SB1123 RELATING TO FUNDING FOR PARKING FOR DISABLED WAM

Status and Testimony PERSONS.

Increases the state vehicle registration fee by \$1, to be deposited into the Disability and Communication Access Board Special Fund to cover the costs of administering the parking program for

persons with disabilities.

SB933 RELATING TO THE TRICARE PROGRAM. WAM

Status and Testimony Extends the general excise tax exclusion for amounts received by

a managed care support contractor of the TRICARE program for the actual cost or advancement to third party health care providers

pursuant to a contract with the United States.

<u>SB16 SD1</u> RELATING TO ENERGY RESOURCES. ENE/PSM, WAM

(SSCR341) Requires appropriate county permitting agency to receive and Status and Testimony process application for waivers for installation of solar water

heating systems. Requires county councils to establish procedures and standards by which their respective county permitting agencies approve, disapprove, or approve with

conditions. Clarifies existing application procedures. (SD1)

Requests the executive office on aging of the department of health to conduct an education and awareness campaign on long term

care and have the campaign independently evaluated.

RELATING TO HEALTH.

Requires the department of health's emergency medical services and injury prevention system branch to establish and maintain a statewide fall prevention and early detection program and

appropriates funds for the program. (SD1)

SB213 SD1 (SSCR427)

RELATING TO THE STATE BUILDING CODE COUNCIL.

Reconfigures the membership of the state building code council by eliminating members from the department of health and

department of labor and industrial relations, and adding members from the Building Industry Association; General Contractors Association; Hawaii Construction Alliance; Subcontractors' Association of Hawaii; department of business, economic development, and tourism; department of accounting and general services; Hawaii Building and Construction Trades Council; and American Council of Engineering Companies. Changes the requirements for a quorum from six to seven. Eliminates the council's obligation to consult with private sector representatives

regarding construction practices and training. Makes an

appropriation. (SD1)

RELATING TO LABOR.

Increases minimum wage to \$8.25 starting 07/01/13, \$8.75 starting

07/01/14, and \$9.25 starting 07/01/15 and ending 06/30/16. Authorizes the department of labor and industrial relations to adjust the minimum hourly wage thereafter in accordance with the

consumer price index. (SD1)

RELATING TO WAGES.

Requires employers to provide employees with specific wage and employer information in employees' pay records; requires

employers to maintain accurate and timely wage recordkeeping.

RELATING TO DENTAL HEALTH.

Requires the director of health to participate in the national oral health surveillance system. Permits dental hygienists to apply preventative sealants, in consultation with a licensed dentist, in a school-based dental sealant program or federally qualified health center. Requires the department of health to establish and administer a school-based dental sealant program in a high-need demonstration school and report to the legislature about the department's efforts to prioritize prevention of tooth decay. Appropriates funds to establish and administer a school-based dental sealant program in a high-need demonstration school, including plans to implement the program on a statewide level. Takes effect 1/1/2054; repeals 1/1/2057. (SD1)

report regarding the results of the pilot program. (SD1)

SB1349 SD1 (SSCR433) Status and Testimony	RELATING TO ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT. Re-enacts the tax credit for qualified research activities to apply to taxable years from 2010 to 2017. Adds, amends, and deletes definitions. Establishes new reporting requirements. Requires DBEDT to conduct studies to measure the effectiveness of the tax credit and submit reports to the legislature.
