SB 914, SD1 (HSCR998) Status

RELATING TO TIME SHARE CONVEYANCES.

VMI, CPC/JUD

Creates a new chapter to authorize the governor to appoint commissioners of deeds to administer oaths, take acknowledgements, and take proofs of execution outside of the United States in connection with the execution of conveyance documents relating to a timeshare interest, any property subject to a time share plan, or the operation of a time share plan covering any property located within the State. Requires written notice to be provided to consumers. Establishes bonding requirements, penalties, and liabilities for commissioners of deeds. (SD1)

SB 655, SD2, HD1 (HSCR1084) Status RELATING TO HEALTH.

Allows health professionals, subject to certain requirements, to treat the heterosexual partners of patients diagnosed as having chlamydia or gonorrhea, the sexually transmitted diseases recommended by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention for expedited partner therapy, by dispensing or prescribing medication to the heterosexual partners without examining the partners. Provides protection from criminal liability, legal liability, and disciplinary action for health professionals who provide expedited partner therapy as authorized. Requires the department of health to develop an information sheet about sexually transmitted diseases for use by health professionals who provide expedited partner therapy. Creates exceptions to prescription drug labeling and reporting requirements for expedited partner therapy.

<u>SB-642</u> (SSCR511) Status RELATING TO HEALTH.

Requires eigarettes and tobacco products to be stored for sale

behind a counter in certain establishments.

SB 642, HD1 (HSCR1215) Status RELATING TO HEALTH.

Requires cigarettes and tobacco products to be sold, offered for sale, or displayed only in a direct, face-to-face exchange between the retailer and the consumer. Amends the Medical Use of Marijuana Law. Effective July 1, 2050. (SB642 HD1)

DECISION MAKING TO FOLLOW
