Tuesday, March 19, 2013

The Senate of the Twenty-Seventh Legislature of the State of Hawai'i, Regular Session of 2013, convened at 11:42 a.m. with the President in the Chair.

The Roll was called showing all Senators present with the exception of Senator Shimabukuro who was excused.

The President announced that she had read and approved the Journal of the Thirty-Third Day.

At this time, Senator English introduced Michael Kikukawa, a Moloka'i High School graduate who would matriculate at Harvard University, and Kimberly Svetin, president of Moloka'i Drugs, Inc.

At 12:05 p.m., the Senate stood in recess subject to the call of the Chair.

The Senate reconvened at 1:00 p.m.

Senator Gabbard, Chair of the Committee on Energy and Environment, requested a waiver of the notice requirement pursuant to Senate Rule 21 to hold a public hearing on H.B. No. 106, H.D. 2.

Senator Gabbard noted:

"The measure allows the counties to establish a permitting process for geothermal development in ag, rural, and urban districts. I'm requesting this waiver because all three committees reached agreement to hear this bill after the 72-hour notice requirement."

The Chair granted the waiver.

Senator Gabbard announced that the Committee on Energy and Environment, Committee on Water and Land, and Committee on Public Safety, Intergovernmental and Military Affairs would hold a public hearing on H.B. No. 106, H.D. 2 on Thursday, March 21, 2013, at 1:15 p.m. in Conference Room 225.

Senator Ige rose to announce that the Committee on Ways and Means would be reconvening its public hearing on the State Budget at 1:30 p.m. that afternoon in Conference Room 211.

Senator Nishihara, Chair of the Committee on Agriculture, requested a waiver of the notice requirement pursuant to Senate Rule 21 to hold a public hearing on H.B. No. 174, H.D. 2.

Senator Nishihara noted:

"First, I'd like to make it clear that this is a food labeling and not an anti-GMO bill, nor is it a pro-bioengineering bill. We initially took the position of not hearing the bill based on the attorney general's opinion. The bill is likely to be found unconstitutional for many reasons; however, the attorney general will be able to explain his opinion when it's time.

"Anyway, because we heard the public's passionate response and requests to hear the bill through phone calls, emails, etc., we believe that it's perhaps prudent that we do hear the bill."

The Chair granted the waiver.

Senator Nishihara announced that the Committee on Agriculture, Committee on Commerce and Consumer Protection, and the Committee on Health would hold a public hearing on H.B. No. 174, H.D. 2 on Thursday, March 21, 2013, at 9:00 a.m. in Conference Room 229.

Senator Tokuda rose to announce that Education Week would be continuing the following day with events in the rotunda including health screenings and band and cheer performances from the University of Hawai'i.

Senator Baker rose to remind the members that the Women's Legislative Caucus would be collecting Easter basket donations for women at the Institute for Human Services.

Senator Hee rose to speak on a point of personal privilege as follows:

"This is probably not the point you folks think I'm going to make because I'll make that point at a different time. But I did want to thank the chairmen – the appropriate chairs – on hearing the bill regarding labeling.

"The point I want to make is this: it's easy to use the attorney general when it's convenient. I've always said the attorney general's opinion is like an armpit: everybody has two. And when it smells right, you use the attorney general; and when it doesn't smell right, you beat the attorney general over the head. Quite frankly, this is an issue of the right to know, plain and simple. The right to know: that's the issue. And the right to know is a health issue. So, while it took such a long time – it's almost like an epiphany that the bill's going to be heard – there are a lot of solutions at hand. And so, well, quite frankly, I guess those who made the decision should be commended on hearing the bill on the right to know. Thank you."

Senator Slom rose to speak on a point of personal privilege as follows:

"As was announced a little while ago, Ways and Means will continue after this session. And this morning, we heard from a steady parade of the governor's men and women, who all came before Ways and Means to beg for more money and to tell us that their department, their agency, was the most important and the number one priority. And it was interesting to me, Madam President, that all of them thanked the Ways and Means Committee for the money that they have received over the years and that they hope to receive this time. Not one person thanked the taxpayers, which is the source of all the money and oftentimes we seem to forget in this building, and I think it's something that we should never forget – that it's the taxpayers that pay for everything and all of us.

"And along those lines, in Judiciary this morning I voted against the bill for expanded and extended public financing. I have stood in support of almost every campaign spending reform bill and transparency bill, but I've always opposed public financing. Why should we ask the taxpayers to pay for politicians? That is the question and I think we should all examine that.

"And that goes along with the action that occurred yesterday; all these things are tied together. Yesterday, the State Commission on Salaries announced its recommendations for yet another round of salary increases for those of us in public office in the Legislature, the executive branch, and the Judiciary. And some of my colleagues may recall that I had campaigned against that constitutional amendment back in 2006 that allowed for the establishment of the Commission on Salaries, saying that all you're going to do is guarantee that salaries and compensation for public officials will continue to increase, particularly in times when people are struggling in this economy.

"I think that it was Senator Bob Hogue and myself who were the last senators to vote – to be able to vote – on a salary increase, and we both voted 'no' at that time. And now we have a process that does not even have a public hearing. So, while we may have labeling hearings, we don't have a hearing about the expenses that the taxpayers are forced to pay. We don't even have an opportunity to vote 'no,' unless we have a concurrent resolution before the end of the session to vote 'no' on everybody's salary increase, and that's not likely to happen.

"So, I think that in all of this mad rush to try to prioritize our expenditures, we should not forget that it's the taxpayers of our city, our state, that are footing the bill for everything and that they are struggling right now. Thank you, Madam President."
