HB 834 (HSCR320) MAKING EMERGENCY APPROPRIATIONS FOR COLLECTIVE BARGAINING COST ITEMS.

Status

Provides fund authorizations and appropriations for all collective bargaining cost items for salary increases and other wage related costs in the arbitrated settlement for Unit 11 and its excluded counterparts for fiscal biennium 2011-2013.

<u>HB 697</u> (<u>HSCR383</u>) Status MAKING APPROPRIATIONS FOR PUBLIC EMPLOYMENT COST ITEMS.

LAB, FIN

Makes appropriation for the public employment cost items of and cost adjustments for employees of legislative agencies.

HB 1173, HD1 (HSCR185) Status RELATING TO COLLECTIVE BARGAINING.

LAB, FIN

Amends section 89-9, Hawaii Revised Statutes (HRS), to allow disputes over contributions to the Hawaii Employer-Union Health Benefits Trust Fund to be settled by way of arbitration as provided in section 89-11, HRS. Amends section 89-11, HRS, to repeal various provisions relating to disputes over the amounts of contributions to the Hawaii Employer-Union Health Benefits Trust Fund. Makes

conforming amendments. Effective January 1, 2113

HB 1174, HD1 (HSCR174) Status RELATING TO EMPLOYER-UNION HEALTH BENEFITS TRUST L. FUND.

Repeals specific monetary amounts of employer contributions to the Hawaii Employer-Union Health Benefits Trust Fund for each enrolled employee beneficiary. Effective January 1, 2113

HB 1177 (HSCR148) Status RELATING TO THE HAWAII EMPLOYER-UNION HEALTH BENEFITS TRUST FUND.

LAB, FIN

Authorizes the board of trustees to procure certain services with an exemption from the procurement code. Establishes trust fiduciary duties, prohibits certain transactions, and establishes liabilities for breaching a fiduciary duty. Amends the membership, methods of appointment, and representation on the board of trustees; the selection process for filling a vacant trustee seat on the board; and the quorum requirements for voting by the board. Authorizes the board to appoint or contract an attorney who is independent from the attorney general and establishes qualifications for the contracted attorney. Specifies how the board shall administer and carry out the purposes of the trust fund and administratively attaches the trust fund to the department of human resources development.

<u>HB 805</u> (HSCR384) Status RELATING TO FEDERAL TAX QUALIFICATION OF THE EMPLOYEES' RETIREMENT SYSTEM.

Amends chapter 88, Hawaii Revised Statutes, to comply with Internal Revenue Code requirements and pre-ERISA vesting rules to maintain the Employees' Retirement System's status as a tax-qualified plan.

HB 807 RELATING TO RETIREMENT BENEFITS FOR JUDGES. (HSCR385) Corrects anomalies of service retirement service eligibility and normal Status and early retirement allowances for judges who became members of earned service credit as a judge after June 30, 2012. HB 808

RELATING TO THE EMPLOYEES' RETIREMENT SYSTEM. (HSCR387) Amends chapter 88, Hawaii Revised Statutes, to preserve the taxqualified status of the Employees' Retirement System and to clarify the <u>Status</u> application of chapter 88 to civil unions.

HB 634 RELATING TO EMPLOYMENT. LAB, FIN (HSCR183) Establishes job security requirements upon the divestiture of a covered <u>Status</u> establishment if the covered establishment employs 100 or more

HB 144, HD2 RELATING TO PROFESSIONAL EMPLOYER ORGANIZATIONS. LAB, CPC, FIN (HSCR559) Repeals chapter 373L; adds definitions and registration and fee requirements to professional employer organization (PEO) law; <u>Status</u> requires notice to DOTAX of PEO violations for general excise tax exemption purposes; allows PEOs to be successor employers to client companies; establishes a sliding scale bond requirement for PEOs based upon annual payrolls. Effective July 1, 2112.

RELATING TO WORKERS' COMPENSATION. HB 437, HD1 LAB, FIN Requires, among other things, independent medical examinations and (HSCR316) Status

permanent impairment rating examinations for workers' compensation claims to be performed by physicians mutually agreed upon by employers and employees or appointed by the Director of the Department of Labor and Industrial Relations. Allows for the use of an out-of-state physician under certain conditions. Appropriates unspecified funds. Effective January 1, 2113. Repealed on June 30, 2018.

HB 154, HD2 RELATING TO INDUSTRIAL HEMP. AGR, CPC, FIN

Authorizes the Chairperson of the Board of Agriculture to establish a (HSCR489) two-year industrial hemp remediation and biofuel crop pilot program. <u>Status</u> Appropriates funds. Effective 07/01/2112.

HB 857, HD1 RELATING TO SUSTAINABILITY. AGR/EEP, FIN

Reallocates the Barrel Tax. Repeals the sunset date of the Barrel Tax (HSCR537) Status and provides appropriations for the anticipated additional revenues. Extends the sunset date for the Energy Systems Development Special Fund until 2018. Effective July 1, 2013.

<u>HB 96. HD1</u> RELATING TO FARMS. AGR, FIN (HSCR283) Creates an income tax exemption on the first \$50,000 of income for

Status family farms, family farm communities, and family farm cooperatives.

<u>HB 487. HD1</u> RELATING TO AGRICULTURE. AGR, FIN (HSCR126) Expands livestock feed subsidies to include feed for goats, sheep,

lambs, fish and crustaceans. Appropriates funds. Effective July 1, **Status** 2050.

Status

Authorizes the Director of Finance to issue general obligation bonds to finance improvements to various irrigation systems. Effective July 1,

2013.

HB 1264, HD1 (HSCR437) Status RELATING TO AGRICULTURAL LOANS.

AGR, FIN

Expands the Department of Agriculture Agricultural Loan Program to provide loans for infrastructure, infrastructure improvements, the implementation of new farming techniques, and biosecurity projects.

Effective July 1, 2050.
