Requires the Department of Human Services to submit interim reports to the Legislature prior to the Regular Sessions of 2014, 2015, and

2016, and a final report to the Legislature prior to the Regular Session of 2017 on its compliance with the federal Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act of 2010 as it relates to Medicare and Medicaid.
