RELATING TO OPEN DATA.

CPC, JUD, FIN

Requires executive branch department to make electronic data sets available to the public. Absolves State for liability for deficiencies or incomplete data. Requires the Chief Information Officer to develop rules to implement the open data initiative. Effective July 1, 2013.
