<u>HB 418</u> <u>Status</u>	<del>RELATING TO THE UNIFORM MEDIATION ACT.</del> <del>Adopts the Uniform Mediation Act, which provides basic procedural and confidentiality rules for mediations. Provides for confidentiality, disclosure and evidentiary rules, and guidelines for mediators.</del>	JUD
<u>HB 1059, HD1</u> <u>(HSCR404)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO COURT ADVISEMENT CONCERNING ALIEN STATUS. Requires the court to advise criminal defendants of the effects of a guilty or no contest plea on alien status. Effective July 1, 2013. (HB1059 HD1)	VMI, JUD
<u>HB 1287</u> <u>Status</u>	<del>RELATING TO PERSONAL INFORMATION.</del> <del>Allows for the scanning of identification cards to verify age when providing age-restricted goods or services regardless of reasonable doubt of the person's age.</del>	JUD
<u>HB 161</u> <u>(HSCR212)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO VETERANS DISABILITY BENEFITS. Exempts federal veterans disability benefits from seizure to enforce a court judgment, except for certain child and spousal support cases.	VMI, JUD
<u>HB 910, HD1</u> <u>(HSCR555)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO FORENSIC MENTAL HEALTH. Amends penal code to establish limits to the length of conditional release for certain criminal charges, to clarify circumstances under which the one-year conditional release may be tolled, and to require information-sharing among public agencies. (HB910 HD1)	HLT, JUD



DECISION MAKING TO FOLLOW

Persons wishing to offer comments should submit testimony at least 24 hours prior to the hearing. Testimony should indicate:

- Testifier's name with position/title and organization;
- The Committee(s) to which the comments are directed;
- The date and time of the hearing; and
- Measure number.

While every effort will be made to incorporate all testimony received, materials received on the day of the hearing or improperly identified or directed, may be distributed to the Committee after the hearing.

Submit testimony in ONE of the following ways:
