HB782 RELATING TO THE AWARD OF CONTRACTS UNDER CHAPTER 103F.

HUS/HLT, FIN

Repeals the existing protest procedures in chapter 103F, Hawaii Revised Statutes, and replaces them with a procedure governing the award of health and human services contracts that will not involve the exercise of adjudicatory authority by the executive branch agency in order to bring chapter 103F into compliance with recent decisions by the Hawaii Supreme Court.

HB783 RELATING TO THE DISCLOSURE OF PUBLIC HEALTH

HLT, JUD

STATISTICS RECORDS

TO LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICERS.

Authorizes the Department of Health to provide public health statistics records to law enforcement officers to facilitate criminal investigations.

HB784 RELATING TO FORENSIC IDENTIFICATION.

JUD

Clarifies the grading of the offense of refusal or failure to provide a required blood specimen, buccal swab sample, or print impression for forensic identification by making it a class C felonv.

<u>HB785</u> RELATING TO PRODUCTION OF RECORDS.

JUD

Amends provisions of Act 325, Session Laws of Hawaii 2012, which allow for the service of process issued by another state upon a Hawaii recipient and clarifies the following: (1) that the service of process may be upon a person or business, but not a government agency; (2) that the process is for the production of records; (3) that the process must be based upon a pending criminal investigation or prosecution; and (4) that the person or business being served must have conducted business or engaged in transactions occurring at least in part in the issuing state.

### <u>HB786</u> RELATING TO REGISTRATION OF COVERED OFFENDERS.

PBS, JUD

Adds comparable foreign convictions and tribal convictions to covered offenses; makes offenders who are subject to sex offender registration or notification in their jurisdiction of conviction, covered offenders under Hawaii law; makes it clear that a covered offender must register and report the offender's permanent residence, current temporary residence, or if an address is not available, a description of the place or area in which the covered offender resides; amends the definition of "conviction" in section 846E-1, Hawaii Revised Statutes, to clarify that conviction, for purposes of sex offender registration, occurs on the date judgment is entered; creates a tier classification for any covered sexual offenses that are not clearly included within the current tier classification law; addresses the problem of covered offenders who do not have registered residences to which the post office can deliver mail and cannot receive the ninety-day verification mailings by requiring these offenders to report in person once per month; and repeals the definitions of "mental abnormality, "personality disorder," and "predatory."

#### HB787 RELATING TO ATTORNEY'S FEES.

JUD, FIN

Clarify that section 28-6, Hawaii Revised Statutes, allows a court to award the Department of the Attorney General attorney's fees and litigation costs when it prevails in a lawsuit.

#### HB788 RELATING TO CHILD SUPPORT ENFORCEMENT.

HUS, JUD

Adds the definition of "new hire" to the requirements for new hire reporting.

#### HB789 RELATING TO HAWAII LABOR RELATIONS BOARD.

LAB

Allows the Governor to appoint an acting member of the Hawaii Labor Relations Board in the event a regular member is unable to act for a reason such as recusal.

#### HB790 RELATING TO CHARITABLE SOLICITATION.

CPC

Extends reporting requirements to commercial co-venturers, allows for penalties to be imposed on commercial co-venturers who fail to comply with the reporting requirements, and clarifies the exemption from registration for organizations who receive less than \$25,000 in contributions annually.

HB791 RELATING TO NONPROFIT CORPORATIONS. CPC, JUD

Adds a new section to clearly provide that directors of a nonprofit corporation shall have access to the books and records of the corporation to the extent reasonably related to their duties.

PROPOSING AN AMENDMENT TO ARTICLE VI. SECTION JUD. FIN **HB792** 

3, OF THE HAWAII STATE CONSTITUTION TO INCREASE THE MANDATORY RETIREMENT AGE FOR STATE

JUSTICES AND JUDGES.

Proposes a constitutional amendment to increase the mandatory retirement age for justices and judges from seventy to eighty years of age.

