Thursday, April 25, 2013

The House of Representatives of the Twenty-Seventh Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2013, convened at 6:36 o'clock p.m., with Vice Speaker Mizuno presiding.

The invocation was delivered by Speaker Emeritus Calvin K.Y. Say, after which the Roll was called showing all Members present with the exception of Representatives Ito, McDermott, Thielen and Ward, who were excused.

On motion by Representative Awana, seconded by Representative Fukumoto and carried, reading of the Journal was dispensed with and the Journals of the Twenty-Fifth, Twenty-Sixth, Twenty-Seventh, Twenty-Eighth, Twenty-Ninth, Thirtieth, Thirty-First, Thirty-Second, Thirty-Third, Thirty-Fourth, Thirty-Fifth, Thirty-Sixth, Thirty-Seventh, Thirty-Eighth, Thirty-Ninth, Fortieth, Forty-First, Forty-Second, Forty-Third, Forty-Fourth and Forty-Fifth Days were approved. REPORTS OF STANDING COMMITTEES

Representative Rhoads, for the Committee on Judiciary, presented a report (Stand. Com. Rep. No. 1763) recommending that S.C.R. No. 135 be adopted.

Representative Saiki moved that the report of the Committee be adopted, and that S.C.R. No. 135 be adopted, seconded by Representative Awana.

Representative Ward rose to speak in support of the measure with reservations, stating:

"Mr. Speaker, I rise with slight reservations. Mr. Speaker, this bill comes up rather often in many places in the United States to give full voting rights to residents of Washington D.C. Having lived in Washington D.C., I can see they have a case but there are two reasons why I think that we should consider this, rather than blindly looking at it, looking at two factors.

"The first is, the US Constitution says you have to be a state to vote for President. For the people of Washington D.C. to become a state means a constitutional amendment which means a really, really high hurdle. That's number one.

"Number two, the amount of funding that the federal government gives to the states and to Washington D.C. will put in perspective how it would not be economical for them to become a state. Number one in terms of states that receive the most money is Alaska, \$13,000 per capita. We are number five, Hawaii at \$10,000 per capita. But Washington D.C. is actually \$69,000 per capita. That would be a huge loss if they were to become a state having to become responsible for all the roads and all the other maintenance.

"For those two reasons, Mr. Speaker, I don't think we should just go into this blindly but knowing that there's a lot at risk not just saying that, well they can vote. Thank you."

Representative Rhoads rose to speak in support of the measure, stating:

"Mr. Speaker, in support, just briefly. Residents of the District of Columbia do pay local tax which does go to pay for the roads. The difference is that unlike the rest of us they pay federal taxes but don't have as much representation. Thank you."

The motion was put to vote by the Chair and carried, and the report of the Committee was adopted and S.C.R.
