HB 740 Status RELATING TO OPEN CONTAINERS OF INTOXICATING

HSG, JUD

LIQUORS IN PUBLIC HOUSING.

Prohibits the possession or storage of an open container holding intoxicating liquor on any sidewalk or common area within any public housing project under the jurisdiction of the Hawaii public housing

authority

HB 742 Status RELATING TO PUBLIC HOUSING.

HSG, FIN

Authorizes the Hawaii public housing authority to delete from its accounts receivable records, accounts for vacated units in state low-income public housing projects that are delinquent for at least 90 days.

HB 888 Status RELATING TO DISPOSITION OF PERSONAL PROPERTY ON

HSG, FIN

PUBLIC HOUSING PROPERTIES.

Provides the process by which the Hawaii Public Housing Authority may dispose of abandoned or seized property that it has acquired on

state public housing projects.

<u>HB 1158</u>

RELATING TO PUBLIC HOUSING.

HSG, JUD

Status Prohibits the Hawaii public housing authority from considering a

prospective tenant's conviction for a minor crime that occurred five years or more before the application date. Provides exceptions for crimes involving drugs, violence, sexual offenses, and alcohol.

HB 1116 Status RELATING TO PUBLIC HOUSING.

HSG, JUD

Authorizes the Hawaii public housing authority to process terminations

of tenancy or evictions from the federal low-income public housing program without providing a grievance hearing when permitted by the

federal government.

HB 1119 Status RELATING TO THE PUBLIC HOUSING AUTHORITY.

HSG, FIN

Appropriates funds to the HPHA to leverage funds for the

redevelopment of the Mayor Wright homes.



RELATING TO LAND USE. HB 738 HSG, WAL Requires the counties to allow the construction of accessory dwelling Status units on lots where a residential dwelling unit is permitted. HB 795 RELATING TO THE HOUSING LOAN AND MORTGAGE HSG, CPC Status PROGRAM. Updates the Hula Mae Single Family mortgage loan program to allow for broader program participation by potential homeowners, add downpayment assistance as a program feature, and make housekeeping and conforming amendments. RELATING TO HOUSING. HB 1118 HSG, WAL, JUD Status Exempts qualifying high-rise dwelling projects with affordable rental units in the urban core of Honolulu from height restrictions. **HB 1407** RELATING TO THE DISCLOSURE OF ENERGY CONSUMPTION HSG, CPC Status TO RENTERS AND LESSEES. Requires disclosure of energy cost information to prospective tenants in rental or lease transactions. RELATING TO THE DEFINITION OF PUBLIC HOUSING HB 741 HSG, JUD Status PROJECT. Expands the definition of "public housing projects" to include all

potential properties that could be managed by a public housing agency

- The Committee(s) to which the comments are directed;
- · The date and time of the hearing; and
- · Measure number.

While every effort will be made to incorporate all testimony received, materials received on the day of the hearing or improperly identified or directed, may be distributed to the Committee after the hearing.