RELATING TO NOTARIES PUBLIC. HB793

JUD. FIN

Clarifies the information required to be on notary seals, authorizes the Attorney General to adjust the fees to become a notary and to renew a notary commission by rules adopted pursuant to chapter 91, Hawaii Revised Statutes, and authorizes other fees related to the regulation of notaries public to be established and adjusted by rules adopted pursuant to chapter 91, Hawaii Revised Statutes.

**HB794** PROPOSING AN AMENDMENT TO ARTICLE XVII. SECTION 3, OF THE CONSTITUTION OF THE STATE OF LMG, JUD, FIN

HAWAII.

Proposes a constitutional amendment to provide that only yes or no votes be counted in determining whether or not a majority of votes have approved ratifying or approving an amendment to the Constitution of the State of Hawaii that has been proposed by the Legislature.

**HB795** RELATING TO THE HOUSING LOAN AND MORTGAGE HSG, CPC

PROGRAM.

Updates the Hula Mae Single Family mortgage loan program to allow for broader program participation by potential homeowners, add downpayment assistance as a program feature, and make housekeeping and conforming amendments.

RELATING TO THE LAND USE COMMISSION. **HB796** 

WAL, JUD

Provides the Land Use Commission with more efficient and varied methods of dealing with situations where a petitioner has violated the conditions contained in a decision and order.

HB797 RELATING TO COASTAL ZONE MANAGEMENT.

WAL, OMH, JUD

Adds a new section to part II of chapter 205A, Hawaii Revised Statutes, to provide a process for state consistency review and certification for development by a state agency on state land within the special management area. After a notice of state consistency certification is published in the periodic bulletin by the Office of Environmental Quality Control, or upon issuance of federal consistency, a development by a state agency on state land shall be allowed within a special management area without obtaining a special management area permit or shoreline setback variance as otherwise required by chapter 205A.

Clarifies notice requirements for Hawaii Community

HB799 RELATING TO CREATIVE MEDIA DEVELOPMENT.

Amends section 235-17, Hawaii Revised Statutes, by deleting the Internet-only distribution exclusion for advertising messages; clarifying the definitions of qualified production costs to exclude state and county facility and location fees that are not subject to Hawaii general excise tax; raising the ceiling on total tax credit claim to \$12,000,000 per qualified production; and extending the sunset date for the tax credit to January 1, 2025.

HB800 MAKING AN EMERGENCY APPROPRIATION TO THE

DEPARTMENT OF BUSINESS, ECONOMIC

DEVELOPMENT, AND TOURISM FROM THE ENERGY

SECURITY SPECIAL FUND.

Makes an emergency appropriation of \$145,000 from the Energy Security Special Fund to staff and support the Hawaii Refinery

Task Force.

HB801 RELATING TO THE HAWAII EMPLOYER-UNION HEALTH LAB, FIN

BENEFITS TRUST FUND DEFINED CONTRIBUTION

PLAN.

Establishes a defined contribution plan for retiree health benefits that will be applied to employees hired on or after July 1, 2013.

**HB802** RELATING TO THE HAWAII EMPLOYER-UNION HEALTH LAB, FIN BENEFITS TRUST FUND OTHER POST-EMPLOYMENT BENEFITS TRUST FUND. Requires the State of Hawaii and its employees, but not the counties and their employees, to make monthly contributions to the Hawaii employer-union health benefits trust fund separate trust fund established to prefund other post-employment benefits if such a fund is established. HB803 RELATING TO PUBLIC FINANCE. FIN Amends section 39-6, Hawaii Revised Statutes, to allow premiums received from the sale of general obligation bonds to be used for eligible capital expenditures pursuant to section 39-2, Hawaii Revised Statutes. HB804 PROPOSING AN AMENDMENT TO ARTICLE VII. JUD. FIN SECTION 13, OF THE HAWAII STATE CONSTITUTION. Proposes a constitutional amendment to exempt refunding general obligation bonds from the requirement that all general obligation bonds for a term exceeding two years shall be in serial form maturing in substantially equal installments of principal, or maturing in substantially equal installments of both principal and interest. **HB805** RELATING TO FEDERAL TAX QUALIFICATION OF THE LAB, FIN EMPLOYEES' RETIREMENT SYSTEM. Amends chapter 88, Hawaii Revised Statutes, to comply with Internal Revenue Code requirements and pre-ERISA vesting rules to maintain the Employees' Retirement System's status as a tax-qualified plan. RELATING TO EMPLOYEES' RETIREMENT SYSTEM **HB806** LAB, FIN PERSONNEL. Allows the Board of Trustees of the Employees' Retirement System, through its Administrator, to appoint one or more investment officers and changes the title of the "Administrator" of the system to "Executive Director." RELATING TO RETIREMENT BENEFITS FOR JUDGES. LAB, FIN **HB807** Corrects anomalies of service retirement service eligibility and normal and early retirement allowances for judges who became members of the Employees' Retirement System prior to July 1, 2012, and first earned service credit as a judge after June 30,

