HB991 RELATING TO MENTAL HEALTH TREATMENT. HLT, JUD

Establishes an assisted community treatment program in lieu of the involuntary outpatient treatment program. Replaces the term "involuntary outpatient treatment" with "assisted community treatment". Makes several amendments regarding involuntary

outpatient treatment procedures.

HB992 RELATING TO MENTAL HEALTH. HLT, FIN

Appropriates funds for the adult mental health division's Hawaii

certified peer specialist program.

HB993 RELATING TO TATTOO ARTISTS. HLT, CPC

Restricts the sale of tattoo supplies. Requires a blood borne pathogen test as a prerequisite for tattoo licensure and as a requirement to continue to be licensed as a tattoo artist, beginning January 1, 2014. Specifies that persons who violate the restrictions on sales of tattoo supplies may be subject to

penalties. Creates a tattoo artist task force.

Allocates an unspecified portion of the environmental response,

energy, and food security tax to be deposited into the special fund. Requires the agribusiness development corporation to

report annually to the legislature.

> Requires operators to procure a market operator's license to ensure that greater than 50% of vendors in farmers' markets sell food, farm produce, or flowers prepared, grown, or produced in Hawaii.

Requires the director of health to set the deposit beverage container fee at one cent per container until DOH addresses all of the recommendations of the auditor pursuant to the State of Hawaii Deposit Beverage Container Deposit Special Fund Financial and Program Audit of 2010.

HB1022 RELATING TO CARE HOMES. HUS, JUD/CPC

HB1023 RELATING TO TECHNOLOGY. EDN/HED, JUD

> Prohibits educational institutions and employers from requesting a student, prospective student employee, or prospective employee to grant access to, allow observation of, or disclose information that allows access to or observation of personal

internet accounts. Provides penalties.

Establishes the amount of the credit as the difference between the amount charged by state irrigation systems and the amount the state irrigation systems should charge in order to sustain operations. Deducts the cost of the tax credit from the irrigation system revolving fund. Applies to taxable years beginning after 12/31/2013.	AGR/WAL, FIN
<u>HB1030</u>	RELATING TO EDUCATION. Increases the age requirement for compulsory attendance at public or private schools from 16 years to 17 years.	EDN, FIN

<u>HB1031</u> RELATING TO FEDERAL SPENDING.

FIN

Establishes the Hawaii federal spending abatement task force to study changes in federal appropriations and their economic impacts in the State following the death of Senator Daniel K. Inouye.

HB1032 RELATING TO SOLAR WATER HEATER SYSTEMS.

EEP, FIN

Provides a 50% higher renewable energy technologies income tax credit to those who install solar water heater systems prior to the sale of existing single-family residential dwellings. Mandates the installation of solar water heater systems prior to certain renovations and additions.

HB1033 RELATING TO THE OPERATION OF MOTOR VEHICLES.

TRN, JUD

Requires the department of transportation to create rules that will establish the creation and maintenance of smartphone software that will help prevent intoxicated persons from operating motor vehicles, and to facilitate the ability of observers to report erratic operators of motor vehicles.

HB1034 RELATING TO DRIVER'S LICENSES.

TRN, JUD

Amends the initial age of the implementation of accelerated license expiration dates for elderly drivers from seventy-two to eighty. Requires a driver's license to expire when the licensee reaches the age of eighty, but allows for renewals. Clarifies the language on expiration dates.

HB1035 RELATING TO MEDICAID.

HUS, FIN

Prohibits nonprofit or for-profit medicaid health insurance contractors and the MedQuest division of DHS, from modifying reimbursement policies and guidelines without providing written notice of the change. Prohibits retroactive application of changes if approval for the reimbursement was obtained from medicaid or a medicaid health insurance contractor prior to the effective date of the change in the notice.

<u>HB1036</u> PROPOSING AN AMENDMENT TO ARTICLE III, SECTION JUD, FIN

4, OF THE CONSTITUTION OF THE STATE OF HAWAII TO ESTABLISH LEGISLATIVE TERM LIMITS.

Proposes a constitutional amendment to limit members of the legislature to serving in the house of representatives for not more than ten cumulative years and to serving in the senate for not more than twelve cumulative years, with years counting toward the applicable limit beginning on the day of the general election of 2012

JUD Amends the misdemeanor offense of promoting intoxicating liquor to a person under age 21 to apply to persons who recklessly, rather than knowingly, commit the offense. Applies the offense to liquor licensees who provide liquor to any minor or allow a minor to consume liquor. RELATING TO LEASEHOLD CONVERSION. HB1061 WAL, CPC/JUD, Provides for the mandatory lease-to-fee conversion of leasehold FIN business property. RELATING TO INTEGRATED SOLID WASTE HB1062 EEP/HLT, CPC MANAGEMENT. Increases the size of a deposit glass beverage container from sixty-eight to one hundred twenty-eight fluid ounces. Adds building materials as a purpose under the glass recovery program. Adds wine, spirits, and milk and other dairy-derived products to the definition of "deposit beverage". Increases the size of a deposit beverage container from sixty-eight to one hundred twenty-eight fluid ounces. Takes effect 1/1/2014. RELATING TO ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT. HB1063 JUD, FIN Establishes the Hawaii Gaming Control Commission and the framework of casino gaming in Waikiki and Kapolei. RELATING TO CEDED LANDS. HB1064 WAL/OMH Requires the Department of Land and Natural Resources to conduct an audit of all state-held lands and an inventory of ceded lands, and report to the Legislature prior to the convening of the 2014 session. HB1065 RELATING TO GAMBLING. JUD, FIN Establishes a gambling task force to perform a comprehensive social and financial analysis of the different types of gambling and their impact on the State in order for legislators to make

