HB 655 Status RELATING TO MEDICAL SERVICES PROVIDERS.

HLT, JUD

Provides that an assault of a medical services provider who is engaged in the performance of duty be categorized as a criminal assault in the

second degree.

HB 656 Status RELATING TO HEALTH CARE ADMINISTRATIVE

HLT, CPC

UNIFORMITY.

Exempts collaboration among all accident and health or sickness insurers, third party administrators, managed care plans, health care providers, and government agencies from state antitrust laws when the collaboration is intended to adopt uniform administrative procedures. Requires notice to be given to certain interested parties in advance of

collaborative discussions.

HB 62 Status RELATING TO PHARMACY BENEFITS MANAGERS.

HLT, CPC

Prohibits a pharmacy benefits manager from using a patient's

prescription drug benefits claim information to market to that patient the services of a preferred pharmacy network that is owned by the

pharmacy benefits manager.

HB 64 Status RELATING TO CONTROLLED SUBSTANCES.

HLT, CPC/JUD

Repeals mail order pharmacy exemption from controlled substances

act.

HB 65 Status RELATING TO PRESCRIPTION DRUGS.

HLT, CPC, JUD

Allows beneficiaries of prescription drug benefits providers to opt out

of the requirement to purchase prescription drugs from a mail-order pharmacy and may alternatively purchase prescription drugs from a

retail pharmacy.

DECISION MAKING TO FOLLOW

Persons wishing to offer comments should submit testimony at least 24 hours prior to the hearing. Testimony should indicate:

- Testifier's name with position/title and organization;
- The Committee(s) to which the comments are directed;
- The date and time of the hearing; and
- Measure number.
