Monday, April 22, 2013

The House of Representatives of the Twenty-Seventh Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2013, convened at 11:37 o'clock a.m., with Speaker Souki presiding.

The invocation was delivered by Pastor Ellie Kapihe of Windward Missionary Church, after which the Roll was called showing all Members present with the exception of Representatives Belatti and Carroll, who were excused.

Representative Saiki moved that the report of the Committee be adopted, and that S.C.R. No. 108 be adopted, seconded by Representative Awana.

Representative Ward rose to speak in opposition to the measure, stating:

"Mr. Speaker, I rise in opposition to this measure. Mr. Speaker, I spoke earlier about my work in the United Nations in Micronesia and the various areas, which because they have no economy the UN wanted to establish a private sector, 70% of all of the economy of Micronesia is either welfare payment, government work or transfer payment.

"This vehicle rightly states that we have been negligent. But what it incorrectly states, and I want to make very clear, Micronesians have the same rights as US citizens except for one, and that's to vote. The way that this wording is stated makes it look like making them aliens is a benefit. Now it may benefit the State of Hawaii because we may get more federal aid, but to demean these citizens who sacrificed immensely during the Second World War and the experiments for the defense of our country through the atomic experiments. I think we're damning with faint praise and that's not to use Shakespearean language lightly.

"Mr. Speaker, I think we need to look at this closely and know our words are other than for money because these are peoples who are real and not imaginary and they have all the rights of all of us who stand here except to vote and that's the only difference, Mr. Speaker. Thank you."

Representative Fale rose in opposition to the measure and asked that the remarks of Representative Ward be entered into the Journal as his own, and the Chair "so ordered." (By reference only.)

Representative Takai rose to speak in support of the measure, stating:

"Mr. Speaker, I rise in support of this. Thank you. In the previous discussion on the House Concurrent Resolution I didn't stand up because I wanted to give the Senate Concurrent Resolution a fair shot of coming over to the House and now we have it here before us. I want to assure the Representative from Hawaii Kai that we didn't work in isolation to get here today in support of this Senate Concurrent Resolution. In fact, we have worked very closely with the advocates for the COFA and from the Federated States of Micronesia and from the Republic of the Marshall Islands.

"They were the ones that encouraged us to be here today in support of this resolution, because as you may know, Congresswoman Hanabusa is advocating for something similar at the federal level. They want this status because with this status comes additional benefits. So regardless of how we may feel about the definition of 'alien,' these people want the status because they'll get recognized one step further and be provided with benefits. Thank you, Mr. Speaker."

Representative Ward rose to respond, stating:

"Mr. Speaker, a brief retort. I would challenge anybody in this Body to say there's anything higher than being a US citizen other than voting. Having the rights of all of us here except for voting. That's what a US citizen has and a Micronesian. Whether this is a federal, state kind of manipulation for funding, that I will grant. But in terms of who these people are, I would not surrender."

The motion was put to vote by the Chair and carried, and the report of the Committee was adopted and S.C.R. Representative Saiki moved that the report of the Committee be adopted, and that S.C.R. No. 164 be referred to the Committee on Finance, seconded by Representative Awana.

Representative Fale rose to speak in support of the measure with reservations, stating:

"Mr. Speaker, with reservations with a brief comment. Mr. Speaker, I'm concerned about this resolution in regards to where it originated from. It originated from an effort to ask for \$100 million to purchase the undeveloped lands around Turtle Bay, and I'm concerned in regards to the priorities within my community, Mr. Speaker.

"We have Kahuku High School, which is in the same area as the area here for Turtle Bay, Mr. Speaker. Whenever we get a good dose of rain, the kids in my community can't go to school, Mr. Speaker. As I've mentioned numerous times before, in my community we have areas that are pushing 80% of the families cannot pay for the meals of their own kids who go to school there because of the pervasive poverty issues which are found in my community, Mr. Speaker.

"My concern with this resolution is that it would misdirect the efforts of the limited resources that we have available to us at this time. So this could end in the use of a \$100 million towards the purchasing of undeveloped land around Turtle Bay and would not direct those resources towards fixing the host of issues that we have in regards to the school facilities that we have in the area, Mr. Speaker.

"To solve the flooding issue for the Kahuku High School and surrounding community would cost about \$14 million, Mr. Speaker, and I think that should take priority over this effort, and I'm concerned that this measure would not place the priorities and the spending in regards to my community, Mr. Speaker, and making sure that our kids get out of poverty and that is going to primarily come through fixing the education system.

"So my concern is just where this would end up in priority, Mr. Speaker, and it should be ending poverty and fixing education, Mr. Speaker, and not towards purchasing land to do nothing with it."

The motion was put to vote by the Chair and carried, and the report of the Committee was adopted and S.C.R.
