Representative Takai moved that H.C.R. No. 241; and H.R. No. 203 be adopted, seconded by Representative Ito.

Representative Takai rose to speak in support of both measures, stating:

"Thank you, Mr. Speaker. I rise in support of these resolutions. Thank you. The 2011 Tohoku earthquake and tsunami left a devastating path and destroyed many lives. 15,881 people died, 6,142 people were injured and 2,668 people went missing across 20 prefectures. Though these numbers cannot possibly reveal the individual counts of loss and hurt, it is clear that many were affected by this disaster. Many are still being affected as the far reaching effects of the earthquake and tsunami are still being discovered today.

"Though we may be an ocean away we cannot ignore our ties to Japan whether by ancestry, relationships, cultural interests, we cannot ignore our moral responsibility to show support and encouragement during this rebuilding and healing process.

"These resolutions state that the people of Hawaii will continue to support the people of Japan and will be carried to them by Japan Consul General Toyoei Shigeeda. For these reasons and many others, Mr. Speaker, I support these measures and urge our colleagues to do the same. Thank you."

Representative Ito rose to speak in support of both measures, stating:

"Mr. Speaker, I also rise in support of HR 203 and HCR 241. Mr. Speaker, the 2011 Tohoku earthquake was a magnitude of 9.0 and was the most powerful known earthquake to hit Japan. Along with the lives lost and displaced, the earthquake resulting tsunami caused structural and economic damage. 129,225 buildings were completely collapsed, 254,204 buildings half-collapsed and 691,766 buildings were damaged.

"Mr. Speaker, in all, the disaster caused approximately \$235 billion in damage, making it the costliest natural disaster in world history. Rebuilding city structures and economy is an ongoing process. I would like to commend the people of Japan for their unwavering resilience in the face of adversity. For these reasons, Mr. Speaker, I support these measures and urge my colleagues to do so. Thank you."

Representative Takai rose, stating:

"Thank you, Mr. Speaker. Prior to the vote may I request a moment of silence for the people of Japan and the people that we lost."

At this time, the Members of the House of Representatives stood for a moment of silence in honor of the people of Japan and the victims of the Tohoku earthquake and tsunami.

The motion was put to vote by the Chair and carried, and H.C.R. No. 241; and H.R. No. 203 were adopted.