2012.

**HB808** RELATING TO THE EMPLOYEES' RETIREMENT SYSTEM. LAB. FIN Amends chapter 88, Hawaii Revised Statutes, to preserve the taxqualified status of the Employees' Retirement System and to clarify the application of chapter 88 to civil unions. HB809 RELATING TO THE PUBLIC UTILITIES COMMISSION. CPC, FIN Consolidates the submission of reports made by the Public Utilities Commission on a fiscal year basis to the Legislature within the Commission's annual report required under section 269-5, Hawaii Revised Statutes. RELATING TO ELECTRIC SYSTEMS. HB810 EEP, CPC Authorizes the Public Utilities Commission to consider the value of implementing advanced grid modernization technology in the State. HB811 RELATING TO ENERGY INFORMATION REPORTING. EEP, EDB/CPC Amends the responsibilities and powers of the Public Utilities Commission in receiving energy industry data information registrations, and authorizes the Department of Business, Economic Development, and Tourism to receive such registrations; and eliminates the Commission's powers concerning the oversight and examination of energy distributors in relation to energy industry information reporting under chapter 486J, Hawaii Revised Statutes. RELATING TO THE PUBLIC UTILITIES COMMISSION. **CPC** HB812 Inserts new position titles within existing statutes describing the

Authorizes the Public Utilities Commission to examine all documents and other information and data deemed necessary for the review of power purchase agreements before the Commission, including financial records, projections, cost reports, and other material of third-party electricity producers seeking to sell power to a public utility under a power purchase agreement.

HB814 RELATING TO THE HAWAII EMPLOYER-UNION HEALTH LAB, FIN BENEFITS TRUST FUND MEDICARE PART B

ENROLLMENT REQUIREMENT.

Requires Medicare Part B enrollment as a requirement for eligibility for medical and prescription drug plans only. Eligibility for and enrollment in Employer-Union Health Benefits Trust Fund dental, vision, and life plans not affected by nonenrollment in Medicare Part B.

HB815 RELATING TO ELECTRIC COOPERATIVES.

EEP, CPC

Directs the Public Utilities Commission and the Division of Consumer Advocacy to specifically consider the ownership structure and interests of an electric cooperative; and authorizes the Public Utilities Commission to waive or exempt an electric cooperative operating in the State from compliance with the provisions of chapter 269, Hawaii Revised Statutes, as well as any other applicable charters, franchises, rules, decisions, orders, or any other laws.

HB836 CPC, FIN Requires escrow depositories to report any change of their corporate designated escrow officer or branch manager to the Commissioner of Financial Institutions; establishes a statutory fee for the transfer or change in control of an escrow depository license; increases the fidelity bond maintained by escrow depositories to a minimum of \$100,000; increases the errors and omissions policy amount escrow depositories are required to carry to not less than \$250,000; increases fees; provides powers for the commissioner to supervise and regulate the industry; and empowers the commissioner to issue cease and desist orders; increases net capital requirement to \$100,000.

CPC, FIN Replaces individual fees for Hawaii banks, and nondepositories for specific regulatory items with one assessment. Increases, and clarifies bank powers.
