The purpose of this measure is to educate individuals about long term care. Among other things, this bill:

- Appropriates funds to the Department of Health's (1) Executive Office on Aging to administer a public education and awareness campaign on long term care and obtain an independent evaluation of the campaign;
- (2)Establishes the goals of the campaign;
- Allows the Executive Office on Aging to develop a (3) public-private partnership to fund and administer the campaign; and
- Requires the Director of the Executive Office on Aging (4) to submit a report on the evaluation of the campaign to the Legislature no later than 20 days prior to the Regular Session of 2016.

The Maui County Office on Aging, AARP, ILWU Local 142, and Hawaii Alliance for Retired Americans testified in support of this measure. The Department of Health's Executive Office on Aging submitted testimony in support of the intent of this measure.
