Mandates that nonprofit organizations receive notice before denial of general excise tax benefit; limits liability of persons having control of certain amounts held in trust for nonprofit organizations; and defines "nonprofit organization". Status & Testimony	RELATING TO DELINQUENT TAXES. Establishes a reasonableness standard for when a tax is deemed uncollectible.	WAM

Amends the definition of the applicable exclusion amount and clarifies the application of estate and generation-skipping taxes for civil union couples and makes technical, housekeeping amendments for consistency.
