications to be nominated to the Board of Acupuncture.

Your Committee received testimony in support of the nomination of Jayne Tsuchiyama from the Department of Commerce and Consumer Affairs.

Upon review of the testimony, your Committee finds that Ms. Tsuchiyama's experience as a licensed acupuncturist, background, and commitment to public service qualify her for reappointment to the Board of Acupuncture as a licensee member. Your Committee notes that Ms. Tsuchiyama is the first acupuncturist to work in The Queen's Cancer Center, a multidisciplinary treatment and research center, and was the first acupuncturist in Hawaii to receive a grant to provide acupuncture to low-income and unemployed breast cancer patients.
