

## TWENTY-NINTH DAY

Tuesday, March 12, 2013

The Senate of the Twenty-Seventh Legislature of the State of Hawai'i, Regular Session of 2013, convened at 11:34 a.m. with the President in the Chair.

The Roll was called showing all Senators present with the exception of Senators Ihara and Keith-Agaran who were excused.

The President announced that she had read and approved the Journal of the Twenty-Eighth Day.

At this time, Senator Baker introduced her legislative shadow Lavinia Pasikala, a senior at Lahainaluna High School.

Senator Galuteria, on behalf of Senate President Kim and himself, introduced Jeff Coelho, whose career in radio broadcasting spanned over 40 years and who helped to launch the high school talent competition "Brown Bags to Stardom."
