Status & Provides for the filing of a petition for involuntary medical

treatment in either the district or circuit court; allows for a declaration to be filed with the petition as an alternative to an affidavit; expands the court's ability to continue the hearing on the petition for good cause; gives the court more flexibility in deciding when a guardian ad litem is necessary; changes the time within which a person must be examined from two days to five days prior to filing of the petition; amends the list of persons who must be notified of the petition; and clarifies the effective expiration date of the order for persons who return to custody

SB 1337, SD1 RELATING TO HEALTH WELLNESS PROGRAMS.

(SSCR316) Amends the definitions of "gambling" and "something of value" to clarify that participation in health wellness programs is not

Authorizes the family courts to terminate parental rights, with respect to a child, of a natural father who has been convicted of rape or sexual assault and the child was conceived
