<u>SB464</u> Status and Testimony	RELATING TO LIQUOR COMMISSIONS. Requires county liquor commission to adopt or amend rules by July 1, 2014, regarding conduct of patrons and to define the term "dancing".	PSM
<u>SB727</u> <u>Status and Testimony</u>	RELATING TO ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT. Expressly prohibits the enactment of county ordinances relating to the protection of property and the order and security of inhabitants, if the ordinances conflict with the intent of state or federal statutes, rules, or regulations. <u>SB682</u> Status and Testimony	RELATING TO FIRE PROTECTION. Clarifies the authority of the county fire chief to examine building plans and documentation to ensure that they are in compliance with the fire code and life safety standards. <u>SB212</u> <u>Status and Testimony</u>	RELATING TO THE STATE BUILDING CODE. Allows the counties six years to adopt their amendments to the state building code and permits the counties to apply their most recently adopted building code until the new amendments are adopted; the state building code may be used as a reference during this time frame.	<u>PSM</u> [Measure added on 2/7/2013]
<u>SB213</u> <u>Status and Testimony</u>	RELATING TO THE STATE BUILDING CODE COUNCIL. Reconfigures the membership of the state building code council by eliminating members from the department of health and department of labor and industrial relations, and adding members from the Building Industry Association, General Contractors' Association, Hawaii Construction Alliance, and Subcontractors' Association of Hawaii. Changes the requirements for a quorum from six to seven. Eliminates the council's obligation to consult with private sector representatives regarding construction practices and training. <u>SB683</u> <u>Status and Testimony</u>	RELATING TO PUBLIC IMPROVEMENTS. Creates the state building code special fund into which is deposited one quarter of one per cent of all state fund appropriations for capital improvement projects designated for the construction management cost element. Makes appropriation from the hurricane relief fund for deposit into the state building code special fund. Requires the department of public safety to make a list of persons whose license for firearms or other dangerous or deadly weapons has been revoked. Excepts any communication under the Act from applicable privileges.

SB571 Status and Testimony RELATING TO COUNTY SURCHARGE ON STATE TAX. Requires the Honolulu authority for rapid transit to collect the county surcharge on state tax established by the city and county of 2/11/2013] Honolulu pursuant to section 46-16.8, Hawaii Revised Statutes. Requires a county that establishes a county surcharge on state tax pursuant to section 46-16.8, Hawaii Revised Statutes, to reimburse the state for costs incurred or expended to assist that county to plan for a rapid transit system.
