RELATING TO RENEWABLE ENERGY.

EEP, CPC

Status

Excludes from the definition of "public utility", persons who install

renewable energy systems on their property and provide, sell, or transmit the power therefrom to an electric utility or lessee/tenant of

the property. (HB453 HD1)

HB 1405, HD1 (HSCR462) <u>Status</u>

RELATING TO THE PUBLIC UTILITIES COMMISSION.

EEP, CPC

Requires the public utilities commission to include a summary of the power purchase agreements in effect during the fiscal year in its annual report to the Governor. Effective July 1, 2013. (HB1405 HD1)

HB 810, HD1 (HSCR240)

RELATING TO ELECTRIC SYSTEMS.

EEP, CPC

Authorizes the Public Utilities Commission to consider the value of implementing advanced grid modernization technology in the State.

HB 813 Status

Status

RELATING TO ELECTRICITY PRODUCERS.

CPC

Authorizes the Public Utilities Commission to examine all documents and other information and data deemed necessary for the review of power purchase agreements before the Commission, including financial records, projections, cost reports, and other material of thirdparty electricity producers seeking to sell power to a public utility

under a power purchase agreement.

HB 815, HD1 (HSCR282) Status

RELATING TO ELECTRIC COOPERATIVES.

EEP, CPC

Directs the Public Utilities Commission and the Division of Consumer Advocacy to specifically consider the ownership structure and interests of an electric cooperative; and authorizes the Public Utilities Commission to waive or exempt an electric cooperative operating in the State from compliance with the provisions of chapter 269, Hawaii Revised Statutes, as well as any other applicable charters, franchises, rules, decisions, orders, or any other laws. (HB815 HD1)

HB 1256 Status

RELATING TO ENERGY.

CPC

Changes net-metering compensation system for consumers that generate electricity that is fed onto the grid by providing for feed-in tariff for electricity sold to the electric utility and retail rate for electricity supplied to customer-generators. Effective July 1, 2013.

HB 656, HD1 (HSCR370) Status

RELATING TO HEALTH CARE ADMINISTRATIVE UNIFORMITY.

HLT, CPC

Exempts collaboration among health care and insurance providers and government agencies to adopt uniform administrative procedures from state antitrust laws under specified conditions. Effective July 1, 2050. (HB656 HD1)

HB 1098 (HSCR53) Status

RELATING TO HEALTH EDUCATION.

HLT, CPC

HLT, CPC

Requires the Auditor to conduct a sunrise analysis of the regulation of health educators. Effective July 1, 2013.

HB 79, HD1 (HSCR501) <u>Status</u>

RELATING TO ADVANCED PRACTICE REGISTERED NURSES. Changes the degree requirement for advanced practice registered nurse recognition from a master's degree in nursing to a graduate degree in nursing. (HB79 HD1)

HB 654, HD1 (HSCR502) Status 5 4 1

RELATING TO NURSING.

HLT, CPC

Requires the department of commerce and consumer affairs professional and vocational licensing division to collaborate with the center for nursing to enable the center to obtain nursing-related data. Provides that the workforce data may be obtained through online survey or other means. (HB654 HD1)

HB 847, HD1 (HSCR151) <u>Status</u>

RELATING TO ENFORCEMENT TOOLS TO IMPROVE PATIENT SAFETY.

Authorizes the Hawaii Medical Board to summarily suspend a license and order a licensee to submit to a physical and mental examination under specific circumstances. Effective July 1, 2050. (HB847 HD1)

HB 1482, HD1 (HSCR372) Status

RELATING TO HEALTH.

HLT, CPC

HLT, CPC

Requires the department of health to classify and recognize qualified hospitals and health care facilities that provide care to stroke patients. Allows hospitals and health care facilities to publicly advertise their recognition. Requires hospitals and health care facilities to report data to the department. Requires the department to create guidelines for pre-hospital stroke-triage assessment and maintain a statewide stroke database. Takes effect on July 1, 2050. (HB1482 HD1)

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HB 999, HD1 RELATING TO INSURANCE. **CPC** (HSCR351) Clarifies requirements for reinsurance credits for risk retention groups. Requires assessment and reporting of risk retention groups to <u>Status</u> determine compliance with this Act. Effective 07/01/13. (HD1) RELATING TO DENTAL SERVICE CORPORATIONS. HB 842, HD1 HLT, CPC (HSCR371) Establishes licensing and financial solvency requirements for dental service corporations and repeals chapters 423 and 448D, Hawaii Status Revised Statutes. Effective July 1, 2050. (HB842 HD1) RELATING TO TRANSPORTATION. TRN, CPC HB 1189, HD1 (HSCR469) Clarifies the prohibition on the modification of the exhaust system of a moped that amplifies or increases the noise emitted by the muffler **Status** originally installed on the moped. Effective January 1, 2014. (HB1189 HD1) EDB, CPC RELATING TO ADVERTISING AND MARKETING. HB 1126, HD1 Requires beers sold or distributed in the State whose labels convey the (HSCR278) **Status** impression that the beers were produced in Hawaii to indicate otherwise if not produced in the State. Effective January 20, 2020. (HB1126 HD1) EDB, CPC RELATING TO LIQUOR. HB 1314 (HSCR281) Establishes new class of Liquor Commission licensees for distillery **Status** pubs. RELATING TO ACT 326, SESSION LAWS OF HAWAII 2012, CPC HB 457 REPORTING REQUIREMENTS. Status 5 4 1 Requires any operator of a transient accommodation to furnish "relevant information" concerning the operator. Modifies the duties of nongovernment entities regarding "relevant information" pertaining to operators of transient accommodations. WAL/AGR, CPC RELATING TO THE OWNER-BUILDER EXEMPTION. HB 846, HD1 Sets forth specific responsibilities of and protections for owner-(HSCR516) builders exempted under contractor licensing laws. Establishes a filing Status fee to fund the processing of applications and field investigations regarding the owner-builder scheme. Effective July 1, 2013. (HB846 HD1) CPC RELATING TO PUBLIC SAFETY. HB 671 Prohibits a general engineering and general building contractor from **Status** doing any work that requires it to act as a specialty contractor in an area the general contractor is not licensed to operate.

RELATING TO PROFESSIONS AND OCCUPATIONS.

CPC

Authorizes the board of electricians and plumbers to regulate plumber air conditioning and refrigeration pipefitters and plumber fire sprinkler pipefitters. Redefines "master plumber." Excludes certain work from the owner-builder licensing exemption. Increases the percentage of licensed individuals on a job necessary to perform certain work. Effective 07/01/2015.