informed policy decisions. Dissolves on June 30, 2014.

<u>HB1066</u> RELATING TO PROSTITUTION.

JUD

Makes solicitation of a minor for prostitution a crime. Increases the statute of limitations to bring a cause of action for coercion into prostitution from two to six years. Clarifies the minimum and maximum fine for a person convicted of committing the offense of prostitution. Adds the offenses of solicitation of a minor for prostitution, habitual solicitation of prostitution, and solicitation of prostitution near schools and public parks under the State's forfeiture laws. Amends the definition of "sexual offense" under the sexual offender registry laws to include acts that consist of the solicitation of a minor who is less than eighteen years of age for prostitution.

<u>HB1067</u> RELATING TO MINORS.

HUS/HLT, FIN

Amends definition of child abuse or neglect. Amends existing requirements for reporting, prosecution, and coercion of child prostitution. Establishes a victim services pilot program. Effective July 1, 2013.

HB1068 RELATING TO HUMAN TRAFFICKING.

JUD/CPC

Requires certain establishments to post in a conspicuous place a poster that provides specified information relating to human trafficking and the National Human Trafficking Resource Center hotline. Defines "establishment." Establishes penalties for violations of the poster requirement.

HB1069 RELATING TO THE UNIVERSITY OF HAWAII.

HED, FIN

Repeals the authority of the University of Hawaii to issue

revenue bonds.

HB1070 RELATING TO THE UNIVERSITY OF HAWAII.

HED, FIN

Requires the board of regents of the University of Hawaii to undergo annual training on board policies and procedures, chapter 92, Hawaii's sunshine law, and chapter 92F, Hawaii's open records law. Requires the board of regents to receive certification that the regent successfully completed the training. Provides that the certification may include passing a test on the training's subject matter. Requires members of the board of regents to be removed from office if they do not meet the annual training requirements more than once during their term.

<u>HB1071</u> RELATING TO THE REGENTS CANDIDATE ADVISORY HED

COUNCIL.

Amends section 304A-104.5, HRS, to give the governor the authority to reject the list of nominees to the board of regents of the University of Hawaii presented by the regents candidate advisory council and require the regents candidate advisory council to provide another list of nominees within sixty days.

<u>HB1072</u> RELATING TO THE BOARD OF REGENTS OF THE HED, JUD

UNIVERSITY OF HAWAII.

Requires members of the board of regents of the University of Hawaii to file an annual disclosure of financial interests with the state ethics commission. Makes the disclosures public record and available for inspection and duplication.

HB1073 RELATING TO THE UNIVERSITY OF HAWAII. HED, JUD

Amends section 304A-1005, HRS, to: (1) Limit the board of regents to appointing only one university general counsel; (2) Require the board of regents to have direct oversight over the university counsel and prohibit the board of regents from delegating this responsibility to the president of the university; (3) Require the university general counsel to report directly to the board of regents; and (4) Allow the board of regents to contract with independent attorneys solely in cases where the university general counsel and attorney general each acknowledge a lack of sufficient expertise. Requires contracted attorneys to consult with and work in conjunction with the attorney general.

HB1074 RELATING TO TAXATION. WAL, FIN

Establishes an income tax credit for the rehabilitation or

preservation of historic structures in the State.

HB1075 RELATING TO INCENTIVE PROGRAMS. LAB, FIN

Creates an incentive program to encourage innovation and savings by the executive departments. Establishes an incentive program to provide cash rewards to state employees whose suggestions or inventions result in cost-savings. Authorizes the department to retain cost-savings less the cash award amount. Requires the auditor to report on efficacy and quality of the department's service to the public. Appropriates funds.

HB1076 RELATING TO HIGHWAY SAFETY. TRN, JUD

Prohibits pedestrians from selling or soliciting the sale of services or goods to any occupant of a vehicle on a highway or from accepting or soliciting donations of money or goods from any occupant of a vehicle on a highway.

Makes part II of chapter 501, HRS, relating to land recordings and deregistration of fee simple timeshare interests, permanent by repealing the applicable sunset provision in section 21 of Act 120, Session Laws of Hawaii 2009.

HB1194 RELATING TO SUBCONTRACTORS. CPC, FIN

Repeals the temporary suspension under Act 105, SLH 2011, on the general excise tax exemption on amounts deducted from the

gross income of subcontractors.
