HB 1363 Status

RELATING TO COMMUNITY-BASED RENEWABLE ENERGY.

Establishes the Hawaii community-based renewable energy program.

Enables utility customers to participate in a community-based renewable energy facility and benefit from the electricity generated

from such a facility. Effective July 1, 2013.

HB 1307 <u>Status</u>

RELATING TO LANDFILLS.

EEP, EDN, FIN

EEP, CPC, FIN

Creates a host municipality benefit fee to be assessed against landfill operators who violate solid waste pollution laws. Requires the State to distribute the fee to high schools within a five-mile radius of the

penalized landfill.

DECISION MAKING TO FOLLOW
