HB 497

RELATING TO RENEWABLE ENERGY.

Status

Amends the tax credit for solar energy systems. Defines certain types

of solar energy systems and the tax credits applicable to each.

Effective July 1, 2013; applicable to taxable years after December 31,

2013.
