- 1. Adds \$25,000,000 in general funds for FY 14 to fund shortfalls in federal non-competitive grant amounts that are reduced in Federal Fiscal Year 2013 as the result of sequestration.
- 2. Adds a proviso to limit the use of the funds to address shortfalls in federal funding for non-competitive funds in Federal Fiscal Year 2013 by allowing B&F to transfer up to a total of \$25,000,000 to the affected department(s) and providing that the Legislature be notified of each transfer to the affected department(s) within ten days of the transfer.
