RELATING TO TAXATION.

Amends the date of filing of monthly, quarterly, and semiannual general excise tax returns from the twentieth day of the calendar,

quarterly, or semiannual month to the last day.

Appropriates funds to the Hawaii Strategic Development Corporation for the HI Growth Initiative, an investment program to develop an

RELATING TO RENTAL MOTOR VEHICLE SURCHARGE TAX. Requires the rental motor vehicle surcharge tax for car-sharing organizations to be prorated at 12.5 cents per hour. Defines car-

HB 269, HD1 (HSCR218) Status

PROPOSING AN AMENDMENT TO THE CONSTITUTION OF THE STATE OF HAWAII RELATING TO RESIDENCY REQUIREMENTS FOR MEMBERS OF THE LEGISLATURE. Amends the state constitution to require candidates for the state senate or house of representatives to be a resident of the legislative district from which the person is a candidate for not less than twelve

HB 338, HD1 (HSCR343) Status

RELATING TO THE ISSUANCE OF SPECIAL PURPOSE REVENUE BONDS TO ASSIST A SEAWATER AIR CONDITIONING PROJECT IN WAIKIKI.

Authorizes the issuance of special purpose revenue bonds of up to \$200,000,000, for Kaiuli Energy LLC for the planning, design, and construction of its seawater air conditioning district cooling system in and around Waikiki, Oahu. Effective July 1, 2013.

HB 505, HD1 (HSCR342) Status

RELATING TO GREENWAYS.

Directs the Office of Planning to contract with a consultant to develop a plan for a statewide greenways plan. Appropriates funds. Effective

January 1, 2857.

HB 1149, HD2 (HSCR487) Status

RELATING TO WIND ENERGY FACILITIES.

Requires wind energy facility owner to be responsible for facility decommissioning and to provide evidence of financial security unless the owner has an existing lease or other agreement that provides for decommissioning. Outlines the elements of proper decommissioning.

HB 1119 (HSCR214) Status

RELATING TO THE PUBLIC HOUSING AUTHORITY. Appropriates funds to the HPHA to leverage funds for the redevelopment of the Mayor Wright homes.

HB 742, HD1 (HSCR255) Status

RELATING TO PUBLIC HOUSING.

Allows Hawaii Public Housing Authority (HPHA) to assign to a collection agency, accounts for vacated units in state low-income public housing projects that are delinquent for at least 90 days; provided that HPHA may delete the delinquent accounts from its accounts receivable records.

HB 532, HD1 (HSCR12) Status

RELATING TO PUBLIC HOUSING.

In determining eligibility for state low-income housing, requires the value of all motor vehicles registered to a unit's tenants to be considered in calculating income and asset limits. Provides exclusion

for a certain threshold value amount.

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HB 535, HD1 RELATING TO HOMELESS PROGRAMS. HSG, FIN Authorizes the designation of temporary nighttime parking lots in each (HSCR175) Status county to provide safe overnight parking for homeless individuals who live and sleep in their motor vehicles and who would otherwise park overnight on public or private roads or property. Appropriates funds. Effective July 1, 2013. HB 536 RELATING TO PUBLIC HOUSING. HSG, FIN (HSCR10) Disqualifies from state low-income housing any applicant or tenant if the applicant, tenant, or a household member owns or acquires a home <u>Status</u> within the State. HB 1150, HD1 RELATING TO CONTRACTS. CPC, FIN (HSCR510) Exempts an owner's agreement with an attorney to file a claim as to Status identified property or contest the administrator's denial of a claim from the application of section 523A-25, Hawaii Revised Statutes. Effective 07/01/2112. RELATING TO LANGUAGE ACCESS. HB 266. HD1 HLT, FIN Establishes and provides appropriations for a Statewide Language (HSCR504) Access Resource Center and Multilingual Website Pilot Project to be Status administered by the Office of Language Access. Effective July 1, 2050. Appropriations. HB 668, HD1 RELATING TO HEALTH. HLT/PBS, FIN (HSCR478) Transfers the medical use of marijuana program, from the Department Status of Public Safety to the Department of Health by June 30, 2014. Requires report, with transfer plan and timeline, to the legislature prior to the 2014 regular session. Effective July 1, 2013.
