RELATING TO THE JUDICIARY.

MAKING APPROPRIATIONS FOR CLAIMS AGAINST THE STATE, ITS OFFICERS, OR ITS EMPLOYEES.

Makes appropriations for claims against the State, its officers, and its

employees.

HB 1147

Status

RELATING TO CAMPAIGN SPENDING.

Requires noncandidate committees to identify certain top contributors for advertisements. Requires the campaign spending commission to maintain public records in a searchable database. Amends reporting requirements for persons and organizations. Authorizes the commission to monitor and penalize all persons failing to report campaign spending. Mandates the commission to implement rules for campaign spending consistent with campaign spending laws within 360 days of the effective date of this Act. Effective 11/05/14.

HB 1481 Status

RELATING TO CAMPAIGN SPENDING.

JUD, FIN

Exempts the offices of governor and lieutenant governor from the scope of the partial public financing law. Changes the law on qualifying contributions, voluntary expenditure limits, and maximum amount of available public funds for candidates for the office of state senator or state representative. Requires the campaign spending commission to submit a report on further statutory amendments to facilitate the implementation of this Act. Appropriates funds to the campaign spending commission to prepare for the partial public financing of elections in 2014.

RELATING TO FERAL BIRDS.

JUD

Status

Provides a civil cause of action for personal injury or property damage

proximately caused by a person who feeds feral birds.

HB 619

RELATING TO FERAL BIRDS.

JUD

Status

Makes feeding feral birds that cause a common nuisance subject to a fine. Makes a second offense within five years a petty misdemeanor.

DECISION MAKING TO FOLLOW
